On the night of the 22/23rd May 1918 in a raid on the enemy trenches NW. of UMM. ES. SHERT FORD. he led the attack on the left hand post OC with the greatest dash and resolution. Though only leading 9TH a troop he did not hesitate to attack a post estimated to contain 50 Turks under heavy machine gun and rifle fire at point blank range. He was wounded slightly in the forehead during the action. Strength of raiding party 2 British Officers 3 Indian Officers 14 Indian other ranks

On 1st May 1918 near VISRED DAMIEN. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. His section was detached from his battery and under OC his independent command. During the action he controlled and directed its fire in the most efficient manner and accomplished 3 successive movements to a flank under ^{chill} rifle fire all the way and under close range rifle fire most of the way. Finally when all his horses were being shot down by machine gun fire he displayed the utmost personal gallantry and coolness in estimating personnel and losses and only abandoned his guns under direct orders. 19TH DOB RHA
