REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1945.

Submitted in accordance with C.N.O. 97/43 and C.C.N.O. 19/45.

- 2. During the month of December 1945, H.M.A.S. "AIR WATCH" was attached to First Tactical Air Force, Labuan, for Air Sea Rescue duties.
- 3. On the 3rd December a 50 hourly overhaul was commenced, this being completed on 5th December.
- 4. At 0815 10th December proceeded on engine trials to Kuala Belait where the ship was anchored until 1523 hours, when it returned to Labuan. Engines appeared to be quite satisfactory.
- 5. On the 20th December, 77 Squadron R.A.A.F. carried out bombing practice on Pelong Rocks. The exercises were covered by this ship, which, leaving Labuan at 0845 arrived at Pelong Rocks at 1005. The bombing was completed by 1150 and the ship returned to base.
- 6. At 0915 the 30th December, left Labuan to take Group Captain Mason, S.O. Equipment, R.A.A.F. Labuan to Jesselton, arriving at that port at 1310 hours. The ship remained at Jesselton overnight, returning to Labuan by 1715 the following day.
- 7. Morale of ship's company is satisfactory, but 50% of the crew are affected by skin troubles.

SUBJECT REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF JANUARY, 1946.

Submitted in accordance with C.N.O. 97/43 and C.C.N.O.19/45.

- 2. Until the 7th January the ship was stationed at Labuan under First Tactical Air Force, R.A.A.F.
- At 1830 left Labuan in company with H.M.A.S. "QUICKMATCH" for Morotai and took up tow at 1930. The following morning, owing to bad weather it was necessary to slip the tow and proceed under our own power until 1830 when the tow was again connected. The remainder of the trip was without incident, the ship arriving at Morotai at 0815 on 11th January.
- On 17th January at 1110 proceeded to Cape Lelait to sink a mine reported by aircraft. The area was thoroughly searched, but the only object sighted was a floating barrel. The ship then returned to harbour arriving at 1625.
- 5. An Army survey party was taken from Morotai to Japanese Headquarters in Kau Bay on the 29th January, leaving harbour at 0630. Two mines were sighted at 0910 and 0925 in positions 01° 26' North 128° 05.2' East, and 01° 20' North 128° 02.4' East. We endeavoured to sink these but were unsuccessful owing to shortage of ammunition. The Army party was put ashore at Lolobata and upon completion of their survey the ship returned to Morotai, arriving at 1940 hours.
- 6. The morale of the crew is satisfactory, but has been lowered recently as advice has been received that Hard Lying Money has been cancelled for this type of ship, whereas larger vessels such as M.S.L's, having much better accommodation and conveniences are still receiving the allowance. Health of the crew is fair.



SUBJECT: REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - NOVEMBER, 1945.

Submitted in accordance with NO 97/43 and CCNO 19/45.

- During the month of November, 1945, HMAS "AIR WATCH" was attached to 1st Tactical Air Force, Labuan, for A.S.R. duties.
- At 0935 on 4 November, the ship left harbour to bring back a sick officer from RAAF ship 016-12, which was proceeding up the coast approximately 20 miles North of Labuan. The officer was transferred to "AIR WATCH" which returned to Labuan, arriving at 1205.
- 4. On 8 November, proceeded to Brookton for slipping, but although Spring Tides, the ship was unable to be slipped owing to lack of water, and she returned to Labuan a.m. 10 November.
- RAAF operations advised at 0630 on 22 November, that a dinghy with three men in it had been adrift all night. The ship proceeded to the East Coast of Labuan Is. and searched until 1020 when she returned to base. The search was unsuccessful, but the men were located during the afternoon on Daart Is.
- At 0755, 29 November, proceeded northward along the coast of the mainland searching for a "Mustang" missing from Palawan. No trace of the aircraft was found, and the ship anchored at Kudat for the night, returning to Labuan the following day.





SUBJECT: REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - OCTOBER. 1945.

Submitted in accordance with N.O.97/43 and C.C.N.O.19/45.

