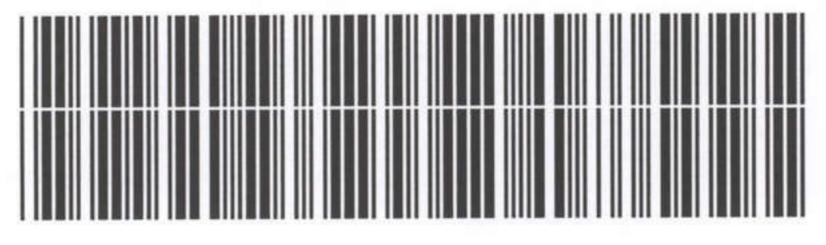

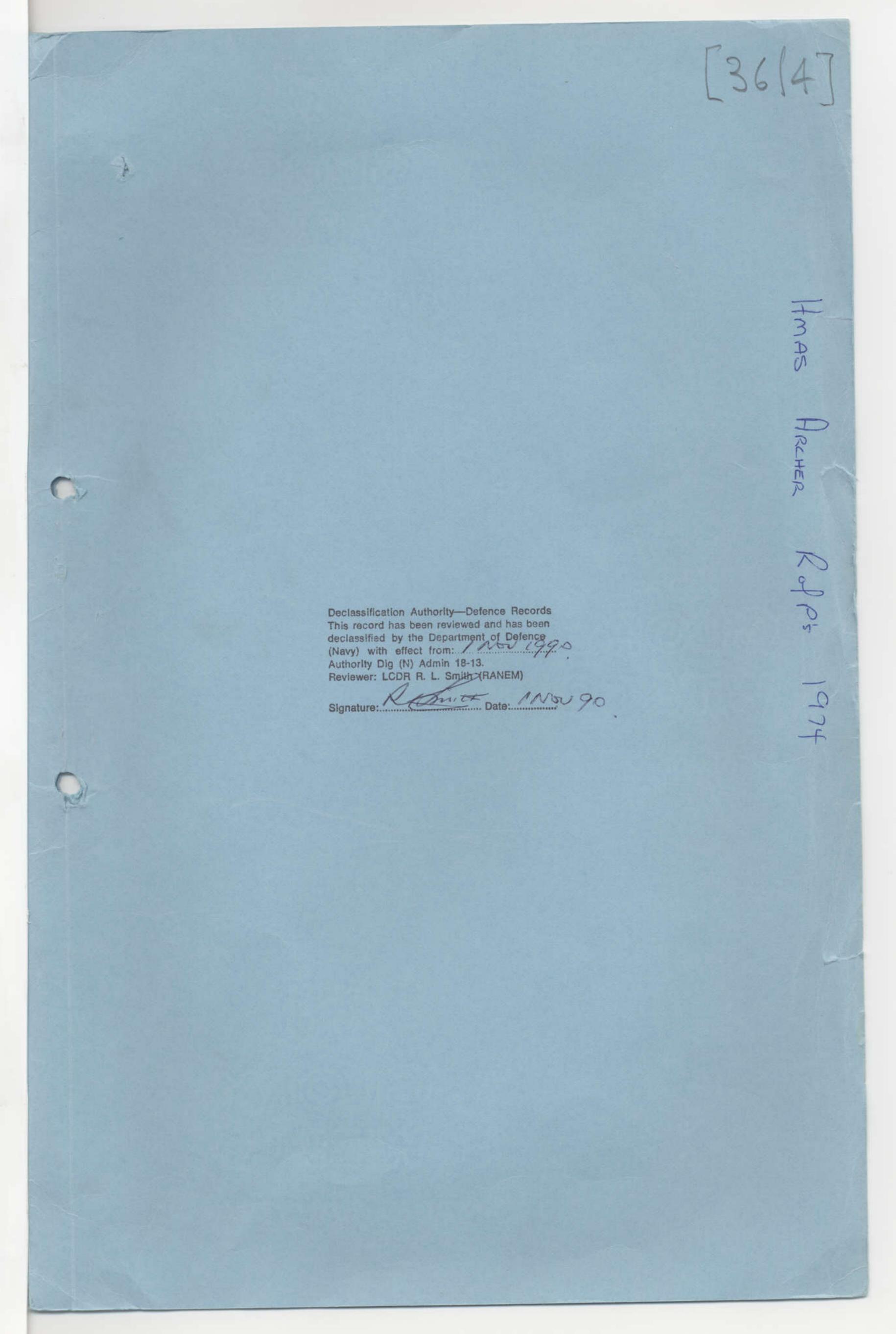

#### HMAS ARCHER - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - FEBRUARY 1974

- 1. Self maintenance was carried out during the weekend 2/3 February, and members of the Seaman Division RANR also maintained ARCHER each Thursday evening during the month.
- Under the command of LCDR P. BALLESTY, a training cruise was conducted in the Botany Bay/Broken Bay area on 9 and 10 February. Seamanship instruction was given to the recruits and in addition to routine exercises, lectures were given to the crew on the 8 man life raft, life jackets and fire fighting equipment.
- During the weekend 16/17 February the ship under the command of LCDR A.M. WHYBROW carried out a training cruise in the Broken Bay/Port Kembla area. On the Saturday a 40/60 surface firing was successfully conducted for the RANR ABQMG qualifying class. Having returned firing personnel to HMAS WATERHEN, the ship continued passage to Port Kembla and secured alongside on Saturday evening.
- 4. On 23 and 24 February the ship under the command of LCDR BALLESTY carried out a training cruise in the Broken Bay/ Botany Bay area.
- The ship was manned and used by HMAS WATERHEN personnel on Thursday 28 February in company with HMAS BOMBARD as part of the refit work-up for HMAS ARDENT.
- One injury was reported during the period. On Sunday 17 February SMNMT2 HOPWOOD, AlOlO85, suffered severe bruising to his left ankle when it became caught in the bight of a berthing line on departing Port Kembla.

#### HMAS ARCHER - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - MARCH 1974

- 1. The ship, manned by HMAS WATERHEN personnel, and in company with HMAS BOMBARD took part in HMAS ARDENT's post refit work-up on the 1st and 4th March.
- 2. During the weekend 2nd/3rd March self maintenance was carried out and on Saturday 9th March a static training day was conducted for the New Entry Division.
- Under the command of LCDR P. BALLESTY RANR the ship carried out a training day on the 10th March in the Sydney/Broken Bay area as a work-up for ACT 1/74. Subsequently and during the period 17th-29th March ACT 1/74 was conducted. Initially the ship exercised with other units of the fleet in the Jervis Bay area then visits were made to Port Stephens, Coffs Harbour and Newcastle. The planned visit to Ballina was cancelled as the port was closed because of weather conditions.
- 4. The conduct of the ship's company was satisfactory during the month and no injuries were reported.

#### REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - ACT 1/74 17 MARCH - 29 MARCH, 1974.

- 1. The following is a report of proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the thirteen day ACT 1/74.
- 2. HMAS ARCHER sailed from HMAS WATERHEN at 1000K and following an uneventful passage in unsettled weather conditions entered Jervis Bay at 1700K. At 1710K a signal was received from the Marine Section, HMAS CRESWELL requesting ARCHER to rendevous with the merchant ship MARINGA at 1800K, to take over the tow of the yatch METUNG. No position was indicated, and when further particulars were sought, the request was withdrawn. The ship secured alongside the south-east SAR wharf at 1720K.
- 3. On Monday 18th March, the ship's company engaged in full scale fire fighting exercises at the HMAS ALBATROSS fire grounds, and received excellent instruction and demonstration of ILR and Helo winching procedures. At 1500K the ship sailed for ship handling exercises. The boat was lowered, and with the aid of Telecon communications, OCW manoeuvres were conducted. ARCHER returned to her borth at 1800K to embark a 1500K tow line (Williams Target). During the preceding manoeuvres, a noise was reported in the port propeller shaft. Investigations by the charge ERA and external inspection by SBLT RAPER (Diving Officer) and SMN DVR STEWART, disclosed no obvious damage.
- 4. An FTG Observation team was embarked early on Tuesday 19, and the ship slipped at 0730K to take the Williams Target intow and proceed to the appointed exercise area. Upon completion of the SUTF by HMA Ships SWAN and PERTH, ARCHER returned to Jervis Bay where to target was passed to a work boat and the tow line recovered. The ship then berthed outboard of HMAS BOMBARD and the tow line was passed to that ship. During the afternoon ARCHER began to experience communication difficulties when first the 696 Power Pack and later the ANURK both became U/S.
- The operations of recovering and transferring the 1500% tow line proved to be most time consuming and consequently HMAS ARCHER was considerably delayed in journey HMAS SWAN for the next serial (Boardex). The delay was further complicated by ARCHER's lack of UMF communication, resulting in the need for protracted and, no doubt for SWAN, frustrating visual communication. The Boardex was however eventually completed and proved to be a most interesting and instructive exercise for ALL participants.

