On the 11th April 1917 near REINCOURT after the withdrawal from the HINDENBURG LINE these men under the command of Lieut JULIN of 52nd Battn. volunteered in spite of continuous machine gun and artillery fire, to go out into NO MAN'S LAND and collect wounded. At first they got a hostile reception but ultimately by their persestincy and determination, they were permitted to carry on unmolested till dark. In this manner they saved the lives of many who would otherwise have perished in the snow. Two of the number were killed but undetermined the remainder stuck to their task until darkness put a stop to their work.
