Please find enclosed particulars of my late Sons death, I may state that I never got word from you as to where my Boy fell I heard from a Soldier Boy that he fell at Sternies, I often been going to ask you where he fell my son had 1 Cousin killed his name was Strachan his Mothers address is Mrs Alick Strachan Queenie New South Wales Upper Murray, another Cousin killed his name was J Hamilton his Fathers name Allen Hamilton Corryong Victoria, another Cousin Mark Wheeler his Brothers address Charles Wheeler Training Tables Caulfield Melbourne, 2 other Cousins killed names were H. J. H Elliott Schoolmaster and he was a Sergeant and his brothers name was John Elliott, he was a Corporal when killed

Their Fathers name is William Elliott
Mundaroo, Lumberumba

he had 9 or 10 other cousins fighting
and 2 Uncles, they were brothers
and one of those cousins was a
Sergeant his name was A B Bullock
his Fathers name was C Bullock
Holbrook my sons religion was
