	6th Battn.	3873	Sergeant CYRIL JUSTIN-ALLWISUS McCARTHY Aloysius	<i>Command of one of the parties</i> McCARTHY was the Sgt. in the left trench party and was exceptionally fine in rallying that party before entering and in his work in the trench. He killed one German and was very cool-headed throughout in ejecting prisoners. It was mainly through him that the heavy enemy M.G. was with difficulty got out of their trench. <i>146</i> By his leaders' coolness he inspired the remainder of his party.			X
