

NEW SOUTH WALES CITIZENS' BUSHMEN.

THE New South Wales Contingent of Citizens' Bushmen was raised in the first instance by public subscription; whence the name. The object was to enrol a regiment of countrymen acquainted with the vicissitudes of bush life; good shots, good riders, and of sound physique—such a class of men, in fact, as would be fitted to cope with the enemy, according to the methods of the latter. Preference, therefore, was given to men who had previously served in South Africa, and those having experience of country work in Australia, management of horses, and bush travelling.

The following establishment was approved:—One lieutenant-colonel, 1 major, 1 adjutant, 1 quartermaster, 1 veterinary officer, 1 regimental sergeant-major, 1 quartermaster-sergeant, 1 transport-sergeant, 1 orderly-room sergeant, 1 orderly-room clerk, 2 drivers, 6 batmen, 1 cook, 1 wagonman; total regimental staff, 5 officers, 15 N.C.O.'s and men, with 14 riding and 4 draught horses. For each squadron:—One captain, 2 lieutenants, two 2nd lieutenants, 1 squadron sergeant-major, 1 squadron quartermaster-sergeant, 6 sergeants, 1 sergeant-farrier, 2 shoeing smiths, 2 trumpeters, 6 corporals, 87 privates, 4 drivers, 5 batmen, 2 cooks, 1 saddler, 2 wagonmen; total, 5 officers, 120 N.C.O.'s and men, with 117 riding and 8 draught horses, besides 4 pack and 9 spare. Four squadrons; grand total, 25 officers, 495 others; 482 riding horses, 36 draught, 16 pack, 36 spare.

Pay was issued at cavalry rates up to disembarkation and afterwards from 25s., with 4s. to commanding officers, to 15s. and 2s. 6d. subalterns; and from 9s. to sergeant-majors to 5s. to privates; buglers, saddlers, and farriers, 1s. per diem extra. Colonial allowance to all officers, 3s. per diem; on A.S. Corps duty, 5s. per diem additional. "Separation allowance" was also paid to wives and families of soldiers at the front. *Vide* also p. 85.

The Contingent left Sydney on the 28th February, 1900, at a strength of 30 officers and 495 of other ranks, with 570 horses and 10 carts. Of these, 1 officer and 29 others died or were killed, 6 officers and 8 others were transferred, 3 officers and 49 others were struck off the strength in South Africa, 1 officer and 1 other were commissioned in the Imperial army; 23 officers and 404 others returned to Sydney. The 4 officers additional in the total accounted for were appointed in South Africa.

CLOTHING, ETC.

Clothing consisted of F.S. jacket and pants, with leggings and helmet. *Vide* p. 57. Arms and equipment:—M.L.E. rifles and sword bayonet, bandolier, and waist-belt. Fully horsed and supplied with saddlery. Regimental transport was provided.

OUTLINE OF SERVICES.

The Citizens' Bushmen embarked at Sydney on transports *Atlantian* and *Maple-more*, on 28th February, 1900; arrived at Cape Town 2nd April, and proceeded to Biera, where they disembarked on 12th April, and proceeded, *viâ* Marandellas, to Bulawayo.

Staff and "A" squadron served under General Plumer at relief of Mafeking. Served in General Plumer's Brigade, in General Baden-Powell's column, at the relief of Rustenburg. After a smart engagement, occupied the town 7th July, 1900.

"B," "C," and "D" squadrons, under Lt.-Colonel Airey, D.S.O., took part in a severe engagement at Koster's River on 22nd July, in attempting to relieve the Eland's River garrison.

"A" squadron, assisted by about 50 men of other details, defended Eland's River post against De la Rey with 1,000 men and guns for 13 days, refusing to surrender on any terms. They were eventually relieved by Lord Kitchener's force on 15th August, and Lord Methuen's column arrived from the north, 18th August, 1900.

EXTRACTS FROM REPORT OF MAJOR W. HOWARD TUNBRIDGE, OFFICER COMMANDING
2ND REGIMENT RHODESIAN FIELD FORCE.

