His duty was that of stretcher bearer, and he displayed great self sacrifice and disregard of personal safety in his work, returning repeatedly to NO MAN'S LAND under very heavy shell and rifle fire to rescue a number of wounded comrades. 	- do -	2089	Private Alexander RENTOUL.	During the attack on the MAZE and the GIRD on 5th November, 1916, he did continuously carry bombs and stores across heavy and open land to the new captured trench utterly disregarding of heavy shell fire and rifle fire. On his last trip back he brought in a wounded man and although steady rifle fire was turned upon him he doggedly continued his way and reached the trench in safety.	C. O. 26th BN.	M. M.	
	- do -	4516	Private George Lane SMITH.	During the fight for the GIRD Trench and the MAZE he did good and excellent service as a runner during 5th and 6th November, 1916, always under shell fire, very often heavy.
