While the Brigade was holding the Serapunt Section of the Dreyfuss defences he was appointed Brigade Major and showed great zeal and energy in carrying out his duties and during the reorganisation of the unit at St. Etienne and afterwards at Juncy Post, both in operations and training he did excellent work. During the operations at Pétillon on July 19/20 1916. Lt Col (then Major) Davis was sent from Bde HQ to reorganise the troops in the firing line at a critical time and displayed great gallantry and initiative under heavy fire. Since the arrival on Oct 22 of the Brigade at the Somme front, this officer has shown great devotion to duty, both as Bde Major and as Commander. For the action round one of his own tanks was destroyed by enemy shells and Capt Mulvey died. He remained on duty, carried out his part of the programme with greatest courage. On Sept 18/19 1916 Capt Mulvey was considerably wounded under heavy fire, taking part in operations and directing fire of his guns in the enemy trenches with excellent effect.
