For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during the attack on Hindenburg Line N. of BELLICOURT on 30th Sept. 1918. As a stretcher bearer this man, heedless of personal danger, advanced into No Man's Land on several occasions and successfully rescued wounded men under exceptional heavy M.G. and shell fire. It was owing to his efforts in this direction that many men's lives were saved. He displayed the greatest courage throughout the operation, and his cheerfulness and coolness helped to alleviate the sufferings of the wounded. His work is worthy of the highest praise.
