Submitted: The first 12 days of June, H.M.A.S. "AIR CLOUD" was berthed at the Main Wharf, Darwin. On 12th June, slipped and proceeded to Fairmile slipway for periodical careening of the hull. As the ship was hauled up the slipway, it was found that the ship was settling with the rudders on a crossbeam of the cradle. When the ship was clear of the water, two wedges were cut from the crossbeam and the rudders freed of any weight. On the 13th of June the ship entered the water from the slipway and steered by main engine returned to Main Wharf. On the following day (14th June) slipped and proceeded back to the Fairmile slipway where we slipped in such a position that the rudders could be removed. On the following day (Saturday 15th June, 1946), the rudders were removed and found to be slightly bent. Our spare rudder and that of H.M.A.S. "AIR MASTER" were fitted and the old rudders, one of which was given to H.M.A.S. "AIR MASTER" while the other was retained on board, were marked 2damaged". The same evening the ship renentered the water and returned to her berth at Main Wharf, Darwin, having scraped and anti-fouled the hull during the two days on the slip.

On Sunday, 16th June, 1946, proceeded on rudder trials for 12 hours. Rudders behaved satisfactorily.

The ship remained alongside from 16th till 30th June when on the latter date we slipped and proceeded to Marsh Shoal Light to return to the berth at Main wharf some three hours later. Engines behaved satisfactorily.

The condition of the bull appears satisfactory although a tingle was required on the Port quarter when the ship slipped; the damaged wood was very soft in places.

The conduct and health of the Ship's Company continues to be good, although morale appears to be only fair.





#### SUBMITTED:

On 2nd October H.M.A.S. "Air Cloud" slipped from the main wharf, Darwin, and proceeded on a three hour run to return at 1659.

- 2. On 20th October the tanker M.V. "Dorcasia" berthed at Main Wharf to discharge gasolene. Consequently, after the Ships Companies had berthed the tanker, "Air Master" and "Air Cloud" slipped and proceeded to C.T. Jetty of Main Wharf securing there at 1515 in order to be out of the danger area where no naked lights may be shown. On 22nd October both ships returned to their normal berth.
- 3. On 28th October, at 0940, Group Captain Leren, R.A.A.F., Air Officer Commanding North Western Area, arrived onboard, was conducted over the ship, and taken for a 50 minute run to give him some idea of the performance, construction and routine of A.S.R. craft.
- 4. On 30th October "Air Cloud" slipped from Main Wharf at 0750 and proceeded to slipway, where the ship slipped as soon as "Air Master" was clear of the approaches. "Air Master" had been in the slip for the preceeding two days. Quarterly kareening was carried out and at 0820 the following morning (31st October) "Air Cloud" returned to berth alongside "Air Master" at the Main Wharf.
- It was observed whilst on the slip that where minor repairs to the hull below waterline were required, in two places the hull was found to be worm-eaten. It is not known to what extent the worms have spread, but the ship appears to be quite seaworthy.
- 6. Whilst on the slip it was also observed that on the Port propellor there is slight corrosion at the base of two of the blades. This was pointed out to the Base Engineer Officer but is not considered dangerous.

- 7. The engines have been running satisfactorily and appear to be in good condition.
- 8. The conduct and health of the ship's company has been generally good, with the exception of one case of dengue fever, who was admitted to Darwin Hospital for a week. The morale of the ship's Company is fair.
- A recreation party was sent to Night Cliffs for a weekend during the month and the ship's company has taken part in boxing and deck tennis on the wharf, while swimming parties have gone ashore to Mendil Beach.

#### SUBMITTED:

H.M.A.S. "AIR CLOUD" lay alongside H.M.A.S. "AIR MASTER" until 5th September, when at 1725 both ships slipped and proceeded to rescue survivors of a C.47 which crashed off East Point. H.M.A.S. "AIR CLOUD" picked up two survivors, and the Civil Aviation launch picked up the remaining three, but transferred them to "AIR MASTER" after fouling their propellor with a rope. The airmen were returned to Refit Jetty where an ambulance awaited them. "AIR MASTER" and "AIR CLOUD" returned to berth at Main Wharf.

