Field Company A.E.	236	Lance Corporal Andrew REILLY. ✓	<p>He took part in the landing on GALLIPOLI and rendered invaluable services on the underground firing line between WIRE GULLY and BROWNS DIP. He was one of a demolition party and went forward with the first line of attack on LONE PINE and did good effective engineering work. After the capture of the PINE on the L P tunnel 3 he assisted in erecting barricade in tunnel where charge had been fired and in which the Turks were firing from the opposite end, also in opening out tunnel six feet behind barricade to enable Turkish sniper position to be undermined. He did not leave the PENINSULA till the last few days of the evacuation. At GEBEL HABIETA, EGYPT, and FLEURBAIX, FRANCE he continued to do excellent work and took part in a very successful raid on the German trenches. At POZIERES on both occasions he performed his duty in a highly praiseworthy manner.