- 6. At 1800K ARCHER joined forces with HMAS BOMBARD and took part in Kemarex striker against HMA Ships SWAN, PERTH and HOBART. ARCHER's activities in the 4 hour war were restricted due to the lack of the communications, and the fact that one of the Macchi aircraft (missile) was unable to take part in the second STYX attack. At 2200K when the serial closed, ARCHER was in the process of launching a simulated torpedo attack. The attack was aborted and ARCHER returned to her berth.
- 7. In company with Bombard, the ship sailed at 0830K Wednesday 20 and took part in 00W manoeuvres until such time as Bombard detached for other duties. ARCHER continued exercising independantly and proceeded on a SE course to conduct a small arms shoot. On completion the ship returned to the JB area to prepare for the next serial. During the morning the echo-sounder became U/S, whilst on the credit side, repairs had been effected to the ANURE Efforts to obtain a replacement valve for the echo-sounders from CRESWELL and BOMBARD, proved to be unsuccessful.
- 8. At 1630Z the ship entered JB and approached the Montagu Roads DISTEX location. Following challenges by SWAN and PERTH, ARCHER was boarded by HMAS SWAN and subjected to search and interrogation as suspected gun runners. Once again this proved to be a most valuable training exercise and as an added bonus, SWAN kindly supplied the replacement valve to rectify the echo sounder defect.
- 9. POCMG STARK (HMAS NIRIMBA) joined the ship at 0800K Thursday 21 and ARCHER sailed in company with BOMBARD to complete AA tracking and firing exercises. BOMBARD then streamed a Larne target which unfortunately disappeared when the tow parted. Following an unsuccessful search for the wayward target, ARCHER laid a makeshift stationery target and conducted a surface short independantly for the remainder of the serial. After further OOW manoeuvres including a formation anchorage, ARCHER returned alongiste the Marine Section to re fuel. At this time news was received of the death of CAMTP TAYLOR's mother—in—law, and in addition the serious illness of his 3 month old grand-daughter. Chief TAYLOR phoned Sydney and subsequently expressed his wish to stay with the ship. LCDR R.O. ALBERT, RLEX disembarked to return to HMAS WATSON, and ARCHER sailed at 1700K for passage to Ballina.
- 10. Upon receipt of a signal from DEFNAV Canberra (210801Z), lookouts were alerted and suitably briefed at 0724K Friday 22, the missing trimaran (SNAFU) was sighted off Port Stephens, and ARCHER closed to investigate. The crew reported that they were in no difficulty and did not require assistance. However, they were informed of the concern for their whereabouts/safety, and in view of the repidly deteriorating weather conditions, altered course for Port Stephens/Fingal Bay.
- sighted further to seaward. This incident, which is fully detailed in Appendix IV, resulted in ARCHER towing the fishing trawler "CAREEL" into Port Stephens. Subsequently, ARCHER sailed from Port Stephens at 1500K to find that the weather had worsened considerably. (Wind 060 FORCE 5/6-VISIBILITY POOR short steep sea, large swell). In view of the recent forecasts for the northern coast it was considered unlikely that the port of Ballina would be open, and, due to the lack of suitable shelter from the NE, it was considered prudent to return to the Salamander Bay buoy for the night. RO MURTAGH who was unwell as a result of an infected lesion on the face, was landed for medical attention.