- On 11th September "AIR CLOUD" slipped at 1705 and proceeded to Refitting Jetty to embark Naval Officer-in-Charge, Darwin and party. Slipping from the Refit Jetty at 1750, proceeded to circle the small convoy then sailing from Darwin; the convoy consisted of H.M.A.S. "KANGAROO" with the coal lighter "APER" in tow H.M.A. Tug "WAREE", H.M.A. MSL 702, and two small civilian craft. "AIR CLOUD" returned to Refit Jetty to land Naval Officer in Charge and party at 1850, and then returned to berth at Main Wharf.
- On 19th September "AIR CLOUD" assumed duties of Control Boat for the Civil Aviation flying boats, as their own launch was under repair. Slipping at 1605 "AIR CLOUD" attended a landing and returned to berth at 1700. At 1840 we slipped again and attended the take off of the same plane. Attended a second landing, slipping at 2200 and berthing at 0040; slipped at 0125 for take off of second flying boat, returning to berth at Main Wharf at 0340.
- 4. On the following day 20th September, slipped at 2000 to attend landing returning at 2250. Slipped at 0015 for take off, and returned to berth at 0100.
- 5. During these operations a Control Officer and a telegraphist from Civil Aviation were borne.

The conduct and health of the Ship's Company 6. continues to be generally good, while morale is fair.

7. A deck tennis court has been rigged on the wharf, and the Ship's Company has taken part in both this sport and boxing.

8. The engines are both behaving satisfactorily, and the condition of the hull appears to be fairly good.





On 6th July, H.M.A.S. "AIR CLOUD" proceeded to sea for a three hour run to test the r.p.m. speed table. Engines behaved satisfactorily.

- On 16th July, the Base Engineer Officer went aboard H.M.A.S. "AIR MASTER" in the company of which we proceeded for a three hour run to further verify the r.p.m. speed table. During this run a short burst of speed was made at maximum speed; the engine reached 1925 r.p.m.
- At 2215 the same day the ship was brought to immediate notice for sea, and at 0055 on the 17th we slipped and proceeded to Napier Bay on the East Coast of Melville Island to bring off a party who had gone aground on a sandbar and were reported to be unable to float their landing barge. As dawn broke we sighted Cape Keith and at 0740 sighted the flashing light of a mirror from the shore. At 0825, anchored in 4 fathoms of water well offshore and proceeded insbare in the dinghy to investigate party. The party consisted of three people, Mr. Chapman, Mr. and Mrs. Burnett-Reid all of whom were in good health ready to come aboard H.M.A.S. "AIR CLOUD". At 1025 weighed and proceeded to Darwin securing alongside H.M.A.S. "AIR MASTER" at the Main Wharf at 1510.
- 4. On 24th July slipped and proceeded to a buoy off Refitting Jetty where Naval Officer-in-Charge, Darwin came aboard. Proceeded on the 2 hour run around the harbour as proposed for the visit of the Governor General.
- On 31st July, slipped and proceeded in company with H.M.A.S. "AIR MASTER" on a trial run similar to that carried out on 24th. On Friday 5th July Leading Seaman L.R. Breen, O.N. 23581, joined and assumed duties as coxswain. Petty Officer R.B. Sperring was discharged to H.M.A.S. "MELVILLE" for onward passage to H.M.A.S. "LONSDALE" for demobilisation.
- A party of four ratings spent a weekend at the Naval recreational area at Nightscliff in the latter part of the month, and all hands have taken in organised sport during the month.


Submitted:

Submitted:

(1) At the commencement of the month H.M.A.S. "AIR CLOUD" was on the slip at Darwin. The ship came off the slip on 5th.

- (2) The starboard motor was giving trouble and after removing the cylinder head on the outboard side, an inspection revealed a burnt out piston in one cylinder. The motor is now available for running on eleven cylinders only, and after a short trial run on February 8th at speeds up to 1600 revs. it appeared that the motors ran reasonably satisfactorily at these speeds. However, a lot of oil smoke still blows back past the piston rings and compression on all cylinders is well below that laid down as normal working compression in the Hall Scott Manual. New engines are being forwarded from Sydney.
- (3) The ship has been harbour for the whole of the month and has not been called upon for operational duties. At the request of the R.A.A.F. the ship was placed on instant notice for several hours on the morning of the 19th.
- (4) The conduct of the ship's company has been very good and morale fair.
  - (5) The health of the ship's company is good.
- (6) One rating was drafted to "MORETON" for demobilis ation and as no relief has been appropriated to date a rating has joined on loan from "Melville". Flinders Naval Depot have been requested to make a relief available. Both wireless operators have been drafted and the R.A.A.F. have not made reliefs available. One telegraphist has joined on loan from Coonawarra.
- (7) The general condition of the ship is very good with the exception of the motors. The Bendix radio compass has been defective, but it is anticipated that it will be in working order within a few days.

