



Submitted for the information of the Naval Board:-Continued to carry out minesweeping operations on 1st and 2nd March At 0815/3rd completed "Kilmoon" operation and sailed for Melbourne.

1720/3rd secured alongside Nelson Pier, Williamstown.

Remained alongside until 1352/6th when in company with Flotilla departed for Hobart. 1434/8th secured alongside. Kings Pier Hobart and remained there until 1110/11th when with Flotolla sailed for minefield "Kilto".

Owing to adverse weather donditions Flotilla anchored at 1407/11th in North West Bay. At 0815/12th weighed and proceeded but the weather was still unsuitable for minesweeping operations so at 1106 anchored in Great Taylor Bay. Remained at this anchorage until 0617/14th when Flotilla proceeded to minefield "Kilto".

At 1610/14th Minefield "Kilto" was completed and at 1843 anchored in Great Taylor Bay. At 0621/15th sailed for minefield "Kilpill" and at 1030 commenced minesweeping operations. At 1533 anchored in Port Arthur.

Owing to unfavouable weather conditions remained at this anchorage until 0615/17th. Secured alongside Ocean Pier Hobart at 1055.

Remained alongside until 1105/25th, a boiler clean being carried out in the interum.

At 1610 anchored with Flotilla in Port Arthur.

Because of poor visibility and bad weather remained there until 1715 /28th when in company with Flotilla proceeded to minefield returning to anchorage at 1718. Remained at anchor until 0615/31 when with Flotilla departed for minefield.



0748/1st. Secured alongside Nelson Pier, Williamstown.

Slipped from alongside and at 1543 entered Williamstown Dry 1450. Dock. Remained in the dock until 1515/6th.

1540/6th. Secured alongside Nelson Pier.

Remained alongside until 1356/13th, when in company with remainder of the Flotilla, proceeded to minefield "Chaliapan Two". 1308/14th.Layed Datum Buoy Zi. At 1555 departed from minefield for Dover Island.

0430/15th.Sailed in company with H.M.A.S."BUNBURY" for minefield. 1810/15th.Left minefield with Flotilla and at 1935 anchored on the East coast of Flinders Island. Owing to bad weather conditions remained at this anchorage until 0200/17th, when in company with H.M.A.S. "BUNBURY" proceeded to minefield.

Due to adverse weather conditions anchored at 0700/18th, in anchorage

at Dover Island.

completely swept and then sailed for Melbourne.



Subject MONTHLY REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS JANUARY 1946

Submitted for the information of Naval Board. Remained alongside Village Point Jetty, Watsons Bay, Sydney on the 1st, and slipped at 2020/2nd, in company with H.M.A. Ships Swan, Bunbury and Cowra proceeded to minefield Killcastle Two.

Completed sweeping this minefield P.M. the 5th and departed with Flotilla for Sydney. Secured alongside Village Point Pier 0635/6th.

Remained alongside until 1345/9th. In company with Flotilla left for Waterloo Bay.

0920/11th Anchored at Waterloo Bay. Remained at anchor until 0315/14th, when in company with H.M.A.Ships Bunbury and Cowra departed to minefield "Chaliapan One" and layed Datum Buoy A7.

Carried out minesweeping operations on 14th and 15th and anchored in

Norman Bay 2005/15th.

Owing to bad weather remained at anchor until 1555/20th, when in company with remainder of Flotilla sailed for Melbourne.

0907/21st secured alongside Nelsons Pier Williamstown.

Slipped 1426/24th, and inncompany with Flotilla left for minefield. With H.M.A.Ships Bunbury and Cowra layed Datum Buoys and Dan Buoys for A Row and Z Row.

1910/25th Anchored in Waterloo Bay. Remained at anchor due to bad weather until0230/27th and returned to minefield. Continued operations until minefield "Chaliapan One" was completed. Anchored at night at Dover Island 1720/29th, left area and rejoined remainder of Flotilla at Sealers Cove. The 30th was spent at anchor and the opportunity was taken to renew and repair Dan Laying Equipment.

On the 23rd six additional Ordinary Seamen were drafted to the ship. This has made Dan Laying operations considerably easier, and enables some time to be spent on general ship's maintenance, which previously was neglected due to the amount of work necessary to maintain Dan gear effectively. 2105/31st sailed for Melbourne.



