You will find enclosed in this the papers you sent me to fill in. I am not sure of the inscription so am writing to you. I have filled in what I would prefer but if the letters are too many could you either just put in the first part of the inscription or the following: "For God and Country laid he down his life" I would also like to add these things which I am proud of. I do not know if they would be of any interest so did not fill in the space allotted. if you think fit you can use any of this letter. From the combined families on my husband's side fourteen went to the war. all who were eligible I might add. He made 15. 6 were killed 1 missing 1 died of illness 2 wounded & home 1 would not get home. these were all musins. two of whom got medals.

I could get further particulars if necessary.
Some families sent none but I am
proud to say that not one of us that
could go stayed behind. My husband
only had one brother who in the early part
of the war was too young and later got exemption
on account of the death of his father. I have
no brothers and my brother-in-laws, one was
overage and the other rejected. My husband
was also related (through marriage only)
to Lieut. J. K. Williams of whom we are
all justly proud. There was much said about
him at the early stage of the war. he enlisted
as "Roy Macgregor" and distinguished himself
on the peninsula. gained a D. & M. He was
only 19 years old at the time. My husband's
eldest sister is married to his brother.
I hope I have ^{not} tired you with these details
and would not add one thing of this or appear
boastful in any way. My husband laid
down his life for the honour of his country
and could do no more. I would rather he
lay over there in France than call him a
shirker. Trusting this will be to your satisfaction.