- At 1117 on the 3rd October, the ship slipped and proceeded to Sipitang with an R.A.A.F. Intelligence party to investigate the disappearance of one Mustang, missing for three days. No information was obtained and ship returned torbase at 1645.
- On the 6th October at 1620 a report was received that a Kittyhawk had crashed near Kimanis River. At 1625 H.M.A.S. "AIR WATCH" left base and proceeded to Kimanis. The wrecked plane was sighted on the beach at 1902. At 1910 the ship anchored and the dinghy was sent ashore to pick up the pilot, who was received on board, unhurt at 1934. The ship left Kimanis at 1956 returning to base at 2245.
- The ship slipped for Kimanis with R.A.A.F. Salvage party on 8th October, leaving harbour at 1020. However, at 1155, a signal was received ordering her to proceed to Raffles Anchorage on the North coast of Labuan Is. and search for 3 men believed to be in difficulties in a dinghy. The position was reached at 1310, but a further signal received at that time stated that the men were safe. In the circumstances the ship returned to base, securing at 1402.
- From 9th to 21st October, H.M.A.A. "AIR WATCH" stood by at Labuan for A.S.R. duties.
- At 1235 on 22nd October ship was ordered to proceed to a position 30 miles North of Kuala Belait to search for a landing craft in difficulties. However, ship was recalled at 1312 returning to base at 1350.
- 7. For the remainder of the month ship stood by for A.S.R. duties.
- 8. The health and morale of ship's company is of a high standard.





Submitted in accordance with C.N.O.97/43 and C.C.N.O.19/45.

- 2. On the 2nd September on instructions from Staff Officer, Operations, 1st T.A.F. R.A.A.F. proceeded to Kuraman Is. at 1100 returning to base 1845 the same day.
- 3. From 3rd to 14th September the ship was standing by for A.S.R. Duties.
- 4. At 1345 on 15th September stood by a damaged Catalina taking off. Returned to base at 1530.
- 5. From 16th to 19th September the ship was at immediate notice for A.S.R. duties.
- 6. On 20th September commenced 50 hourly overhaul which was completed on 22nd September.
- As no docking arrangements could be made, ship proceeded to Limbang in Limbang River at 1017 26th September, for the purpose of clearing off weed from ship's hull, by the action of fresh water. At 1520 27th September, left Limbang, returning to base at 1804 the same day. This trip also represented trials after the engine overhaul, and the engines proved to be very satisfactory.
- 8. From 28th to 30th September, the ship was at immediate notice for A.S.R. Duties.
- 9. Health and Morale of ship's company is of high standard.



Submitted in accordance with N.O.97/43 and C.N.O.19/45.

- 2. From the 1st to 17th August in company with H.M.A.S. "AIR CLAN" was standing by for Air Sea Rescue duties, one ship being at immediate notice each day.
- 3. On the night of 18th August stood by a Catalina drifting in a high wind. A line and anchor was passed by skiff and ship returned to base when Catalina was safely anchored.
- Under the orders of A.O.C. 1st T.A.F. R.A.A.F. ship proceeded to Tega Island AM 20th August returning to base PM the same day.
- 5. On 25th August carried out exercise with aircraft, the resultsof which were very satisfactory.
- 6. From 26th to 30th August ship was standing by for Air Sea Rescue duties.
- 7. Lieutenant D. Kaye RANVR assumed command vice Lieutenant E.B. Hophins RANVR on 31st August. Proceeded, AM the same day to sweep harbour and stood by the landing of four Catalinas.
- 8. Health and morale of ship's company is very satisfactory.

Subject Monthly Report of proceedings for Month of July

Submitted for the information of the Naval Board in accordance with N.O. 97/43 and C.C.N.O. 19/45.

- From 1st July until 6th July, H.M.A.S. AIR WATCH was serviceable at Air-Sea-Rescue wharf, Victoria Harbour, LABUAN.
- of JESSELTON to provide Air Sea Rescue cover for P.40 aircraft in distress in area. Investigated native craft off JESSELTON inshore. Natives reported Japanese had them under observation from the shore. Sank the craft and took natives aboard for their own safety.
- 4. At 1200I received orders from Air Operations Room to proceed to position off KUALA POINT and await further instructions. Arrived KUALA POINT at 1555I and instructed to contact S.R.D. Force at TALAGA in MEURUDU BAY and inform them to search for missing P.40 pilot. Arrived TALAGA at 1830I unable to contact party. Returned to LABUAN arriving A.M. 7th July.
- 5. From 7th July until 16th July, H.MAS. AIRWATCH was serviceable at LABUAN.
- 6. On 16th July departed LABUAN to cover strikes on JESSELTON, returning P.M.
- 7. From 16th July until 27th July, H.M.A.S. AIR WATCH was serviceable at LABUAN.
- Departed A.M. 27th July for KUALA BELAIT to cover two day strikes by aircraft in KUCHING area. Arrived KUALA BELAIT P.M. 27th July. Departed P.M. 28th July, arrived LABUAN Sunday.
- 9. Health and morale of ships' company remains satisfactory.



SUBJECT: MONTHLY REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF JUNE 1945.

Submitted for the information of the Naval Board in accordance with N.O. 97/45 and C.C.N.O.

