He return- ed to our line and then led a party of 6 against the post which put up a strong resistance with bombs and H.G. fire. He led his party forward and succeeded in killing 9 of the enemy and taking two prisoners and a machine gun which were brought in under heavy machine gun fire from other enemy posts. 	6th Battalion Australian Imperial Force.		2/Lieutenant Ernest Pither HITCHCOCK, D.C.M.	In an operation against the enemy position on the night 9th/10th July, 1918, 2/Lieut. HITCHCOCK led his platoon with great dash and skill. His platoon was the centre of the attack and met with the most opposition. On one occasion when a frontal assault on a heavily garrisoned enemy strong post was temporarily held up he split his men into two parties and attacking from both flanks and rear succeeded in gaining his objective.