The Motor Mechanic sustained a slight injury to his hand, which necessitated one stitch, whilst working in the engine room on 11th Maribut he has recovered satisfactorily.
- 7. "AIR CLOUD" has now completed over 10 months in the Darwin area, and with the exception of the main motors the condition of the ship is very good. The new motors to which reference was made in my February Report have not yet arrived from Sydney. The "Onan" generator was top overhoused during the month.



H.M.A.S."AIR CLOUD" has been on detached duty at Melville Bay for the whole of December.

During that period the ship has not been called upon for any A.S.R. operations, but has made three trips to Groote Eylandt, the first on December 1st, returning to Melville Bay on December 5th with R.A.A.F. personnel aboard. (The R.A.A.F. station was handed back to the Civil Aviation Dep't on that date). The second was made on December 13th when it was necessary to transport a R.A.A.F. Medical Officer to Groote Eylandt to treat a civilian badly burnt in a petrol explosion. The ship sailed for Melville Bay on December 15th for further supplies of blood plasma and penicillin returning to Groote Eylandt the same day. The patient was moved to Darwin by Catalina on 14th, and ship returned to Melville Bay on 15th.

There have been no unusual incidents during the month.



On the morning of the 19th November R.A.A.F. personnel were taken off the "Emerellis" and landed at R.A.A.F. Station, Groote Eylandt, "Air Cloud" returning to Melville Bay.
- On 22nd November, the ship again proceeded to Groote Eylandt with the Commanding Officer of Operational Base Unit, Gove, aboard, and stores for R.A.A.F. Station, Groote Eylandt, returning on 23rd November with personnel from that station.
- The R.A.A.F. Catalina Squadron No.42 have now evacuated the camp at Melville Bay, and the nearest R.A.A.F. camp is now R.A.A.F. Operational Base Unit, Gove, 18 miles from Melville Bay. However, fuelling facilities have not been removed from Melville Bay and water is carried by water truck to the jetty. The Commanding Officer of Operational Base Unit has promised to make a truck available to the ship for the purpose of drawing stores, provisions etc. from Gove.







1. On 1st July H. M.A.S. "Air Cloud" was on A.S.R. station at Butchers Bay in Vansittart Bay.

2. On 2nd July vessel proceeded to West bay for fuel and Water. On 4th an RAAF party was taken to Sir Graham Moore Island. Whilst laying at anchor a signal was received that a serious truck accident had occurred at 58 O.B.U. and an emergency run was made to return unit's Medical Officer to that station.

- 3. On 5th a refrigerator loaned by the RAAF was installed and ship returned to Butchers bay on 7th.
- 4. On the 10th an excursion was made to the southern end of Vansittart Bay, and sounding taken, to add to local knowledge held, in the event of a crash into those waters.
- 5. At 1135 I.K. on 14th July passage was made to West bay, calling in at Sir Graham Moore Island to pick up RAAF personnel. Berthed vessel at West Bay 1650 I.K. Fuel and water takenaboard and returned to Butchers bay on/8th.
- 6. At 0830 I.K. on 19th ship with M.O. and metreologist from 58

At beginning of June H.M.A.S. "Air Cloud" was on the fairmile slip at Darwin for inspection of underwater fittings, cleaning and anti fouling of hull. Job was completed at 0900 on 1st and "Air Cloud" returned to position alongside main jetty.

- 1. At 0130 I.K. on 3rd "Air Cloud" was dispatched to maintain air-searescue station, and returned to Darwin and berthed at 2145 I.K. on same date.
- 2. On 6th June vessel proceeded to sea with RAAF Signals officers for test of V.H.F. gear with land station and aircraft.

On 1st May "Air Cloud" with "Air Trail" (S.O.) and "Air Sailor" made passage from Mackay to Bowen, berthing main jetty at 1445K.

t 0725 on 2nd May the vessels proceeded to Townsville. From 2nd to 6th "Air Cloud" was at Townsville undergoing repairs to ship and radio equipment.

On 6th May a passage was made to Cairns, and on the 8th ship was sailed to Cooktown.

After a days delay at Cooktown, "Air Cloud" was sailed to an anchorage on S.W. side of Stanley Island in Flinders Group. On 11th passage was made to Portland Roads.

The 12th May was spent at Portland Roads, waiting for weather to clear, and on 13th passage was made to Thursday Island.

Vessel remained at Thursday Island whilst a one hundred hour overhaul of the motors was made, and departed for Melville bay at 1215K on 18th. Arrival atnR.A.A.F. station was made at 1000K and fueling commenced. Owing to delay in supply of fuel, "Air Cloud" and "Air Sailor" were unable to proceed atil 1330K on 20th May. Vessel arrived at Port Essington, and at 1245 on list May tied alongside M.L.813 preparatory to fueling. On 22nd May passage was made to Darwin.

