When the enemy suddenly attacked his right flank another gun was needed owing to a Lewis Gun and its crew team having previously been put out of action by a 5.9 shell. He sprang into action by a 5.9 shell. He sprang into action by a 5.9 shell. Two spare guns were available and Lt Davies volunteered to man one. He single handed and proceeded to the right flank a distance of 100yds under heavy rifle fire. From an exposed position he kept up a steady fire until other guns were brought over to his assistance the battle being won. The enemy was beaten and a counter attack organised at 11.30 hrs. by our Battalion. Sgt Davies' brave action single handed absolutely prevented our right flank from being enveloped in rear and saved us many casualties.

His unceasing attention to the welfare of the men has produced excellent result. On every occasion the man has come out of fire line at all hours of the night his arrangements for hospital supply has been specially good. His cheerfulness and devotion to duty at all times and under most trying circumstances have been an inspiration to the cooks and other men under his control. He has at all times displayed the greatest ingenuity in the preparation of food. I consider his work deserving special recognition.

At 4 am. he worked along the parapet covering the advance of a bombing party which drove the enemy back and captured 150 yds of enemy trench. Acting on his own initiative he also worked along and occupied a branch sap. At 6 am. he led a patrol consisting of 10 men. He protected his company flanks in the advance on Bapaume. Later he set a fine example to the men in the flanks in establishing their position in front of the town being continually exposed to the fire of machine guns and trench mortars.

On 23 March when the enemy attacked dugouts and posts, Pte Lester again showed admirable coolness & courage in holding his gun in despite of positions under fire and giving the greatest assistance in repelling the attack.