Remained alongside Village Point Sydney on the 1st and 2nd. At 1918/3rd.slipped and proceeded to carry out Dan-Laying exercises for 3 days with H.M.A. Ships Bunbury and Cowra anchoring at night at Broken Bay.

At 0407/7th- proceeding in company with H.M.A. Ships Bunbury and Cowra to the minefield to commence operation"Killcastle One"to lay the Datum Buoys. Remained at anchor on the 8th. and 9th. the time being spent in repairing and renewing danlaying equipment.

At 0405/10th. proceeded to the mine field and carried out danlaying operations until the 13th.when we returned to Sydney.

0632/13th. secured alongside at Village Point.

At 2154/15th. Slipped In company with H.M.A.Ships Swan, Bunbury and Cowra and proceeded to the minefield remaining there for the 16th. 17th. and 18th., dan-laying with the remainder of the sweepers.

1227/19th. anchored at Broken Bay due to bad weather. - At 0440/20th. proceeded to area "Killcastle Two!" with the remainder of the Flotilla. Carried out dan -laying operations until 1700/20th. when the Flotilla returned to Sydney and at 0747/21st. secured alongside Village Point Pier.



Report of Proceedings. July, '45.

Submitted for the information of the Naval Board.

Departed from Morotai at 0631/4th. escorting Morotai Bruni Convoy No. 1 consisting of USS "Jos'e Verela" (Commodore) & N.A. 12. Arrived off Zamboanga at 0936/6th. detached from convoy and anchored in roadstead. Departed Zamboanga at 1400/7th. sailing independently. Arrived Morotai at 0630/9th. and at 0800 proceeded to sea in company with H.M.A.S's "Hawkesbury". (Com. D.) "Mildura". "Bowen", "Latrobe", &"Cowra" and carried out H/A. 4" gun practise and fleet manouvers. Returned to Morotai at 1135 and refuelled ex Bishopdale, and then proceeded to A/S patrol at position Baker at 1411/9th. Relieved at Baker by H.M.A.S. "Bowen" at 1055/10th. & anchored off Platypas at 1118/12th. Departed Morotai at 0730/13th. escorting USS "Lavaca" APA 180" Detached from convoy in position 05°21' N 124°20' E at 0900/14th. and returned to Morotai independently arriving at 0808/15th. and refuelled ex "Bishopdale". Departed Morotai at 0900/16th. independently. Arrived in Humboldt Bay at 0650/19th. and refuelled ex "Arayat". Departed Humboldt Bay at 0903 19th. anchored in Madang Harbour at 1944k/20th. Departed Madang at 1612/21st. Arrived at Langemak at 1210/22nd. refuelled and departed Langemak at 1530/22nd. At 1555k deviated from course to assist survivors sighted on a waterlogged L.C.M. approximately 6 miles off the land. At 1605k lowered whaler and pocked up American soldier in the water who was attempting to swim from the L.C.M. to shore. He had travelled about 2 miles from the waterlogged LCM. I consider this soldier very "game" but extremely lucky. At 1630k closed derelect and took off 5 more soldier survivors. At 1646k sunk derelect by gunfire and proceeded inshore. at 1700/22nd. transferred survivers into a rescue launch and proceeded. Xat 1845/22nd. commenced search for 15 fathom shoal reported in vicinity of 06 40'S 148016'E. Gained numerous asdic shoal classifications but on running over contacts were not able to obtain bottom by fathometer or hand lead. At 2140 abandoned search and proceeded on voyage. At 1050/23rd. commenced search for 3-1/2 fathom shoal to the Eastward of Eve Shoal Buoy. Notice to Marines No. 70 refers. The area was thoroughly searched and I am of the opinion that this shoal does not exist. Abandoned search at 1408/23rd. and resumed voyage. On 25th. in vicinity of Bougainville Reef experienced abnormal S.E. set of about 2 to 3 Knots. & Arrived Townsville at 1330k/26th. Refuelled and stored shipp Departed Townsville at 1709/27th.





