KENDRICK showed great daring and initiative during & immediately after the charge of the Warwick & Worcester YEO at HUS on Nov 9 th 1914 taking his sub-section on his own having received no orders right up to within very short range of the enemy who were considerably broken by the charge but were showing signs of rallying. This he successfully prevented and succeeded in turning three of the enemy's machine guns in addition to his own against the enemy following them up till they were out of range. During the first half hour (F. Kendrick had no troops of any sort to support him) and I consider that if he had not used great resource and taken this risk much of the success of the charge might have been wanted. Lieut	Theodore Royce PEPPERCORN	OFFICER BURS showed great bravery and determination during the heavy attacks on BUR in Dec 1914 in the face of very superior force and by his fine deeds set an example to his comrades and with his own being continually bombed and defence reinforcements came up several of his men were overpowered and his horse was killed.
