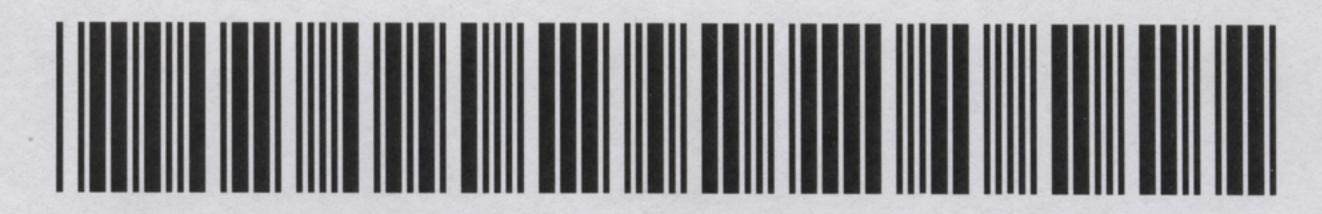

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 1949

Submitted with reference to C.N.O. 107/48, the following report of proceedings of H.M.A. Ship under my command for the period covering Ist to 30th September 1949.

The month of September opened with WOOMERA alongside West Wing, Station Pier, Port Melbourne, awaiting loading of lighters at Swan Island with ammunition for Sydney. Cast off and proceeded towards Swan Island at 0900K 5th September. Secured to buoy off Swan Island Mine Depot and proceeded to back load for Sydney. Loading continued daily until operation was completed at 0950K 10th September, after approximately 20 tons of armament stores for drowning en route, had been taken inboard as deck cargo.

Slipped and proceeded from Swan Island buoy at IOIOK IOth September, for Sydney. The weather was good during the greater portion of voyage, but detiriorated when nearing Port Jackson. Port Jackson was entered at 0530K I3th September and secured to No 5 buoy off Garden Island at 0600K I3th September.

A. Discharge Of Ammunition

No gangs of wharf labourers were available on
arrival and it was not until I6th September that a gang was
engaged and discharge of ammunition was commenced. The discharge
operation was completed at I200K 2Ist September.

Froceeded alongside Gunwharf, Garden Island at I300K 21st September to commence refit. When the period under review came to conclusion the ship was in dockyard hands, with work proceeding satisfactorily.

Advantage is being taken whilst alongside, to chip all metal exposed to the weather. The upper deck is as good as can be maintained whilst in dockyard hands. Below decks remain good.

 During the month of September, the health of
 the ships company remained good.
- The ships company avail themselves of the usual shore amenities.

During the month of September the ships company have conducted themselves, both ashore and afloat, in a befitting manner. Defaulters have been few and of a minor nature.

The chaffing of the sheathing is attributable to lighter alongside whilst loading at Swan Island in open water, when, even with the utmost care and attention to fenders the lighters at times come in contact with sheathing. When the period under review came to conclusion "Woomers" was still in Floating "ock No. 1002.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - DECEMBER, 1948.

Sir.

I have the honour to submit the following Report of Proceedings of H.M.A. Ship under my command, for the period covering 1st. to 31st. December, 1948.

The month of December opened with "Woomera" anchored at Swan Island, Victoria, back loading ammunition cargo for Sydney. At 1545k, 3rd., loading was completed and at 1622k. ship weighed and proceeded to Sydney. At 1500k, 6th., ship secured to No. 7 Buoy, in Sydney Harbour.

