During the operations east of YPRES on 20th GeOsO. D.G.M. September 1917, Sgt. HAGAR, who, owing to heavy 2nd Aust. officer casualties during the advance, became Inf. Bde. responsible for the consolidation and organisation of the left flank of his Company, displayed the greatest coolness in organising his men and keeping them well controlled throughout the trying bombardment of 20th and 21st. He was wounded rather severely during the last hour of the heavy bombardment directed on our position on 21st instant.

During the operations east of YPRES on 20th G.O.C. D.C.X. Raymond HARGHEAVES. September 1917, this N.C.O. was one of the first 2nd Aust. to realise the importance of silencing the enemy Inf Bdez stronghold at BLACK WATCH CORNER and without waiting to discuss the situation called on some non to follow him and ran towards the block house which was troublesome and which was garrisomed by about 20 men and 5 machine gum. Despite heavy mashine gun fire, he reached it well shoud of the men and threw bombs into the block house and followed into the position immediately, forcing the enemy to run out of the second entrance into the hands of the men who were following. At all times under the most harrassing conditions this H.C.O. set an excellent example to his men.
