Guthrie - Edward Percy Malcolm.

Private No. 180, 1st Australian Field Ambulance  
Army Medical Corps, Australian Imperial Force. Younger son  
of Frederick Bickell Guthrie, F.I.C., Chemist, Department  
of Agriculture, N.S.W., and Lecturer in Technology, Sydney  
University, and Grandson of the late Professor Frederick  
Guthrie, F.R.S. - born Burwood, Sydney 24th September 1894.  
Educated Sydney Grammar School, subsequently entered a Merchant's  
Office; joined the Commonwealth Junior Cadets in 1912 and was  
attached to the Garrison Artillery in Sydney. Volunteered  
for Imperial Service and joined the A.M.C. on the outbreak  
of the European War in August 1914, when he was attached to  
the 1st Australian Field Ambulance. Left for Egypt October  
20th 1914, served with the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force  
at Gallipoli from April. Took part in the landing there on  
April 25th, 1915, was invalided to England with dysentery at the  
end of August, and, after a spell of furlough was sent to  
the Base Camp at Weymouth to await orders to rejoin his  
Regiment. Died in Sydney Hall Military Hospital, ~~then~~ <sup>Weymouth,</sup>  
16th November, 1915, from Appendicitis contracted while on  
Active Service - unmarried.
