Commanding Officer, H.M.A.S. "AIR MIST" FROM DATE TO Naval Officer in Charge, New Guinea. SUBJECT REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF MAY, 1945. Activity During the month of May, H.M.A.S. "AIR MIST" has travelled from Thursday Island to Morotai, stopping at the following places; Thursday Island, Stephens Island, Yule Island, Port Moresby, Hula Bay, Aleu Island, Port Glascow, Milne Bay, Oro Bay, Lae, Madang, Alexishafen, Hansa Bay, Aitape, Humboldt Bay, Tanamerah Bay, Wakde Island, Biak. A towing bridle was fitted at Humboldt Bay. From Biak to Morotai we were towed by M.V. "Comara". The towing was accomplished under ideal conditions. General Lack of refrigeration and inability to procure ice in the tropics has caused considerable quantities of fresh provisions to be condemmed. At several places en route it was only possible to obtain fresh provisions in large quantities. The lack of refrigeration was then a serious handicap. Two American vessels operating in this area exactly similar in design to "Air Mist" are fitted with electric refrigerators. Crew During the month of May, two members of the crew have suffered ill health. Leading Seaman H. Swinburn was put ashore at Causalty Clearing Station, Hansa Bay, suffering from Dengue Fever. Stoker. G. Wilson suffered from sore throat and cold on chest. Wilson has recovered. Swinburn has not returned to ship. Fire Drill Five fire exercises have been conducted during the month. Hull This vessel was last slipped on the floating dock, Alexishafen, 17th May 1945. The bottom was scrubbed and painted with anti-fouling paint. All underwater fittings were examined. The port and starboard propellors were removed and replaced with spare propellors. The damaged propellors were left at Alexishafen to be trued up and forwarded to this vessel when repaired. With regard to para. 4 of the abovementioned Report of Proceedings, the question as to whether it was necessary to enter into a further agreement with R.A.N.V.R. (N.A.P.) personnel upon the changeover to R.A.N.V.R., was raised by D.N.A. in a Minute dated 9th June, 1944, to which Head of 'N' replied that he did not think it was legally necessary. (Both these minutes are attached to the 'Change-over' File No. 554/201/348, which is at present in circulation).

N.O.L. 128676 dated 20th November, 1944, specifically directed that all mobilized ratings of R.A.N.V.R. (N.A.P.) were to be transferred to R.A.N.V.R., in their relative Seaman Branch rates to date 1st November, 1944.

R.A.N.V.R. (N.A.P.) was a section of R.A.N.V.R., and the 'changeover' was to effect the absorption of R.A.N.V.R.(N.A.P.) personnel in R.A.N.V.R., General Service Pool for Coastal Craft, in order to remove certain anomalies which existed under the old set-up.






