Submitted, during the month of June, 1946, H.M.A.S.
"AIR VIEW" was based at Thursday Island until 28th. From
28th to 30th, "AIR VIEW" was in passage from Thursday Island
to Townsville.

- 2. Ship was at one hour's notice from 1st to 28th.
- 3. (a) On 11th and 12th May, "AIR VIEW" conducted two searches at the request of Officer Commanding Torres Straits Light Infantry and the Administrator, Torres Straits. Both searches were for five natives lost in passage between Thursday Island and Badu.
- (b) Store runs were made to Booby Island and Red Island Point on 7th and 13th and 22nd and 26th respectively.
- 4. Fire-drill was carried out on 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th and results were of good standard.
- 5. The conduct and morale of the crew are excellent.
- 6. Compassionate leave was granted to one rating during the month.
- 7. The health of the ship's company is satisfactory.
- 8. "AIR VIEW" left Thursday Island at 0515K 28th June, and arrived Cooktown at 1400K 30th June. Whilst on passage, H.M.A.S. "BINGERA" was passed at 1020K 29th, whilst H.M.A.S. "SPRIGHTLY" and 3 vessels in tow were sighted at 1022K. At 1105K, MT "BRITISF POWER" and at 1155K S.S. "BULIMBA" were passed. At 1018K on 30th MT "PORT RESPECT" was passed.

Submitted:-

During the month of May, 1946, H.M.A.S. "AIR VIEW" was on passage from Townsville to Red Island Point from 1st to 7th, and then from 7th to 9th and 15th to 31st was based at Red Island Point for A.S.R. duties. From 9th to 15th the ship was undergoing a minor refit.

- 2. Ship was at one hours notice from 7th to 13th and 14th to 31st.
- 3. (a) On 6th May, 1946, "AIR VIEW" was aground in position 11 degrees 58.4 minutes South, 143 degrees 14.2 minutes East for a period 1f 17 hours 52 minutes. Report has been forwarded.
- (b) Store runs were made to Thursday Island on 19th and 20th, 23rd and 24th, and on 25th and 26th one passenger run was made.
- 4. Ship was slipped at Thursday Island Naval Yard on 13th for 24 hours, for inspection of possible underwater damage sustained during grounding. Report has been forwarded.
- 5. Fire drill was carried out on 10th, 18th and 25th and results obtained were of a good standard.
- 6. The conduct and morale of the crew are excellent in spite of the too few facilities at Red Island Point.
- 7. Recreational leave only has been possible during the month.
- 8. The health of the Ship's Company is satisfactory.
- 9. Distance steamed for month 860 miles since commissioning 9747 (20/11 /44)





During the month of October H.M.A.S. Air View was on passage from Melville Bay to Darwin between the dates 1st. Oct. and 7th. Oct.
(a) Slipped Melville Bay on 2nd. but had to return owing to water in fuel supplied by R. A. A. F. (b) Having cleared engines and fuel lines trials were carried out on 5th., these proved satisfactory. Slipped at 1300 on 5th. and proceeded to Port Essington.
(c) Arrived Port Essington on 6th.fuelled from G.P.V. 956 and proceeded 0600 on 7th. (d) Berthed Darwin 1530 on 7th.
A communication exercise was carried out on the 23rd. this was the only other time Air View was under way during the month.
.5 Colt Brownings, Mountings and Turrets were returned to N.A.S.O. Darwin on 18th October.
Fire drill was carried out on 8th, 15th, and 22nd.
The conduct of the crew is excellent, morale fair.
The health of ships company is satisfactory.

During the month of September, H.M. A.S. "Air View" was on passage to Darwin leaving Sydney on 4th September.

(a) Berth Coff(s Harbour 1615 I.K. on 4th Fuelled and slipped for Brisbane on the 5th.

(b) Berthed C. S. R. Whati' at 1805 K on 5th at 0830 K on 6th moved down to small craft base to carry out 100 hour overall whic was completed on 8th. Fuelled P. M. 8th slipped for Gladstone A. M. 9th.

(c) Berthed Gladstone at 0500 K on 10th prevailing weather condiconditions were bad and passage was upheld until 0800 K on 13th when proceeded to Hackay.

(d) Berthed Mackay 1/00 K on 13th. Fuelled A. M. 14th and proceede to Whitsunday Passage where anchored at South Molle Is. slipped and proceeded to Townsville on 16th at 1200 K.

(a) Be thed Townsville 1840 K on 16th. Slipped and proceeded to Cairns on 19th.

(f) Berthed Cairns at 1930 K on 19th had slight engine trouble which was fixed by 21st. Slipped at 0500 K for Cocktown.

(g) Berthed Cooktown 1030 K 21st. Fuelled and watered. Slipped for Flinders Is. 0915 on 22nd.

(h) Anchored at Flinders Is. 1640 in four fm. veering 12 fm. of cable

(i) Weighted anchor at 0815 K on 23rd and proceeded to Portland Road.

(j) Berthed Fortland Road at 1415 K 23rd. Fuelled taking on 528 gallons.

(k) Slipped and proceeded at 0715 K on 24th. Berkhed Thurs. Is jetty. Although not previously mentioned an Army Punt approx. 15ft in length broke away in Cairns and hit stern of "Air View" whilst she was berthed at wherf. From Cairns from Thursday Is. vibrati was apparent. On inspection by diver two blades of starboard propellor were found to be ourled, these were straightened by divers commencing on 25th and completing on 17th. Trials were carried out on 28th and were very satisfactory. Slipped and proceeded to Melville Bay at 1200 K on 29th September.