Weighed and proceeded from Moratai at 1500 lst. in company with H.M.A.S. "Mildura" and carried out an H.A. 4" practise

shoot on sleeve target. "Rendezvous" at 1820 1st. with convoy G.B. 755. S/8 "Richard Mocykowski (Commodore) and S/S "George Vancouver". Escorts H.M.A.S's

"Mildura" (S.O). "Ararat", & "Townsville".


Escorts detached from convoy at 1000 3rd. Anchored in Mios Woendi at 1830 3rd. Refuelled from "Villa Lobos" on 4th. At 1258 7th. weighed and proceeded to investigate a reported sighting of periscope off Owi Island. Obtained an A/S contact at 1405 in position 01°18'S. 135°15'E. Contact lost at 1430. H.M.A.S. "Kapunda" joined search. (My letter to Com. South West Pacific Sea Frontier dated 14th. May refers). Abandoned search at 1700/I. Anchored in Mios Woendi at 1809. Departed from Woendi at 0628/8th. escorting S/S "Matthew Flinders". Read prayers on VE day 9th. May. Entered Moratai at 0643/11th. and lead "Matthew Flinders' to anchorage. Relieved "Bundaberg" in position Baker at 0800/ 11th. "Bathurst" relieved me at position Baker at 1000/13th. Departed Moratai 1617 13th. escorting convoy G.B. 759 consisting of 10 L.S.T's. (Commodore in L.S.T. 775) and S/S "Edward Nickles" "John Ross" "Charles Tout" "Hoterlletysky" & "Thomas Coody". Escorts "Mildura" (S.O.) "Ararat" and "Junee". Escorts detached from convoy at 1642/15th. At 1710 15th. sunk a floating mine in position 00044'S. 135055'E. Arrived at Mios Woendi at 0610/16th. Refuelled from "Villa Lobos". Stored ship and departed Woendi at 1134/16th. Anchored in Sorido Lagoon at 1343/16th.

Departed from Biak at 1731/19th. escorting Convoy B.G. 540 "USAT Sea Ray" (Commodore) "Peter T. Rowe" & L.C.I. 73. Escorts "Mildura" (S.O.)

and "Ararat".

Arrived Morotai at 0654/22. Anchored off "Phatypus" at 0748 and commenced boiler cleaning period. At 1705/23rd. received orders from Commander (D) to raise steam. Submitted for the information of the Naval Board:

Weighed anchor in Cleveland Bay at 0934, 1st, and proceeded into port. Secured to Harbour Trust Whatf, Townsville, at 1010, 1st. Half of ship's company sent away at a time for recreational leave at Charters Rowers, for four days. Made one unsuccessful attempt to put ship on slipway at 0630, 10th, but due to docking party being unable to raise the rudder locking bar of the slipway, attempt had to be abandoned. On 11th, at 0700, ship was successfully slipped. At 0850, ship high and dry. At 0825,14th, commenced to lower ship down slipway. Ship water borne at 0910. At 1700, 16th, ship ordered to prepare for sea to go to assistance of S.S. "Subigo", disabled in Coral Sea. General recall of liberty men sent out and at 2000, 16th, ship slipped from berth and proceeded to sea with only two ratings missing. Due to high wind and heavy sea and swell took shelter in lee of Palm Islands, at 0100, 17th. Contracted leaky condenser tube trouble and returned to Townsville for repairs. Secured to wharf at 1326, 17th, and commenced to carry out repairs. Slipped from wharf at 0900, 19th, and proceeded to area of search for S.S. "Sabigo", E.S.E. of Grafton Passage. Arrived outer end of Grafton Passage at 2330, 19th, and commenced search. At 1310, 20th, received orders to proceed to pick up survivors from Douglas aircraft crashed 130 miles south of Port Moresby. Speed increased to 14 knots. At 1938, 20th, received orders to resume search for "Subigo". Reduced speed. At 12229, 21st, received orders to proceed to position 13° 31' S, 145° 03' E. and search for survivors of "Subigo". Increased speed to 14 knots. Arrived at forementioned position at 1000 22nd, and commenced to carry out thorough search. Reduced speed. At 1010, 23rd, located empty lifeboat in position 13° 49' S, 145° 25' E. No survivors. At 1603, 23rd., located second empty lifeboat in position 130 24' S, 145° 14' E. No survivors. At 2000 ship steaming on starboard engine due to condenser trouble.