- Jischarge of cargo, by wharf labour, was commenced A.M. Tuesday, 7th., and completed A.M. Friday 10th. Ship was then loaded with a cargo of ammunition and mines in crates, for drowning at dumping-ground outside Port Jackson. Loading was completed P.M. 15th.
- 4. DROWNING OPERATION.
 Ship slipped from No. 7 Buoy at 0402k 16th. and proceeded to the dumping ground approx. 26 miles E.S.E. Port Jackson, and commenced drowning ammunition cargo at 0730k. At 1330k operation was completed and ship returned to Sydney, securing alongside "Koala" port side to at Cruiser Wharf, at 1750k, 16th.
- Availability for leave commenced Friday, 17th. and all personnel were discharged to leave with the exception of Navigating Officer, and four ratings, who are remaining with ship during availability; the afore-mentioned personnel being victualled in "Koala", during this period. Ship was shifted A.M. Wednesday, 22nd. and secured alongside "Koala", port side to, at Kuttabul Dolphins.
- Condition of ship above and below decks remains generally good. Defects are being made good by Dockyard, at Garden Island.
- 7. HEALTH OF SHIP'S COMPANY.
 The health of the ship's company during the period under review, remained good.
- The ship's company have availed themselves of the usual shore amenities.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1948. Sir, I have the honour to submit the following Report of Proceedings of H.M.A. Ship under my command, for the period covering 1st. to 30th. November, 1948. 2. AVAILABILITY FOR MID -WINTER LEAVE. The month of November , 1948, opened with "Woomera" alongside Kuttabul Dolphins, Garden Is., Sydney, where availability for leave had been granted. Availability ceased P.M. 10th. November, and "Woomera" cast off' and proceeded to No. 7 buoy at 0750k, 11th. November, to commence loading ammunition for Melbourne. 3. LOADING AMMUNITION FOR MELBOURNE. An ammunition lighter was placed alongside at 0830k, 11th. November, and loading was commenced at 09ook, 11th. Loading continued with some loss of time, due to rain, and was completed at 1015k, 18th. November. Ship was secured for sea, and slipped and proceeded at 1310k, 18th. November. PASSAGE TO MELBOURNE. On reaching open water a moderate South Easterly wind was blowing. After passing Point Perpendicular, the wind'came away'from the South, and brought up quite a rough short sea, which retarded speed considerably until Two-fold Bay was abean when conditions improved and remained ideal for the remainder of the passage. At 1505k, 21st. November, ship entered Port Phillipand brought up with starboard bower off Swan Island. 5. DISCHARGE OF AMMUNITION. An empty 100 ton lighter was placed alongside at 0900k 22nd. November, and was removed when laden at approximately 1500k same day. As portion of the ammunition for back-loading to Sydney was brought to Swan Island on 23rd. November, and no space was available to store it, the only empty available loo ton lighter was used for stowage space. This necessitated "Woomera" having to wait until P.M. 25th. November before discharging could recommence. On resumption of discharge, the operation was completed at 1400k 26th. November. It would be of much advantage to the ship's company if dis-charging could be carried out continuously after arrival, as after six days, the fresh water position becomes very acute, and rationin is enforced during the entire period. The ship has on loan one tank of approx. 80 gallons, which after being filled ashore at Swan Is., is brought aboard to supplement the existing supply, but each time this tank is used, it entails a delay in loading and discharging operations. 6. BACK LOADING FOR SYDNEY. On completion of discharge, "Woomera" proceeded to Station Pier. Port Melbourne, to refuel and replenish water supply, returning to Swan Island, and commenced back loading for Sydney at 0900k, 30th. November. 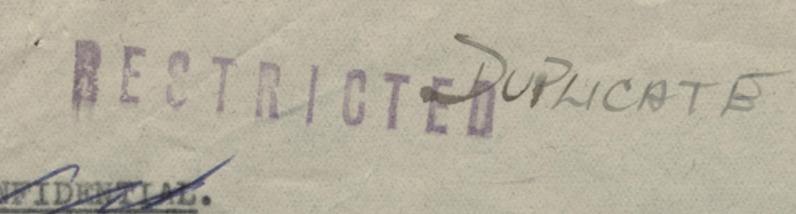

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1848.

Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following report of proceedings of H.M.A. Ship under my Command for the period covering 1st. to 31st. of August 1948.

Loading Ammunition for Melbourne. 2 ...

