	23567	RQH	Pte	Albert Edward EAGLES	on the night of Nov 30th/1st Dec near EL BURS Pte EAGLES commanded one of the Hotchkiss rifle teams and displayed great coolness and determination. The Hotchkiss team was under the close fire of several enemy automatic rifles and the enemy endeavored on more than one occasion to rush the position and succeeded in reaching to within 15 yards of the gun killing one of the team. This Hotchkiss gun was on an exposed flank the danger of which would have exposed the whole line to enfilade fire. The position was maintained throughout the night. The opposing enemy automatic rifles were captured in the early hours of the morning and the number of enemy killed and wounded in front of the Hotchkiss gun commanded by Pte Eagles amply testified to his skillful use of it. 10 th ALH	134	Sergeant	Fredrick SALMOND	This NCO was acting as a leader in an important reconnaissance for the 60 th Div. towards BIREH in 10 th Dec 1914. His troop was on the R. Bank and when the HIZMEH were attacked heavily by a strong Turkish force. Realising that it was essential to hold ground Sergeant SALMOND ordered his men to take up a position between the enemy & the main JERUSALEM BIREH Road and although subjected to heavy artillery machine gun & rifle fire held his ground until the balance of his squadron had retreated from a Northward reconnaissance a period of five hours. This NCO showed conspicuous gallantry and resource and although badly wounded succeeded in withdrawing his troop without further casualties. I consider that the work and conduct of this NCO is highly praiseworthy and the work of the squadron on this day was highly appreciated by Maj Gen SHEA 60 th Div to whom the Regt at the time was attached.