At 0917, 24th, resumed steaming on two engines. At 1800, 24th, abandoned search as ordered by N.O.I.C. Townsville, and proceeded to Port Moresby for fuel and E.R. repairs. At 1423. 25th, secured to wharf, Port Moresby. Engine Room staff po opened up both condensers during stay in Moresby and tightened up all condenser tube ferruls, and tested same satisfactorily. Slipped from Moresby wharf at 1500 29th, and proceeded to sea in company with H.M.A.S. "Mildura". Detached from "Mildura" at 1325 31st, off Mitre Rock. Anchored off Lae at 2336, 31st.

The health of the ship's company has been very good. Four cases of dengue fever contracted whilst in Townsville were hospitalized in "Magnetic".

The conduct of the ship's company has been excellent. No disciplinary action was required during vessel's recreational period in Townsville, and under the circumstances of the ship having been in forward areas for nine months, I consider this exceptional.

Since last refitting in June, 1944, the ship has twice experienced condenser trouble but these had been satisfactorily overcome. However, during this last month this trouble has given rise to concern.

Departed from Woendi at 1445, 2nd, and anchored off Sorido Roads at 1705, 2nd. On 3td February, embarked 2 RAAF ratings and approximately 2 tons of RAAF gear for Moratai. Departed from Sorido at 1430, 4th, escorting convoy No. B.G. 513 consisting of U.S.S. "Carlos Carillo" (Commodore), "West Texas", "E.C. Gardiner", "Noora". Escorts H.M.A.Ss "Ararat(S.O.) and "Kapunda". At 1300,7th, convoy entered Moratai Roads. Anchored off Naval wharf Moratai at 1320, and disembarked RAAF personnel and gear. Anchored in position ABLE and assumed A/S. guard. At 2245, 8th, streamed a grass-line to a sailing canoe containing three U.S. Flying Officers. The wind had dropped and the canoe as being swiftly carried out to sea by the tide. At 2330, cance secured alongside. Officers givena shakedown for the night. Departed from Seeadler Harbour at 1702, 31st Dec. Arrived in Mios Woendi at 1507, 3rd Jan. Departed Woendi at 0904, 5th, and anchored off Sorido at 1144, 5th. At 1307, 7th, weighed and proceeded with Convoy No. B.G. 509; S.S. "Thomas Corwin" (Commodore), and S.S. "C.W. Pasley". Escorts H.M.A.Ss. Cootamundra (S.O.E.), Stawell and Ararat. Arrived off Moratai at 0845, 10th, and followed convoy into harbour. Assumed A/S. guard at position Baker at 0942, 10th. At 0315, 11th, Red Warning. Closed up at Action Stations. 

OCTOBER, 1944.

Submitted for the Anformation of the Naval Board.

At 1615 on 5th Oct., weighed and proceede to sea to escort S.S. "Hinton. R. Helper". On passing through boom entrance I received a signal directing me to join D.E. 202 as he had a sub. contact while on A/S. patrol off the entrance. In company with D.E. 202 and later with H.M.A.S. "Hawkesbury", carried out a square search at 15 knots. At 2150 was ordered to detach from search and proceeded to rendezvous position, 00° 43' S. 149° 10' E. Effected rendezvous with Task Unit 31/5/4 at 1513 6th Oct. Ships K117 Commodore), K 121, K 75, and K 107 detached from Task Unit at 1615 and H.M.A.S. "Ararat" assumed escort for these ships to Manus. Convoy entered Seeadler Harbour at 0600, 7th Oct. Entered Seeadler Harbour at 0613. Weighed at 1600 on 10th Oct., and proceeded to carry out an A/S. patrol in the approaches to Seeadler Harbour. Was relieved of patrol at 1840, 12th Oct and proceeded to rendezvous position 2° 52' S. 148° 15' E. Effected rendezvous with U.S. Submarine "Pollock" at 0420, 13th, and proceeded to escort same in a westerly direction. Detached from submarine at 1700, 13th, and course set for Kaniet Islands.