The Eland's River camp was attacked by Commandant De la Rey on 4th August, at daybreak.

The garrison consisted of 105 of the 1st Regiment Rhodesian Field Force (New South Wales), 145 of the 2nd Regiment, Rhodesian Field Force (141 Queenslanders, 2 Tasmanians, and 2 Rifle Brigade), 51 of the 3rd Regiment, Rhodesian Field Force (42 Victorians, 9 West Australians), and 201 Rhodesian and other South African volunteers, with two Canadians and 1 Army Service Corps man attached. One 7-lb. screw gun, 1 .303 Maxim, and 1 .45 Maxim. The attacking force consisted, as far as we could learn, of from 2,000 to 3,000 men, with 5 guns, 3 pom-poms, and 1 Maxim. As the camp was only a rest camp, and an attack in force had not been anticipated, the defences were not at all complete, consisting only of a series of

half-moon loose stone walls on two sides of the main camp, and on a kopje held by Captain Butters and 80 men. As soon, however, as the sun had set, and shelling had ceased, the men not required for picket and watering guard were at once got to work throwing up earth on the outside of the walls, and trenching on the inside. Stores were also used to protect the back of the trenches, banked with earth on the reverse side, as, the camp being very small, a large proportion of the wounds were from the reverse fire.

The hospital was inside the camp, and was composed of the three ambulances of my regiment, covered by buck sheets, and on the first day of attack was only protected by a double row of biscuit boxes, about 5 feet high. This was raised afterwards and strengthened by another row of boxes and earth banked to the top on the outside.

The horses, oxen, and mules, being on an exposed slope, suffered very heavily, over 1,500 being killed altogether; but it was impossible to protect them.

A picket from Captain Butters' post first discovered the enemy, and opened rifle fire, which was immediately responded to by shell fire, which was kept up the whole day until dark.

The enemy shelled us daily until the 9th August, on which date only a few shells fell.

Over 1,700 shells were counted the first day, and about 480 the second day; but after that the firing gradually slackened until the afternoon of the 9th, when it ceased altogether.

Besides the shell fire, which was from all sides, rifle fire commenced on the morning of the 4th, and was kept up all day and night for eleven days, at distances varying from 300 to nearly 3,000 yards; the riflemen being in every case well protected by natural cover and seldom showing themselves.

The enemy brought up their guns to within 2,100 yards on the 5th, but were compelled to retire by our volleys, and finally took up a position out of range of rifle fire.

The gun we had was only an old 7-pounder muzzle-loading screw gun, mounted on a 9-pounder gun carriage, and we only had 100 rounds in all.

The gun was constantly getting jammed, and I had to take it to pieces four times, and finally filed the gas-checks on the shells, which had become burred up. The cartridges were black powder. The .303 Maxim also continually jammed with the ammunition served to them. Captain Hockings informed me of this, and asked if I would allow our ammunition to be used, which I did; the elevation had to be increased about 200 yards, and after this the gun worked excellently.

The .45 Maxim with Captain Butters also jammed once or twice, but was got to work well afterwards; this also had black powder.

On the 8th, Commandant De la Rey summoned Colonel Hore to surrender, officers to be allowed their arms and to be permitted to march the men to the nearest British post. This was refused.

The siege was raised on the evening of the 14th. Lord Kitchener's advance guard was seen approaching about sundown on the 15th, and he marched into camp on the 16th. Lord Methuen arrived from Magato Pass on the 18th, and the garrison returned to Mafeking with him next day.

I am sorry to have to report a rather heavy casualty list of New South Wales men under my command—4 killed and 6 wounded.

The casualties were very heavy on the first day; nearly all being from fragments of shells, and were very bad wounds.

Surgeon-Captain Duka and his staff—one of them, Trooper W. Hunt of your Colony—were untiring in their work, which was all done under shell fire. Captain Duka did splendid work the whole time, and had his hands very full.