- 12. ARCHER slipped from the buoy at 0630K Saturday 23 and sailed for Coffs Harbour. The conditions whilst still uncomfortable had moderated, and receipt of COMAUSFLT signal 222140Z confirmed the previous evenings doubts regarding the state of the Ballina bar. Following an exciting entry to Coffs Harbour in a large NE swell, the ships boat was lowered in order to sound the entrance to the boat harbour and the berthing facilities within. As a result of this exercise, ARCHER entered the enclosure and secured to dolphins at the SE end at 1815K. A separate report concerning this berth will be submitted later, together with photographs and survey details.
- 13. LCK DUGGAN, who had taken a fall in the galley shortly before entering Coffs Harbour, was escorted to the local hospital for examination and x-ray (left hand). Fortunately the injury proved to be torn ligaments rather than the suspected broken bones. A phone call to Ballina confirmed the closure of the bar due to the heavy swell and the effects of prolonged flooding in the area. It was decided to grant leave to the ship's company on Sunday 24/Monday 25 and sail at 0600K Tuesday 26 for Newcastle.
- 14. On Tuesday 26, the weather had shifted to the SSE and the passage to Newcastle was accomplished in most unpleasant conditions (a short steep sea on a heavy swell). ARCHER entered Newcastle Harbour at 1715K and secured to the Merewether Street Wharf at 1740K. The following morning the ship's company accepted the challenge of a Volley Ball match from the crew of the RAAF SAR base. ARCHER's lads battled valiantly against a more experienced team and did nt quite win.
- 15. ARCHER sailed from Newcastle at 1000K Thursday 28, and proceeded, in unusually pleasant conditions, to an area 15 miles off the coast where a small arms shoot was conducted. On completion, the ship continued passage to Broken Bay. A partially submerged object was sighted prior to entry into Broken Bay and the boat was lowered for closer investigation. The object proved to be a rather hefty 15ft log which was hoisted aboard for later disposal ashore. The ship anchored in the vicinity of Little Shark Rock Point and a ship's company banyan was held in the evening.
- Mas induced by juggling water and fuel loads, and the ship was completely blacked-out. The normal hatches to both forward and after messes were barred by the Charge ERA And XO in the capacity of observers. It is pleasing to record that, whilst every effort had been made to simulate realism, the ship's company reacted in a most commendable manner. Senior hands took charge, there was no panic or confusion, torches appeared, life jackets were used by all, and all members of the crew were quickly accounted for at their leaving ship stations. Indeed the emergency escape hatch in the after mess was opened within 30 seconds of the initial alarm.
- 17. ARCHER weighed anchor at 0700K Friday 29 and proceeded to Port Jackson, berthing alongside the OFL HMAS WATERHEN at 1000K. The ship was refueled, and destoring and cleaning was commenced. Upon completion of fueling, the ship was finally secured outboard of Buccaneer at the patrol boat wharf, where payment of the ship's company was conducted and cleaning/destoring was completed. The last of the ship's company finally departed at 1600K.

18. The ship's company performed all duties in a most able manner. Their enthusiasm, morale and general conduct was of the very highest order. Despite the fact that the majority of the weather was most unsuitable to patrol boat operations, seasickness was kept to a minimum and the only accident reported was of a minor nature.

#### REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS 17-29 MARCH 1974

#### REPORT OF INCIDENT 22/3/74

At 0724K Friday 22 HMAS ARCHER sighted the missing trimaran SNAFU (refer DEFNAV Canberra 210801Z). Having investigated the craft and ascertained it required no assistance, the ship was about to resume passage to Ballina when a red flare was sighted to seaward. ARCHER proceeded with all despatch and contacted the fishing trawler "CAREEL" ex Broken Bay in position 117 TR Conspic 7.4 miles (Port Stephens).

Weather conditions at the time were very unsettled with wind Force 4/6. 050 - 060, swell 10 - 12 ft..., sea 4 ft., and visibility varying dependent upon rain squalls.

ARCHER manoeuvred to windward of the trawler and communication was established via loud-hailer. "CAREEL", when asked if she was in difficulty replied that her engines had broken down and requested a tow. EMAS ARCHER then withdrew a short distance and a towline was prepared. At this time a violent rain squall passed over the area and conditions were decidedly unpleasant. ARCHER was manoeuvred to within 30 ft. of "CAREEL" and a heaving line was landed on her after deck. However due to the rough conditions "CAREEL's" crew were unable to secure the line, and ARCHER again withdrew. On the second approach, the ship was manoeuvred within 20 ft. of the trawler and this time a heaving line straddled hear cabin and was seized by the crew. A towline was passed and successfully secured aboard "CAREEL".

