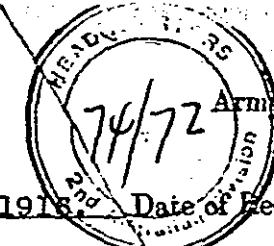

For devotion to duty and conspicuous coolness under heavy Artillery fire on the nights 2nd/3rd and 3rd/4th, July 1916 during the progress of enterprises on the enemy trenches. The regimental aid post received a direct hit but remained in activity where originally allotted in spite of the Artillery bombardment. FRANCIS EDWARD BRADSHAW	These soldiers volunteered to form a rescue party on the morning of the 3rd July, 1916 and brought in in full daylight (4 a.m.) from NO MAN'S LAND 2 wounded men of the 14th Battalion who had fallen near the German lines.