The month of August opened with "WOOMERA" secured to No. 4 buoy off Garden Island, Port Jackson, loading 4 inch shells for inspection at Maribyrnong, Melbourne. Loading completed PM. 2nd. August and hatches, derricks, etc. were secured for sea.

3. . Passage to Melbourne.

Slipped from No.4 buoy at 1005K 3rd. August and proceeded via West Channel. On clearing harbour, course was set towards Melbourne. Weather during the initial stages of passage was very good and as ship bottom was clean a noticeable increase in speed was evident. The weather deteriorated crossing the Victorian Bight and with the wind from a Westerly direction with resultant short sea, speed was retarded for remainder of passage. Point Lonsdale was brought abeam at 0720K 6th August and "WOOMERA" proceeded to an anchorage off Swan Island, Port Phillip. Came to with starboard bower in three fathoms at O816K 6th. August.

4. . Discharge of Ammunition at Swan Island.

Derricks were rigged and commenced working cargo at 1300K 6th August. In order to supplement O.I.C. Swan Island's civillian labour and expedite the discharge operation, the ship's company were engaged discharging. The weather remained perfect for discharging into lighters and the operation was completed at 1155K 10Th. August.

5 . . Defect in clutch of starboard Main Engine.

During manoeuvres at Swan Island the clutch of Starboard Main Engine began to be troublesome and during the passage to Station Pier for fuel oil, Stores, etc. on completion of discharging of cargo, the clutch became entirely inoperative, necessitating the greater part of passage being steamed on Port engine only. On inspection of clutch by base Engineer Officer, R.N.O. Port Melbourne Williamstown Dockyard Assistance was sought and clutch was dismantled and transported to Maribyrnong, Ordinance depot (the Makers of the clutch.) for repair. On repairs being completed and clutch installed in ship trials were carried out successfully on 27th. August.

REPAIRS TO BILGE AND CIRCULATING PURPS. 2. . The month of July opened with "WOOMERA" alongside Gun Mounting Wharf, Carden Island, Sydney whilst repairs were being carried out by Dockyard on both Main Bilge and auxiliary diesel engine, circulating water pumps. Workwas completed on 5th. July and "WOOMERA" proceeded to No.4 buoy off Garden Island at 0845K to commence loading ammunition for drowning. FAILURE OF NOZ. AUXILIARY DIESEL ENGINE. 3 .. On arrival at No.4buoy Dockyard engineer carried out trials on pumps which had been repaired at Dockyard. Whilst trials were being carried out No. 2 Auxiliary which drives the main bilge pump broke down. Dock and Assistance was sought to repair this engine and it was immediately dismantled and taken ashore.

Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following report of proceedings of H.M.A. SHIP under my command for the period covering 1st. So 30th. June, 1948.

- The month of June opened with "WOOMERA" alongside the Naval Victualling Wharf, New Farm; Brisbane, being fitted with an additional fairlead in preparation to tww L.R.V. "LARUS" to Sydney. The work was completed on fairlead by the A.V.S.N. Co. on 4th June 1948 and the weather, which had been unsuitable for towing, was vecoming fair "WOOMERA" cast off from New Farm at OSOOK 6th June and proceeded down Brisbane River to H.M.A.S. "MORETON" where "LARUS" was taken alongside.
- AT 0855K "WOOMERA cast off from H.M.A.S. "MORETON" with "LARUS" alongside and proceeded to Pile Light in Moreton Bay where towing hawser was veered and "LARUS" taken in two astern at 0915K 6th June, 1948. On reaching open sea and veering the tow behaving quite well in a beam sea. A strong Southerly set was exident when Point Lookout was brought aheam. A experienced for the entire passage to Sydney. Weather conditions were favourable for towing, the sea never coming forward of the beam and passage to Sydney was uneventful and made in good time due to the abnormal southerly set.
- Sydney Harbour was entered and came to with Port Bower at 2345K 8th, June. Weighed and proceeded at 0700K 9th June and a after securing "LARUS" alongside North East boat camber "WOOMERA" proceeded to a berth at Naval Stores Wharf Garden Island, Discharge of cargo was delayed until 1330K due to heavy rain. Discharge of cargo continued daily until completion of operation on 15th June.
- LOADING AMMUNITION FOR DROWNING OFF SYDNEY.