From 31st. MAY until 3rd. JUNE, 1945, HMAS "AIR WATCH" was stationed at MOROTAI under the operational orders of 1st. Tactical Air Force, R.A.A.F.

On 3rd. JUNE, in company with HMAS "AIR CLAN", departed MOROTAI at 0600 I under tow by HMAS "GLENELG" for BRUNEI BAY, NORTH BORNEO. HMAS "GLENELG" formed part of convoy escort, Proceeded to BRUNEI via MINDANAO and PALAWAN ISLANDS. Arrived LABUAN ISLAND, BRUNEI BAY at 1010 I, 14th. JUNE after uneventful tow. This was Z plus 4 day. At 1100I anchored in Victoria Harbour. At 2100I, Air Raid Warning Red, all clear at 2140I. Air Raid Warning Red at 2230I. Action stations manned. One bomb dropped harmlessly in harbour. Enemy single seater fighter TypenOSCAR dropped bomb and was shot down in flames over harbour. All clear at 2300I. Air Raid Warning on nights of 15th. 16th. and 17th. JUNE, but no attacks by enemy aircraft.

On TUESDAY, 19th. JUNE, HMAS "AIR WATCH" slipped from wharf on emergency call from Fighter Sector at 2230I, to standby drifting Catalina. Passed anchor and line from ship to aircraft by skiff and secured aircraft. Two other Catalinas drifted and stood by until weather abated. Secured to wharf Victoria Harbour at 0200I, 20th. JUNE.

At 1840I on 20th. JUNE' proceeded out of Harbour to Sector position to standby 2 Spitfires which were damaged on strike. Aircraft landed safely and ship secured to wharf at 1915I.

On night of 21st. JUNE, 50 Japanese from pocket on L ABUAN ISLAND infiltrated into wharf and beach instal lations. Ship's company stood by with small arms. 47 Japanese were killed by various units in vicinity of wharves.

Air Raid alert on nights of 25th. and 26th. JUNE.

On 26th. JUNE HMAS "AIR WATCH" proceeded to BRUNEI BLUFF to land RAAF personnel for Radar Station, returning to harbour 1350I.

On 28th. JUNE, ship proceeded to LIANG ISLAND at 0900I to cover strike by 6 Spitfires on JESSLETON. Investigated 2 native fishing prahaus and interrogated natives as to Japanese troops in area. Strafed DINAWAN ISLAND on passage back to LABUAN on orders from 1st. T.A.F. R.A.A.F. No movement seen. Secured at 1910I and reported to Intelligence officer.

The health of the ship's company during the month of JUNE has been good.

From 20th. APRIL until 2nd. MAY, HMAS "AIR WATCH" was stationed at BUT to cover increased air activity during assault operations in the WEWAK area. The ship was under the operational orders of 71 GR/B Wing, R.A.A.F., stationed at AITAPE.

On 2nd. MAY, HMAS "AIR WATCH" proceeded to AITAPE for 50 hourly overhaul. This was completed on 5th. MAY and ship proceeded to ALEXISHAVEN via BUT on orders of Northern Command, RAAF, MADANG, for slipping. Ship arrived at ALEXISHAVEN at 1713K on 9th. MAY. Ship was docked at 1430K on 16th. MAY and bottom inspected and painted with anti-fouling. Hull was found to be in good condition.

HMAS "AIR WATCH" was re-allocated from Northern Command, R.A.A.F. to 1st. T.A.F., R.A.A.F. at MOROTAI, and sailed for HOLLANDA via AITAPE at 0510K on 17th. MAY, arriving at AITAPE at 1615K on 17th. MAY. Departed AITAPE at 0615K oh 19th. MAY after refuelling. HMAS "AIR MASTER" at AITAPE was to proceed in company to HOLLANDIA under my command but on arrival AITAPE, it was found that HMAS "AIR MASTER" had damaged a propeller and required docking. HMAS "AIR WATCH" arrived HOLLANDIA at 1220K on 19th. MAY to await onward tow to MOROTAI.

HMAS "BUNBURY" took HMAS "AIR WATCH" in tow at HOLLANDIA and departed at 1300K, 21st. MAY from HOLLANDIA via BIAK, arriving MOROTAI on 27th. MAY, after uneventful tow.

From 27th. MAY, until 31st. MAY, HMAS "AIR WATCH" was stationed at MOROTAI under the operational orders of Commanding Officer, 1st. Tactical Air Force, R.A.A.F., MOROTAI, in company with HMAS "AIR CLAN."

Fire drills were carried out on 6 occasions during the month. All fire fighting equipment was in an efficient condition.

