When the platoon commander and platoon sergeant of another platoon were wounded he assisted to re-organise the platoon, and although wounded early in the advance he remained on duty and assisted his platoon commander to organise the line. 	5th Battalion	1770	Pte. Frederick William JACKSON	This man acted as Platoon Runner during the operations near VAILLANT and LIGNON on the 9th, 10th and 11th August, and during this period his work was carried out with great bravery and gallantry. On the 9th, while the Company was being shelled, he carried messages continuously throughout the day under heavy artillery fire. On the 10th, he carried messages under extremely heavy A.C. fire and on one occasion when a platoon was slightly disorganised he took command and led them across the open with great coolness and initiative. Again on the 11th, when under heavy shelling communication had to be maintained to Company Headquarters by runner, he carried messages to and fro absolutely regardless of his personal safety.	S.
