Lieutenant William Oldfred JACKSON.	<p>On the night of 14th October, 1917, at ZONNEBEKE North East of YPRES, during a heavy bombardment of his battery with gas shell, and when the fire effect of his unit was urgently required, this officer, by his personal example, and though continually exposed to heavy shellfire, in attending to casualties and promptly warning his men of the presence of gas, maintained his battery in action during a most critical period.</p> <p>On 12/10/17, at the same place, when ammunition was urgently required at the guns, he advanced with his teams through a very heavy barrage and, although several men and horses were wounded by shellfire, he continued to advance and delivered the ammunition in time to continue a barrage urgently needed for the protection of our infantry.</p> <p>This officer, by his courageous bearing and thorough reliability at all times has been of great assistance to his commanding officer. He was the only officer of this Brigade who served continuously through the recent operations in FLANDERS, from 2 19th July until this Brigade was relieved from the line on 18th November last.</p>	Brigadier-General, Commanding 2nd Aust.
