Hear MERRIE on 7th July, 1918, Lieut. ARCHER when on a daylight representation with 6th Bn. one other rank located an enemy post. He return A. I.F. ed to our line and then led a party of 6 against the post which put up a strong resistance with bombs and M.C. fire. He led his party forward and succeeded in killing 9 of the enemy and taking two p risoners and a machine gun which were brought in under heavy machine our fire from other enemy posts.

2/Lieutenant Ernest Pither HITCHCOCK, D.C.H.

In an operation against the enemy position on the night 9th/10th July, 1918, 2/Lieut. HITCH OK led his platoon with great dash and A.I.F. skill. His platoon was the centre of the attack and met with the most opposition, on one occasion when a frontal assault on a heavily garrisomed enemy strong post was temporarily held up he split his men into two parties and attacking from both flanks and rear evoceeded in gaining his objective. He was twice wounded early in the attack but carried on until met by his Company Commander, who ordered him back to the Dressing Station. Shapuel wound slight, face dongue of lea
