No. 68 Squad-		Captain Gordon Campbell WILSON.	<p>For continuous gallant work at very low altitudes in almost impossible weather.</p> <p>On 20-11-17 this officer scattered the enemy from strong point near FLESQUIERES with his machine gun.</p> <p>On 23-11-17 he bombed and shot on a field gun near ROUMILLY, killing two gunners.</p> <p>On 27-11-17 in spite of the constant attacks of enemy scouts he led a formation, carrying four bombs each, over BOURLON WOOD. All the bombs were dropped on the objectives and E.A. driven down. He then engaged a low-flying scout and fired 200 rounds at him at an average of 50 feet. His ammunition was then exhausted, and he had to return to his aerodrome.</p> <p>This officer has been out nearly every day attacking troops with bombs and machine gun fire at very low altitudes.