Approached Kaniet Islands from the west at 0400, 14th. Circumnavigated the islands, and at 0600 landed an armed party under the command of Lieut. E.C. Jeanes consisting of ten ratings and two officers, to comply with orders received to search for a suspected Japanese Radio Location. H.M.A.S. "Ararat" stood"close combing inland of the largest island and H.M.A.S. "Ararat" proceeded to investigate Sae Islands, 15 miles to the N-W. Completed investigation of Sae Islands at 1310 with negative results. Landing party returned to ship at 1700, to report no signs of Japanese occupation. Whilst wading across the reefs the party was attacked by sea snakes and sharks and when investigating native huts they were attacked by wild boars. No casualties occurred, but the party was naturally exhausted after tramping 10 miles with arms and ammunition in jungle areas.

Arrived at Seeadler Harbour at 0505, 15th, and refuelled. Departed from Seeadler Harbour at 1155, 17th en route to Madang to pick up new A/S. oscillator. Anchored in Madang at 0860, 18th. At 2310, on 18th, weighed and proceeded at full speed to the assistance of H.M.A.S. "Geelong" At 0825, 19th, in position 05° 56' N. 147° 31' E passed through floating debris consisting of French Float, dan buoy spar and pellets, rafts and timber. No sign of damaged vessel in given position of accident at 1030. Proceeded to carry out a sweeping search towards Langemak. At 1243 was informed by American P.C. boat that H.M.A.S. "Geelong" had sunk, all hands saved. Proceeded to Langemak. Arrived at Langemak at 1420, 19th. Departed from Langemak at 0520, 20th, with eight officers and sixty-four ratings ex H.M.A.S. "Geelong" on passage. Anchored in Madang Harbour at 1700, 20th, and disembarked personnel. Departed from Madang at 1220, 21st. Arrived in Seeadler Harbour at 1000, 22nd. Departed from Seeadler Harbour at 1722, 22nd en route to Ninigo Islands to pick up natives reputedly short of food. Lieut. Booker (A.N.G.A.U.) embarked. Anchored off Longan Island, Ninigo, at 1000 23rd, Lieut. Booker and landing party proceeded ashore. The party returned at 1330 with information that natives not in Ninigo Group, but on Hermit Islands. Weighed at proceeded at 1555. Anchored off Maron Island, Hermit Group, at 0625, 24th. At 0725 motor boat and shore party proceeded to Luf Island to pick up native survivors, who arrived on island in a native canoe, 22nd. Motor boat returned at 1005 with native survivor who on interrogation stated that his name was "Natava" (?). He and two other natives set out from Ocean Island 1500 miles away, to get away from the Japanese. One of the natives died from exposure, and the other one was taken from the canoe by sharks. Natava stated that he had been "seven moons" on passage. He was very weak and in an emaciated condition. Medical attention was given him and he was then placed in care of A.N.G.A.U.

Weighed and proceeded at 1528, 24th. Arrived at Seeadler Harbour at 0512, 25th, and disembarked natives at 0700. At 1622 of 26th, passed through boom gate with convoy consisting of U.S.S. "Naos", (Commodore), "Arided", U.S.C.G. "Mintaka", and S.S. "Weltevreden". Escorts H.N.A.S. "Ararat" (S.O.E.) and S.C. 750. Arrived off Kossol Passage, Palau Islands, at 0645, 31st. Detached from convoy who entered passage. Entered Kossol Passage at 0808, refuelled and watered. Anchored at 1658.

At 1430/i 2nd Sept., weighed and proceeded to sea to rendez-vous with convoy, and at 1542/i sailing orders postponed. Returned to Secadler and anchored at 1616/i. Weighed and proceeded at 1434/1, 3rd Sept. Rendesvous with convoy at 1540/i, consisting of "Jacques LARAMIE" (Commodore), and "MANCY HAMKS". At 2105/i, 4th Sept., the steering gear jammed. 



Jan. and tanker escorted and piloted back to Milne Bay. Arrived at Milne Bay 1710L 3rd. Jan. and refuelled. Departed from Milne Bay at 0800L 5th. Jan. and proceeded to patrol area off Brumer Island and releived H.M.A.S. "STAWELL". Exercised 4" guns crew at 1700L 7th. Jan. fired 5 rounds A.A. shoot. Sighted S.S. "CAPE GEEY" at 07351 8th.