ARCHER proceeded to tow the trawler into Port Stephens to the vicinity of Nelsons Bay wharf. Once in the protected waters of the bay, "CAREEL" was brought alongside and ARCHER's Charge ERA boarded her. It was reported that she was on passage from Lord Howe Island to Broken Bay and had been experiencing engine difficulty for sometime prior to her final breakdown. OF "CAREEL's" engine disclosed that her fuel injectors were u/s and that she had only 4 gallons of fuel remaining.

The crew of four men and one girl were in good health, however they had run out of fresh provisions. Some bread, fruit etc. were provided from ARCHER.

"CAREEL" was then taken alongside the Nelsons Bay wharf by one of the local fishing boats, in order that repairs might be effected.

At no time during the encounter was the subject of salvage or charge raised by either party.

It is reported with regret that no photographic record of the incident was obtained.

- On the weekend of 4th and 5th May the ship under the command of LCDR RLEX K.D. Murphie carried out a training exercise in the Sydney Harbour/Terrigal/Broken Bay area. A surface 40/60 shoot was to have been carried out during the Saturday forencon but the weather forecast was unpromising and a self-maintenance period was carried out alongside instead. During the forencon gun drill and gun maintenance instruction was given by a PNF POQMG. Harbour running was carried out during Saturday afternoon and NAVEX ship handling and other exercises were carried out at sea on Sunday, the weather having moderated.
- 2. On Thursday 16th May the ship was manned and used by HMAS WATERHEN personnel for a CO's PCT training.
- On the weekend of 18th and 19th May self-maintenance was carried out.
- 4. On Saturday 25th May the ship carried out a day run in the Sydney area under the command of LCDR RLEX A.M. Whybrow as a work-up for ACT 2/74. #### Report of Proceedings for A.C.T. 2/74.

- I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command from 3rd to 16th June, 1974 for Annual Continuous Training Cruise No. 2/74. All times throughout this report are in Zone (-10).
- 2. The ship's or iginal programme was altered to enable participation in Exercise Kangaroo One.
- The Sydney Port Division RANR was unable to fill all billets and assistance was received from HMAS DUCHESS, HMAS WATERHEN and the RAN Emergency Reserve.
- 4. The ship's company joined on Sunday 2nd June for the purpose of completing joining routines, storing and generally preparing the ship for sea.

At 1044 the following day (3rd June) HMAS ARCHER (as OTC) with HMAS BOMBARD and HMAS BUCCANEER incompany, sailed from HMAS WATERHEN. Onclearing Sydney Heads rough seas and a heavy easterly swell were encountered and it was decided to seek shelter in Broken Bay. Ships anchored off Hallets Beach at 1340. The following day all ships moved to Yeomans Bay to escape an unpleasant swell.

The existing and forecast weather conditions for northern waters indicated that it could be several days before conditions

were satisfactory for the passage of Patrol Boats.

