IN VICINITY OF SAILLY-LAURETTE.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the night of the 7th/8th. July, 1918, during the time when the enemy barrage was at its densest Private KEAR left his Company Headquerters, which was being subjected to exceptionally heavy shelling, and carried a message across the Rayins to the Officer in charge of the forward Company - a distance of 500 yards.

Shortly after starting he was knocked down by a shell burst but pluckily continued on.

After delivering the message he returned through the barrage to his Company Head-quarters and reported for further orders.

The same of ming he had already carried rations through shell fire from Battalion Head-quarters to the front line.