The Main Engines and auxiliaries performed satisfactorily during the month. On testing spark plugs at AITAPE during 50 hourly check, it was found that plugs were defective in electrical test. These plugs (Champion 62S type) had completed 200 hours. This was considered a good performance and this type of plug appears to be ideal for HALL SCOTT Engines using 80 octane fuel.

H.M.A.S. "AIR WATCH" was stationed at Aitape until 20th April. From 20th April, H.M.A.S. "AIR WATCH" was stationed at BUT working under the operational orders of 71 Wing R.A.A.F.

1st April. Slipped at 1420 K and proceeded to BUT to survey harbour for 6 Div H.Q. A.I.F. With Lieut. Ferguson R.A.N.R.(S) pilot of Aitape, I completed survey and returned to Aitape at 1630K on 2nd April.

12th April. Slipped and proceeded to BUT at 1340K with Acting Minister for the Army, Senator Fraser, General Northcote and Secretary for the Army. Party stayed overnight at BUT and returned to Aitape at 1257 on April, 13th.

15th April. Slipped at 1055 and proceeded to investigate burning barge off Selio Island. Barge found to have been purposely destroyed by U.S. Barge Company on Selio Island.

19th April. Slipped at 0750 and proceeded to BUT on orders from

25th April. Slipped at 0730K with party and proceeded to BUT returning to Aitape at 1623K.

27th April. At 1445K weighed and proceeded on W/T message from R,A.A.F. Madang to rescue aircrew of aircraft ditched at Nightingale Bay. At 1540 received W/T message to say aircrew had been picked up by Flying Boat. Returned to BUT at 1645K.
29th April. Weighed anchor and proceeded to Valif Islands to investigate Verey's lights at 1445K. Nothing found and returned

to BUT at 1645K.



- 2. With reference to paragraph 4 slings, however, were examined before hoisting and a Charge Hand Rigger was in attendance while boats were being placed aboard to safeguard Naval interests.
- With reference to paragraph 5 these boats were shipped at short notice and no suitable slip was immediately available. In any case it was considered that ship's company could clean cradles and hull just as well on deck as on a slip.

The remainder of the Air Sea Rescue boats are to be sailed in accordance with Navy Office letter 04218 dated 26th January, 1945.

From January 1st 1945 until January 9th 1945, H.M.A.S. "Air Watch" was moored attached to cradle in Farm Cove, Sydney. On 1st January Lieut. E.B. Hopkins R.A.N.V.R. assumed command from Sub Lieut. W.A. Bach R.A.N.V.R.

- H.M.A.S. "Air Watch" commissioned on 27 November, 1944, and had been moored at Farm Cove since that date.
- 3 January 10th H.M.A.S. "Air Watch" with H.M.A.S. "Air Master" was towed to Glebe Island to be shipped on S.S. "Andrew T. Huntington" to New Guinea.
- 4 January 11th Both ships lifted aboard S.S. "Andrew T. Huntington" and secured on top of No. 2 Hatch. Hulls of both ships were in a filthy condition with weed and shell. Cradle lifting slings were rusted at the base. Cradles were not examined under water before lifting.

It is respectfully submitted that when further ships are being sent deck cargo from Sydney, that ships be first slipped and hulls and cradles cleaned and examined. "Phenrock" hull paint (worm preventative) was chipped by the cradles in many places. Hulls and cradles were cleaned and painted with copper

paint while on passage by Ship's Company.

- / January 11th S.S. "Andrew T. Huntington" sailed.
- P January 20th Commenced unloading. This was done by ship's gear lifting one and a 30 ton floating crane the other and swinging A.S.R. boats outboard and into the water. Cradles were slipped and hoisted aboard berge.
- While lifting first boat, H.M.A.S. "Air Master", floating crane lifted before ships gear with the result "Air Master" swung forward smashing mast on boom block of ships gear. Only other damage was radar gear on H.M.A.S. "Air Watch". Antenna fouled a guy and was broken off.

New mast and repairs to Radar were made at Langemak by N.O.I.C.s Shipwright and R.A.A.F.

Every assistance was given by 7 T.M.O. R.A.A.F. Langemak and H.M.A.S. "Air Watch" commenced engine trials on January 24th.

January 24th - January 30th. Engine trials were carried out by both boats at Langemak. Compasses were corrected by N.O.I.C.s staff at Langemak. Trials were very satisfactory.

Health of Ship's Company during month was very satisfactory

Engine hours for Month - 142 hours both engines. Fuel consumption - 580 galls. 38.66 average galls, per hour. Mileage for month - 225 miles.
