

That during the month of January 1946 H.M.A.S. "AIR HOPE" was stationed at Port Moresby for Air Sea Rescue duties.

- 2. Again no rescue operations were carried out.
- 3. The ship was serviceable and at immediate notice for 31 days of the month.
- 4. During the month, on instructions from Northern Command R.A.A.F., both Wireless Operators were posted to their respective Personnel Depots for demoblisation. In both cases no relief has yet been forthcoming, although one has been posted.
- 5. Owing to these postings the ship's company has been reduced to four in number ( Two seaman and two E/R ratings). In order to keep the ship operational arrangements have been made with R.A.A.F., for the services of a wireless operator in the event of an emergency arising.
- 6. The morale of the remaining crew is gradually being This is due to them being in close contact with the R.A.A.F., and witnessing the posting for discharge of many of it's personnel. However it is considered that the main cause is the complete lack of information as to any policy for these craft especially as to whether there is any definite time limit to a rating's service in these vessels. Also whether it is intended to retain these vessels in the New Guinea area for an indefinite period.
- 7. Fire Stations were excercised on the 8th, 17th and 26th and were efficient.
- 8. No long leave was granted. With one exception none of the ship's company has had long leave for over 12 months now.

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
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

that during the month of November, 1945, H.M.A.S. "AIR HOPE" was stationed at Port Moresby for Air Sea Rescue duties.

- 2. From 19th July, 1945, when this Ship was stationed at Port Moresby, to date, there have been no rescue operations carried out. There has been one alert which proved a false alarm.
- 3. On the 14th the Ship proceeded to Yule Island to carry out inspection of fuel dump then returning the same day.
- 4. On the 16th a mine search was carried out off "Basilisk" beacon and 16 square miles covered in square search working on 440 yards visibility radius without result.
- The Ship was serviceable and at immediate notice for 30 days of the month.
- Fire stations were exercised on the 6th, 14th, 23rd and 30th and were efficient.
- The conduct of the crew is good. Morale remains on a high level although towards the end of the month has showed signs of deterioration owing to (a) the very poor food available (S.S. "Marella" has now raised that shortage) (b) the continued inactivity and (c) the absence of any definition of policy as to the future of these craft.



#### Submitted

That during the month of October, 1945, H.M.A.S. "AIR HOPE" was stationed at Port Moresby for Air Sea Rescue duties.

2. Again no operations were carried out during this time.

The main engines were turned over weekly and worked up to maximum revolutions under way. Performance was very satisfactory.

The ship was slipped on Naval slipway from the 24th to the 27th October for routine cleaning, examination and antifouling. The rather protracted spell on the slip was done with the object of letting the hull dry out, and so be examined for worms. It was found to be sound in all respects. Two coats of anti-fouling paint were applied prior to entering the water.

- 5. The ship was at immediate notice and serviceable for 27 days of the month.
- Fire stations were exercised on the 7th, 15th, 24th, and 30th, and were efficient.
- 7. Conduct of the crew was good and their morale surprisingly high in spite of the continued inactivity such a duty as Air Sea Rescue in this area brings about.
- 8. The health of the crew is satisfactory.
- 9. No long leave was granted to Ship's Company during the month.
- 10. Efficiency Report.





Subject MONTHLY REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - AUGUST 1945.

Submitted: -

During the month of August, 1945, H.M.A.S. "Air Hope" was stationed at Port Moresby for Air Sea Rescue duties.

- No operations were carried out during this time.
- From the 2nd to 3rd the ship was slipped on Naval Slipway, Port Moresby. All under-water fittings were found to be in excellent condition. The hull's condition fair - with considerable slime. Hull was thoroughly cleaned down and two coats Taubman's Anti-Fouling applied. Ship's sides were painted also.
- 4. On the 5th ship underwent speed trials. Maximum revolutions obtained 1850 each engine. This was disappointing in view of the fact that both engines were running faultlessly. Subsequent trials have failed to improve on this performance.
- 5. Plugs to complete Bendix Radio Compass were obtained locally. Fitting of same was carried out by ship's wireless operators. The unit is now serviceable but requires calibrating. Application has been made for this.
- 6. Action Stations were excercised on the 3rd, 10th, and 13th. Fire Stations on the 3rd, 10th, 13th, 22nd, and 28th. All were satisfactory.
- Conduct with one exception and morale of crew continues to be of high standing.
- Health of crew is satisfactory. One rating was hospitalised during month with Dengue Fever. He has previously been subject to this malady.
  - No long leave was granted during month.

