After the loss of their Battery Commander and 2 other officers of the battery who were killed in action on the 10th August these 2 young officers, took charge of the 64th Battery (Lieut WHITE in command) and between them they did fine work for 8. days until they were both wounded. They were always in or beyond POZIERES and made most strenuous efforts to keep a line intact from O.P. to battery position. They tried to a great extent under heavy fire and by their fine example kept the battery in good fettle when it might have been somewhat disorganised by the great loss of its Commander and of the 2 next senior officers .	<i>E.
