Letters of high commendation from ~~the~~ Matron Gray at the Perth Hospital dated 15th. and 15th. December 1913 as to her service in the Surgical Ward of that Institution, confirmed by letter from the Chief Medical Officer.

The deceased passed away after a brief illness, amidst the regard of all who had been associated with her, which was marked by burial with Military Honours, and subsequently erection by the staff of a Monument of granite to her memory on which was placed a Marble Cross.
