	- do -	2736	Private Richard Stanley <u>PALMER</u>	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty as stretcher bearer in action near BULLECOURT on 3rd. May 1917. His squad accompanied the attack on the Tramway losing 3 men casualties. As soon as circumstances permitted he organised a fresh squad and continued to bring in the wounded till the Battalion was relieved.	G.O.C. 6th. Aust. Infantry Brigade	M.M.	
	- do -	3823	Private William George <u>GARDINER</u>	For conspicuous gallantry as runner during the capture of the trenches near BULLECOURT and for most valuable reports obtained at great personal risk as to the situation at the Tramway.
