SUBJECT: REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1945.

Submitted in accordance with NO 97/43 and CCNO 19/45.

2. From 1 to 7 November we lay alongside at Biak with the exception of a one day trip to Mios Woendi on the 6th.

3. At 0630I 17 we proceeded in company with an ASR Crash boat toManok-wari - the C.O. N.E.I. 120 Squadron inspected and photographed a Dutch pilot's grave. We anchored in Manokwari Hr. overnight and returned to Biak 1800 the following day.

4. From 18 to 28 we lay alongside excepting one trip to Mios Woendi on 20th.

5. 0630 28 we proceeded on ASR exercises, anchoring off Japen Is. at night and returning to Biak 1700 following day. Returning from Japen we picked up a native about four miles from land - he was clinging to a badly damaged au and was too exhausted to wave to us. Fortunately we had a US Army doctor onboard - he treated the native and on reaching Biak handed him over to NICA.

6. The last day of the month we lay alongside.

7. The health of the ships company is good, morale fair.

8. Fire drills were carried out regularly - all pyrofoam extinguishers were expended and refilled. One C.O.2 ext. wastreplaced byea recently tested extinguisher of the same type. The engine room C.O.2 extinguishers are overdue for testing.





SUBJECT: REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - OCTOBER, 1945.

Submitted in accordance with N.O. 97/43 and C.C.N.O.19/45.

- From the 1st to the 13th we lay alongside the A.S.R. Base in Binnen Harbour, Madang. On the 2nd we slipped to pick up two R.A.A.F. men who had capsized a lakator, and on the 10th we proceeded on one hour's trial to run our main engines.
- At 1000 on the 13th we commenced on our passage to Biak, anchoring overnight at Potsdam Harbour and arriving Wewak 1200 14th. Departed Wewak 0600 15th and secured Hollandia that afternoon. We were delayed in Hollandia because fuel was hard to obtain and, I understand, becoming scarce. Sailed 0800 21st and anchored overnight at Wakde Island. Proceeded early next morning for Biak but experienced engine trouble and had to proceed on one engine, making Mois Woendi anchorage just before nightfall next morning we departed for Biak arriving there 1200 the same day.
- Spare rocker arm for port motor was received a.m. 26th trials were carried out the same day and proved successful.
- P.M. 26th a storm broke out and we proceeded to Mios Woendi next morning for shelter. The weather and seas had abated by the 30th so we returned to Biak and were laying alongside there on the last day of the month.
- The health of the ships company is good, but their morale only fair. The cause for the latter is due to the lack of operational activity.
- 7. Fire drills were carried out regularly during the month all equipment is in good gondition

- Main engines Rocker arm on the port engine cracked and has been replaced. Oil fumes are excaping from the starbd engine through forward crankshaft bearing defect is not considered serious. Both engines running satisfactory.





HONTHEY REPORT OF PROCEEDING - SEPTEMBER, 1945. SUBJECT

Submitted in accordance with No. 97/43 and G.C.W.O. 19/45.

We sailed from Biak Island AM 1st. September and secured alongside at Wakai Island late that afternoon - slipped first light the following morning and arrived Hollandianat 1200 the same day. Departed Hollandia AM 4th and anchored Wewak Harbour late in the 36A afternoon. Proceeded 1200 5th for Hansa Bay, anchoring there PM same day, and departed for Alexishafen Am the following morning arriving then In that day.

From the 7th to the 20th we were udergoing a 500 hour overhaul and fourteen additional defects were attended to at Alexishaten Coastal Craft Repair Base - the work was carried out efficiently and to my entire satisfaction.

Proceeded to Madang A.M. 21st and anchored at 111th A.S.R. Base, Binnen Harbour,

AM 23rd we proceeded to sea in company with "Air Faith" and exercised 'Communications' - the exercises were satisfactory and we returned to Madang PM the same day.

6. AM 24th we proceeded to Alexishaden and had several minor defects attended to; returned to Binner Harbour AM 27th and remained their till the end of the month.

The health and morale of the ships company are satisfactory. 74

Fire drills were carried out regularly during the month. 8.





REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF AUGUST 1945. SUBJECT

Submitted in accordance with N.O. 97/43 and C.C.N.O. 19/45.

- On the first day of the month we proceeded at 0600 on an A.S.R. operation off Manokwari and returned to Biak late the following afternoon.
- From the 3rd to the 7th we lay alongside at Biak having the W/T and a faulty distributor attended to.
- We proceeded to Middleburg early on the 8th and arrived there P.M. 9th - we secured to the stern of M.V. "WANAKA" as there is no safe or even suitable anchorage for a small craft and there is no buoy to secure to.
- The guns' crews had good practice strafing the mainland 5. adj acent to Middleburg on the 11th.
- A.M. 23rd we returned to Biak for the safety of the ship. 6.
- We had laid a buoy on the 19th and were secured to it when she dragged at 0440 23rd in a force 7 wind and a heavy sea. The anchorages are deep coral shelves, unsheltered and definitely dangerous and unsuitable for a light craft with a rope anchor line. I did not know how long the wind and seas would last so instead of laying off I returned to Biak whilst I had sufficient fuel. We arrived in Biak midday the 24th.
- From the 24th to the 31st, we lay at Biak undergoing 8. repairs to the W/T.
- 9. Action stations and fire drills were satisfactory.
- Health and morale of the ship's company remains very 10. satisfactory.

- Slipped 0630 4th. and proceeded to WEWAR arriving there late the same date. 0700 the following day we sailed and arrived at ALTAPE that afternoon left ALTAPE at 0500 6th. and entered HOLLANDIA at midday the same day. After having repairs made to W/I we slipped 1100 8th. and arrived TANAH MERAH BAI p.m. that afternoon and proceeded next day to BAR at 0400 arriving there p.m. the same day.






