William GORDON <u>TEAGUE.</u>	For great gallantry and devotion to duty during the operations to the East of YPRES, on October 19th. 1917. He was in charge of a bearer squad which was evacuating wounded from an R.A.P. in the neighbourhood of ZONNEBEKE, over a very heavily shelled track, he worked continuously for nearly 72 hours utterly disregarding all personal danger in the interests of the wounded. On the date above mentioned a call came for volunteers to bring in the wounded. L/Cpl. Teague at once rushed out of the post and under very shell fire dressed a number of wounded and then brought them in to shelter. His promptness and pluck undoubtedly saved the lives of some of the wounded.  The gallantry and work of this N.C.O. from 12th. to 21st. October 1917 is worthy of high commendation.	(Sgd.) J.B.