Efficiency Report: -10.

> Main Engines - Running excellently but maximum revolutions only 1850 per minute.

- Showing signs of age - unable to hold charge over Batteries 1350 S.G. in spite of continuous trickle charging from shore supply.

Guns - Satisfactory.







SUBFECT. MONTHLY REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - JULY 1945.

Submitted: -

That from the 1st., to the 9th., July '45, H.M.A.S. "Air Hope" was engaged in making passage to operational base. From the 20th to the 31st July was engaged in A.S.R., duties from Port Moresby.

- 2. Passage was made from Thursday Island to Port Moresby with anchorings at Cocoanut Island, Dalrymple Island, Darnley Island and Yule Island en route from the 2nd to the 14th. Consistent force 5 to 6 S.E. winds caused delay on this passage.
- 2. On the 14th we were able to render assistance to ANGAU by transporting a Sergeant from Yule Island to Pt. Moresby. He was in need of immediate medical attention.
- 4. On the 16 th proceed for Milne Bar by inshoe route, anchoring at Hula Village from P.M. 16th until A.M. 19th. When off Table Bay on the 19th received signal to return to Port Moresby.
- 5. It was then ascertained that this ship was to be based on Port Moresby for A.S.R. duties.
- 6. Numerous inspections were carried out of the ship by interested authorities between the 20th and 24th.
- 7. Considerable assistance has been forthcoming from both of the local Naval and R.A.A.F., establishments to date.
- 8. Arrangements for an early slipping of the craft were made with N.O.I.C., Port Moresby.
- 2. Fire and Actions Stations were excercised on the 2nd, 7th, 15th, 18th, 22nd, 27th and 31st July and were satisfactory.
  - 10. The conduct and morale of the crew are excellent.







SUBJECT: - MONTHLY REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - JUNE 1945.

Submitted:-

That during the month of June 1945 H.M.A.S. "AIR HOPE" was engaged in making passage to operational base.

- Passage was made from Mackay to Thursday Island and the following were the ports of call. Left Mackay 3/6/45 arrived Townsville 3/6/45. Left Townsville 10/6/45 arrived Thursday Island 14/6/45 having called at Cairns, Cooktown, Flinder's Island Group and Portland Roads en route.
- 3. Since arriving at Thursday Island weather has forced the ship to remain in shelter although three attempts were made to get away. These were made on the 16th, 28th and 29th. In all cases conditions proved unsuitable for passage to Port Moresby.
- A. During the stay at Townsville an attempt to obtain Radio Compass plugs was made. The R.A.A.F. (N.E.A. Command) promised results but prior to leaving it was found that these could not be supplied to transit A.S.R. craft.
- 5. On the 15th the ship had completed three months in the water since last slipping. There has been a marked falling off in performance during the month. Maximum revs. per minute are now 1,750 and reduction of 250 on top performance. Petrol comsumption has increased by 10%. Application for slipping was made at Townsville and Thursday Island but both places were unable to accommodate.
- 6. Difficulty in the keeping of perishable provisions has been accounted owing to the non availability of ice.
- 7. Fire and Action stations were exercised on the 3rd, 8th, 14th, 19th, 23rd and 29th., with satisfactory results.
- 8. The conduct and morale of the crew are excellent.
- 9. The health of the crew is good.
- 10. No long leave was granted during the month.





### SUBMITTED :

That during the month of May, 1945, H.M.A.S. "AIR HOPE" was engaged in making passage from Brisbane to operational base.

