He held a commission in the 7th Moreton Regiment Brisbane.
7. Any other biographical details likely to be of interest to the Historian of the A.I.F., or of his Regiment—

In 1908 he won a Government Grammar School Scholarship; in 1913 a University Scholarship, after graduating with I Class Honors he enlisted in 1916 as private, leaving Queensland in Aug 1916, went through the battles of Messines & Passchendaele gained his commission in the field. In 1917 was awarded the University Travelling Scholarship.

8. Was he connected with any other Member of the A.I.F. who died or who distinguished himself. (Please state Relationship)—  
Brother, T.H. Fisher, 25th Battalion, saw service in Gallipoli and France, wounded at Messines, France, 1916, invalided to Australia 1917
