This N.C.O. took up a position in rear of the Railway Station and caused severe casualties on the enemy in preventing them after repeated attempts to enter a dense thicket. He moved about with great dash and judgment under heavy fire and the courage of this N.C.O. was exemplary and had a great effect upon the men of those troops who had lost their Officers. His Sergeant who accompanied him was shot dead within 20 yards of the gun and he completed the task by himself.