- 7. All ships weighed and proceeded at 1415 on 6th June for passage to Gladstone. Conditions at sea were comfortable with a long low south-easterly swell.
- At 0755 on the mprning of 7th June, during 00W manoeuvers, ARCHER suffered a fractured fuel line on the starborad engine. A replacement part was passed from BUCCANEER by heaving line transfer and the necessary repairs made. During the afternoon Exercise Stationmaster was carried out.
- 9. After an otherwise uneventful passage, the formation passed the Port Curtis Fairway Buoy at 1330 on Saturday 8th June, securing starboard side to Auckland Point Wharf No. 2 at 1445.
- 10. The Night Encounter Exercise originally planned to take place during the early hours of 5th June between HMAS ADROIT, and ARCHER, BOMBARD and BUCCANEER did not eventuate due to the delayed sailing of the Sydney based ships.
- In response to instructions received from CTG 329.7 (Commander J.M. Yates RAN) to rendezvous at Keppel Island at 0700 on 10th June, it was decided to sail from Gladstone at 1100 on 9th June and remain at the island over night. However ships did not cast off and proceed until 1130. The delay was due to arranging for two sailors from ARCHER who had suffered minor injuries ashore the previous night, to return to Sydney by air as they had been declared unfit for sea duty.
- 12. The passage to Keppel Island was uneventful and the formation anchored in an unnamed bay on the north-east corner (23 10'S 150 59'E) at 1725.
- 13. HMAS ADROIT and HMAS BAYONET anchored the next morning and following a Commanding Officers' briefing, CTG 329.7 transferred from ADROIT to ARCHER.
- At 1200 (10th June) ARCHER, BOMBARD and BUCCANEER weighed and preceded in company for the exercise area. Shortly after, BUCCANEER reported a defect on her port engine and consequently BOMBARD was detached and ordered to proceed independently to the patrol area. As the defect could not be rectified, BUCCANEER was detached to return to Gladstone, leaving ARCHER to proceed alone.
- 15. Whilst on passage to her designated area, ARCHER was shadowed by a Tracker aircraft and attacked by a Sky Hawk fighter. Attacks against surface ships were made during the night before proceeding to the rendezvous at 23°17'S 151°49'E where the ship anchored at 0710 on 11th June.
- ARCHER, ADROIT, BOMBARD and BAYONET all anchored at the rendezvous and were joined by HMAS BARRICADE at 1220. CTG 329.7, who had now transferred to BOMBARD, held a briefing for that evening's operations in the North Reef/Capricorn Channel area.
- 17. During the previous evenings exercise ARCHER's main H.F. transmitter became unserviceable. Whilst at the rendezvous,

assistance was received from BOMBARD and the defect rectified. (My DWK 122210Z Jun 74 to COMAUSFLT and COMAUSMINPABFOR refers)

- 18. Ships were to sail from the anchorage at various times throughout the afternoon of 11th June, and ARCHER weighed and proceeded at 1500 to meet exercise requirements. Various attacks were made that afternoon and evening from 1550 to 1940 at which time course was set for return to Gladstone via North Reef. The passage was uneventful and the ship passed the Fairway Buoy at 0140 on 12th June and anchored off South Trees Point in Port Curtis at 0240.
- 19. All ships weighed and proceeded to Auckland Point Wharf No. 2 at 0815 (12th June) where ARCHER secured starboard side to outboard of BUCCANEER and BOMBARD at 0857.
- 20. Details of ARCHER's participation in Exercise Kangaroo One are submitted under cover of letter dated 21st June, 1974.
- 21. All ships remained in Gladstone overnight with BARRICADE, BOMBARD, BUCCANEER and BAYONET sailing at 0600 on 13th June.
- It was originally intended that ARCHER should sail from Gladstone on 12th June however this was delayed by existing and forecast weather conditions and ARCHER cast off and proceeded in company with ADROIT at 1000 on 13th June.
- On passage gunnery firings were held as shown in Annex B. Otherwise the passage to Broken Bay was uneventful, although weather conditions and the ship's continuous pitching over the last thirty hours made conditions on board fairly unpleasant. However, it did not become necessary to seek shelter and the ship came to anchor in Refuge Bay (Broken Bay) at 1250 on Saturday 15th June.
- The following morning (16th June) weighed and proceeded for Sydney at 0745. Being the end of ARCHER8s commission in the Royal Australian Naval Reserve, a paying-off pennant was flown for entry into Sydney Harbour. The ship secured starboard side to alongside HMAS WATERHEN at 1000, and after completion of destoring and cleaning, was decommissioned at 1645.
- 25. Apart from the broken fuel line and radio defect mentioned previously, all machinery, electrical and electronic equipment functioned satisfactorily.
- 26. Morale on board was high and apart from minor injuries, the medical state of all on board was good.
- 27. As this was the final A.C.T. cruise for the Sydney Port Division RANR in ARCHER, it was fortunate to be able to participate in Exercise Kangaroo One. The knowledge and experience gained by acting in company, being OTC on passage to Gladstone and taking part in the biggest maritime exercise held in Australian waters gave immense satisfaction to all on board and hopefully demonstrated that the required standards could be method by an RANR manned Patrol Boat. It can only be hoped that many such

/opportunities
