

**COMMONWEALTH ARMY MEDICAL CORPS.**

**F**ORMED the Queensland Field Hospital and Bearer Unit of the Commonwealth Contingent, Army Medical Corps. For details of clothing and equipment, establishment, &c., *vide* Army Medical Corps, New South Wales, 4th Contingent, p. 16.

It comprised—1 warrant officer, 1 sergeant, 1 sergeant-artificer, 1 corporal, 2 lance-corporals, 10 privates; 16 in all, of whom 3 were struck off in South Africa.

Left Brisbane by rail on 30th January, 1902, and Sydney on 12th February, in the transport *Manchester Merchant*. Arrived at Durban on 17th March, and participated in operations in the Transvaal between 19th March and 31st May, 1902.

Embarked on 10th July in the transport *Drayton Grange* at Durban; called at Albany, 30th July, 1902, and arrived in Brisbane on 13th August, having taken Melbourne and Sydney *en route*.

Disbanded on 19th August, 1902.