From 22nd May to 31st May "Air Cloud" was at Darwin. Ship was inspected by engineers, shipwrights and radio mechanics, and all defects noted. Repairs to V.H.F. were made by an R.A.A.F. party and on 30th vessel was slipped for inspection of underwater fittings and antifouling. It was observed that anti-fouling applied at Sydney had washed off, and that Phennrock plastic had peeled off in large patches, exposing bare hull to marine attack. On 31st vessel was on slip drying out, preparatory to being antifouled.

Conduct and morale of crew were excellent. Health was good with the exception of L/Sea G.H.Rutland who is in hospital with Boils and Scabies. No long leave was granted.

Submitted: From 1st to 15th April "Air Cloud" was with "Air Sailor" at Coffs Harbour waiting for heavy S.E. weather to break in order to sail to Brisbane.

It 0137 on 5th April the two ships departed for Brisbane, off S. Solitary Island the spindle drive shaft of the water pump on "Air Sailor's" starboard motor broke, and an immediate return to Coffs Harbour was made. Sydney was notified, and a new pump was received and fitted on April 6th.

A departure for Brisbane was made at 6006K April 7th, and the two vessels berthed at C.S.R. wharf Brisbane at 1604 same day.

From April 7th to April 22nd Air Cloud was at M.L. Base Brisbane undergoing necessary repairs to ship and radio equipment.

With "Air Trail" (S.O.) "Air Cloud" was sailed from Brisbane for Gladstone on April 22, and arrival was made at 1000 hrs on 23rd April.

After refueling and watering passage was made to Port Clinton on April 24. The vessels were held up here by heavy gales until until April 28, when a passage was made to Mackay.

On April 30, vessel was at Mackay, departure being delayed by heavy weather, Health of crew during period satisfactory. Conduct and morale excellent. No long leave was granted.







From 1st to 3rd March Air Cloud was on slips at Halworsen's yard, Neutral Bay; hull painted with special anti-fouling composition.

- on the 3rd, vessel left Halvorsens and moored Rushcutters Bay; on 5th proceeded to Gore Bay for Fuel, and on the 6th proceeded to Spectacle Island for armament.
- 2 On the 7th, a special trial was made at request of Coastal craft Officer, Rushcutter, and a report submitted to him covering speed of vessel running at 1400 revs one motor only.
- ✓ Gunnery trials by personnel of G.I.C. Sydney, were conducted on 12th, and armament found to be satisfactory.
- 5. Proceeded to Jervis Bay p.m. 13th, and C.O. reported to S.O. of A.S.R. Flotilla, Lt. Couchman of M.L. 822. Vessel remained at Jervis Bay until 21st, during which time exercises in man overboard, and fire stations at sea were conducted.
- 6 On 21st Air Cloud returned to Sydney, and period until the 24th was utilised in preparing, and storing for northern voyage.
- 7 At 0300 on 24th Air Cloud, with Air Sailor under orders, sailed for Coffs Harbour, arriving 5 hours after E.T.A. due to severe North Easterly head winds being experienced over major portion of voyage.
- 8 From p.m. 24th to 31st March, vessel weatherbound at Coffs Harbour. On 30th, an attempt was made to reach Yamba heads, but river bar could not be crossed owing to extreme weather conditions. C.O. of Air Cloud in touch with Operations Brisbane, re weather conditions.
- Health of Crew: On 13th M/M. Dyson drafted to Rushcutter for treatment of Hay Fever. M/M. C.Smith aboard, and suffered from extreme seasickness on voyage to Coffs Harbour. Requested he be placed ashor in accordance with Rushcutter 220145Z, stating that he is unfit for A.S.R. Craft, Sydney notified.

  Harbour district hospital, on instructions from Rushcutter, found to have contracted Gonorrhea. Discharged by Coffs Harbour hospital after Penicillin treatment, as completely cured, for trip to Yamba Heads. P.O. Sperring treated at Coffs Harbour hospital for badly crushed thumb.
- 10 Morale of crew excellent.

Distance steamed during March 610 miles. Average speed 14 to 18 knots.



Despite that V.H.F. gear was checked by Radio mechanics at both Jervis Bay and Sydney, this equipment to date has been completely useless. Necessary to have one perspex window-replaced, and sliding shield fitted to main wheelhouse perspex window-screen. Several leaks in decks require plugging. New Tachometer cable required starboard motor. Special anti-fouling paint applied at Halvorsens yard, has washed off in large patches, exposing fennrock. Imperative need is for compass to be re-swung at Brisbane.
