His grandfather Benj the first President of Chandos St & lived there. His grandfather was one of the founders of Batefords Albion Lodge at North Sydney. He also witnessed the first burial of a soldier in the A.I.F. who died or who distinguished himself. (Please state Relationship) Nephew Charles Ingram Junr of Newcastle N.S.W. killed in action & his brother in law Com. West No 3648 of 80 Chandos St North Sydney died of wounds received at Pozieres. Former of Hummwood Campsey England his wife Mrs Ingram.
