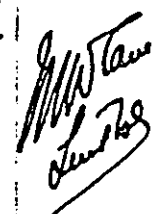

PASCOE EDWARD THEODORE CAPTAIN	When the 1st L.H.F.A. set off from Bechem - le Jeun on 5.3.18 this officer was placed in charge of all transport, which duties he always carried out most efficiently. During the first E.S. Salt operations, extending from March 23rd to April 11th, this officer rendered most valuable services. Though belonging to an attached unit, he really acted as second in command in the Mobile party of the 1st L.H.F. Ambulance. On March 29th he was despatched with some 60 odd camels with caudles, stores etc, to render assistance to the Angae collecting station from near El Ghoraniye to where such station was established on the E.S. Salt to Amman Road. During such trips he rendered most valuable services, & through his own initiative, perseverance he was able to add to the comfort of numerous wounded, refugees during their transport down the line to the Angae Receiving Station at Khumet Nimrin. On April 11th during the attack on the bridgehead at Ghoraniye by the Turks he again rendered valuable assistance, & on more than one occasion, he was exposed to enemy fire whilst locating suitable position for wounded to be sheltered. During the second E.S. Salt operation, extending from April 29th to May 4th, this officer again rendered valuable assistance. He was temporarily placed in charge of the mounted personnel accompanying the Brigade, when his C.O. Lieut. Col. Cox was wounded. He assisted materially by his own initiative & skill in assisting the transport of wounded down the hilly country from E.S. Salt. This officer has previously been mentioned in despatches.
