SOON SGT MAJOR	Leslie John HAMMOND	A raid which was made on Enemy Bedouin Harvesters and a Turkish covering party on the West Bank of the Wadi Imlich on the evening of 18th June 1917. S.M. Hammond during this raid displayed exceptional courage and quick resource he dismounted under a fairly brisk enemy fire at close range to go to the assistance of a trooper whose horse had fallen leaving him dazed through the fall Hammond mounted the trooper on his own horse within 200 to 300 yards of the enemy and conveyed him to safety at great personal risk to himself the enemy's fire being fairly considerable	O.C. 10th ALH REGT	M.M.	
	150	9th ALH REGT	SERGT	Royal John George MYREN	on 24th June while in charge of a patrol reconnoitering towards the Wadi Imlich showed great dash and gallantry in obtaining necessary information reference the enemy's dispositions a body of about 400 Infantry having advanced from their main positions were working up from the Wadi Imlich towards the Patrol but at point 300 with the apparent intention of delivering a surprise attack also on 4th July while in charge of advanced Patrol covering a special Officers Reconnaissance of the country SW of Beirahaba again showed great skill and energy in clearing the sector of numerous enemy patrols enabling the reconnaissance party to gain important information	O.C. 9th ALH REGT	M.M.