 1200K 16th June, secured to No7 buoy off Garden Island and proceeded to load ammunition at 1045K 17th June. Due to unsettled weather loading was not completed until P.M.

 21st June, when, besides loose shell and bombs over 1000 boxes of fuses were below hatches for drowning.
- OROWNING OPERATION OFF SYDNEY.

 Slipped and proceeded from No7 buoy at 0900K 22nd June and proceeded to dumping area off Macquarie Light. On arrival at dumping area commenced operation and continued during daytime hours until completion at 1730K 23rd June. During the forenoon of 23rd June a defect developed in the main bilge pump and on the return passage to harbour the water circulating pump on No2 Auxiliary Diesel failed.
- On arrival in harbour a berth was made available

On arrival in herbour a berth was made available alongside H.M.A.S. "RESERVE" and work was commenced on defective pumps. When the period under review came to conclusion both Main Bilge and water circulating p umps had been removed from ship and being over hauled in Garden Island, dockyard workshops.

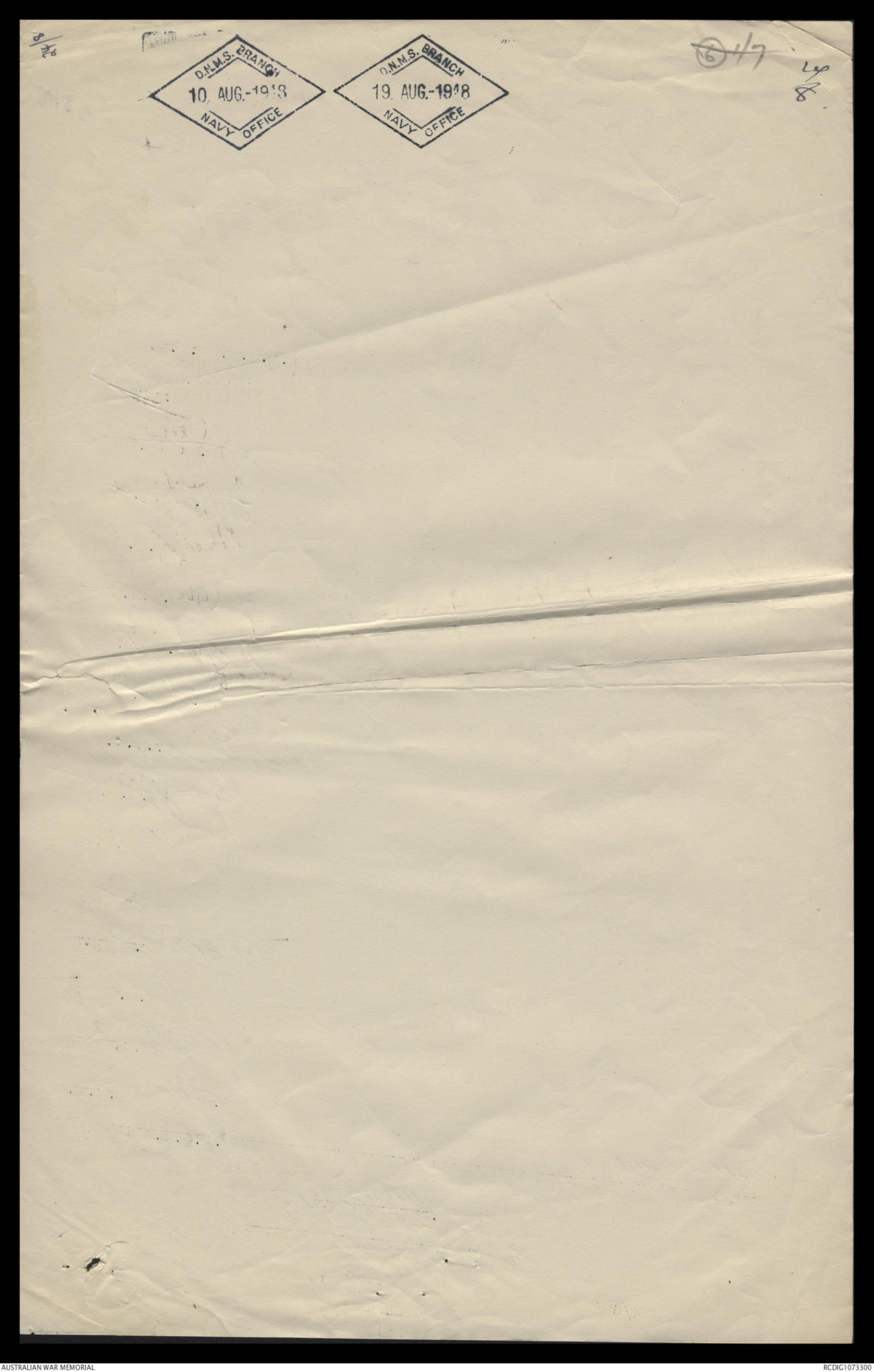

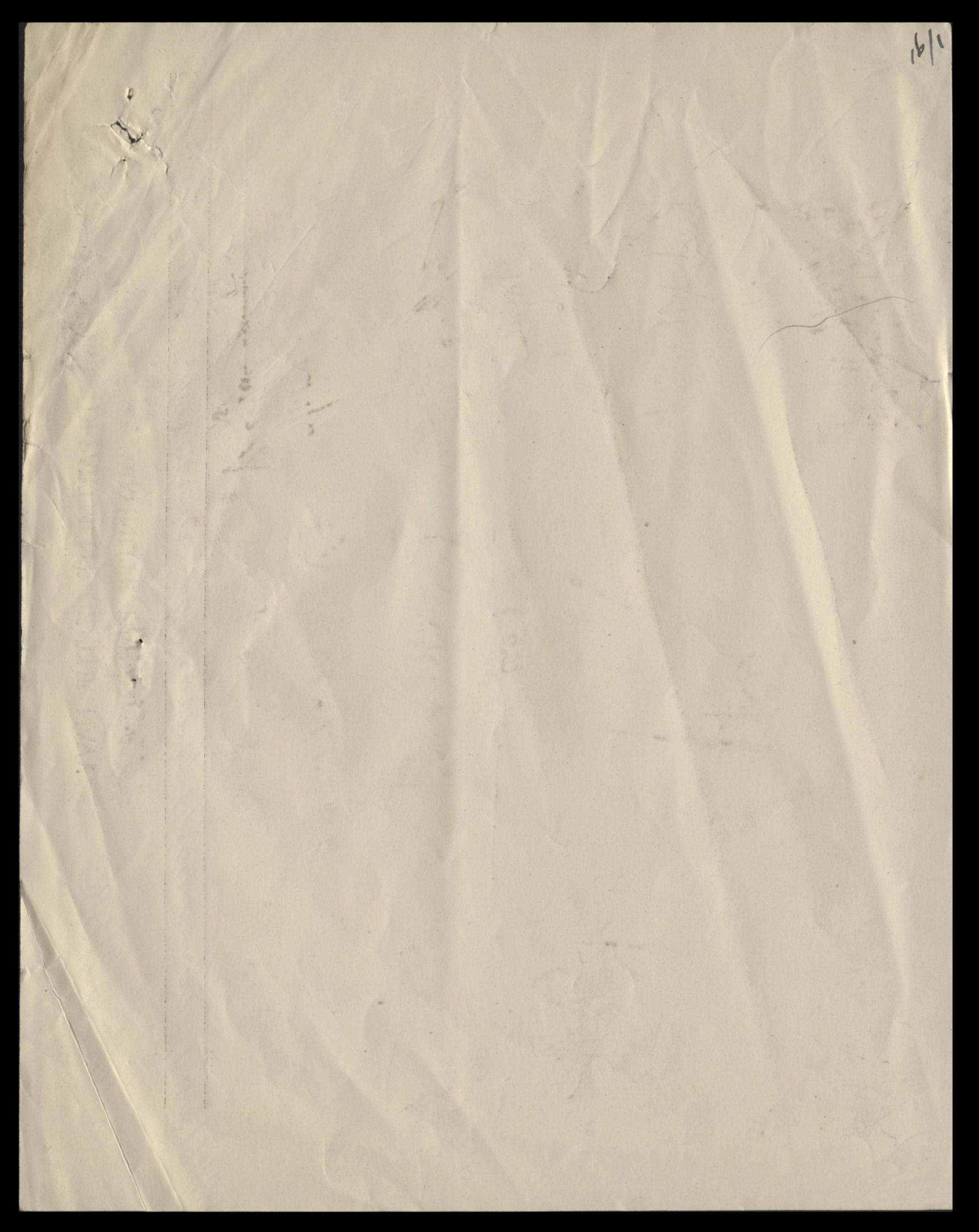