- On the 2nd May it was necessary to list as a defect the "ONAN" Auxiliary Generator Motor. This was placed in the hands of the Engineer Officer, Fairmile Base, Brisbane. All possible sources of supply were investigated for the necessary spare parts or unit. None were available and in consequence the worn parts had to be made good. Delay was experienced and H.M.A.S. "AIR SPEED" and H.M.A.S. "AIR MERCY" proceeded without this ship. H.M.A.S. "AIR FAITH" took over as S.O. of the group.
- On the 16th May the Compass Adjusting Officer, Brisbane, (Lieutenant Elliott, R.N.R.) examined and condemned existing Kelvin White (U.S.N. Pattern) type compass. These were replaced by Admiralty Pattern No. 1151 A's. An azimuth ring was also fitted.
- The ship proceeded from Brisbane on the 24th May and arrived at Mackay on the 31st having called at Gladstone. En route five days were spent at anchor in West Bay, Middle Island, Percy Group, sheltering from S.E. gale.
- During passage it was found that navigation was extremely difficult in more than a moderate sea except when the sea was following. However, dead reckoning was reasonably accurate.
- Fire drill was carried out on the 1st, 10th, 17th, 24th and the 31st. The results were good. Action Stations were exercised on the same dates and were satisfactory..
- 7. The conduct of the crew was excellent. Morale was generally good, but was affected furing the long delay in Brisbane. This could be attributed to impatience and the fact that none of the Crew are Brisbane natives.
- 8. The health of the crew is excellent.

SUBMITTED:	

That during the month of April, 1945, H.M.A.S. "AIR HOPE" was engaged in preparing for passage to operational base from the 1st to 22nd, thence on passage from 23rd to 30th.

- 2. Successful gun trials were carried out on the 2nd April. All gunnery equipment was passed by the Gunnery Trials Officer.
- Compasses were adjusted and ship swung by the Master Attendant on 5th April.
- 4. On the 13th April, the ship was detailed to embark Rear-Admiral Rushbrook, R.N., and party. An inspection of docking facilities and harbour was carried out.
- on the 20th April speed trials were carried out in harbour with the following results: 1200 revs. 14 knots; 1400 revs. 17.5 knots; 1600 revs. 22 knots. A loss of 4 to 5% of speed had resulted in one month from base being slipped.
- On the 23rd April, the ship as S.O. proceeded from Sydney in company with H.M.A.S. "AIR MERCY" and H.M.A.S. "AIR SPEED"
- 7. Conditions between Sydney and Brisbane were very good, although it was necessary to shelter for several days in Coff's Harbour. The ships behaved well.
- 8. The group arrived in Brisbane on 29th April and commenced routine engine overhauls on the 30th.
- 9. Fire drill was carried out on the 3rd, 8th, 15th, 23rd and 29th with good results.
- 10. The conduct and morale of the crew are excellent.
- 11. One rating returned from long leave during month.
- 12. The health of ship's company is atisfactory.

#### Submitted:

During the month of March, 1945, H.M.A.S. "AIR HOPE" was engaged in general preparation for operational duties and crew was made up to full war complement.

- 2. From the 17th to 20th the ship was slipped at Halvorsens Yard, Neutral Bay when the bottom was cleaned and anti-fouled. The under-water fittings were examined and although some "play" was discovered in the starboard shaft all were passed as satisfactory.
- Engine trials were carried out on the 22nd under the supervision of the Base Engineer Officer, 1950 revolutions per minute from each engine were obtained and a speed of 30 knots attained over the measured mile. These trials were deemed as satisfactory. No astern trials were carried out.
- 4. Civilian electrical contractors carried on with the fitting of radio equipment. Progress here was slow.
- 5. Two attempt were made on the 26th and 31st to carry out gun trials, but had to be abandoned owing to weather.
- In general steady progress was made during the month with storing and preparation for sea.
- 7. Fire drill exercises were carried out on the 2nd, 7th, 28th and 26th and action stations exercised on the 14th and 22nd. Results were good.




