The deceased soldier was born on January 3rd, 1895, at Plenty, Tasmania. He worked as a labourer in Bruny Island; entered Claremont Camp, Tas., on March 8, 1916, and left Tasmania for the front on July 2, 1916, as a member of the machine-gun section, 40th Battalion; was wounded in the foot on February 3, 1917, "Somewhere in France" and died of wounds on February 26, 1917. Immediately prior to his enlistment was engaged as a labourer at Adventure Bay sawmill.
