Almost intediately after FERO heavy artillery and N.C. fire was encountered and the only other Officer in the Company was wounded. He led his nen with great coolness through the least shelled areas and when he arrived at the eastern edge of the Wood in T.21 Central he went forward and found that the line was at a standatial. He then discovered an abandoned enemy 77 Field gun. With the help of two men of the Ufra Hattalion (names unknown) he turned the gun round and fired 50 rounds into 3T OFMIS Wood with great effect.

possible, and realizing that the left flank of the Brigadew was in denger on account of Nount ST QUENTIN being held by the enemy he swing his Company round, and on his own initiative took up a defensive position on the north-west edge of the Wood, thus protecting the left flank of the drigade.

Being the only Officer in the Company he had to take grave personal risks and it was to a great extent due to his courageous conduct and absolute disregard of personal safety that his Company got into position.

I strongly recommend him for a Military Cross.