I have the honour to submit the following report of proceedings of H.M.A. Ship under my command for the period covering 1st to 31st May, 1948.

2. ARRIVAL IN BRISBANE FROM SYDNEY:

The month of May opened with "WOOMERA" approximately 3 miles to the Northeast of Danger Point proceeding towards Brisbane. The weather had deteriorated and strong winds and rough seas were encountered during the remainder of the passage until we entered the lee under Cowan Cowan, Moreton Bay. At 1800K 1st May the Pile Light was abeam and entered Brisbane River, proceeded to New Farm, Victualling Wharf and secured alongside at 2153K 1st May.

3. LOADING AMMUNITION EX "GEEBUNG" FOR DROWNINGS:

It was anticipated loading of 190 tons .5 Ammunition for drowning would commence 5th May, but due to congestion of shipping in the Port labour was not available until 10th May when "WOOMERA" proceeded at 0940K to Pinkenba Railway Wharf and commenced loading. Operation continued daily until completion on P.M.14th May when Ship was secured for sea.

4. DROWNING .5 AMMUNITION EX "GEEBUNG" OFF CAPE MORETON:

When secured for sea "WOOMERA" proceeded from Pinkenba Rail-way Wharf at 1700K 14th May towards dumping area in a position 27 Degrees 10 Minutes, South. 153 Degrees 50 Minutes, East. Arrived at Dumping Area at 0600K 15th May and commenced drowning operation. 1608K discontinued drowning operation and proceeded to an anchorage under the lee of Cape Moreton. Continued operation during 16th May until o peration was completed and proceeded towards Brisbane, Berthed alongside New Farm, Victualling Wharf at 1540K

5. BACK LOADING FOR SYDNEY:

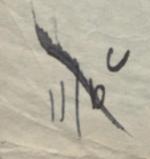
O800K 19th May proceeded to New Farm, Wharf to load empty packages ex "GEEBUNG" for Sydney. On completion of loading "WOOMERA" returned to New Farm, Victualling, Wharf to load N.S.O. and V.S.O. stores for Sydney in available remaining hold space.

6. FITTING OF FAIRLEAD FOR TOWING:

A.C.N.B's 170623Z indicating "WOOMERA" tow "LARUS" to Sydney necessitated the fitting of a suitable fairlead aft for towing, as existing fairlead is fitted in Bulwarks, both too high and at an angle of approximately 45 degrees to the line of tow. N.O.I.C. Brisbane's 200344Z asking for approval to fit same was approved by A.C.N.B's 270518Z and job was taken in hand by A.U.S.N.Co. Brisbane and was proceeding when the period under review came to conclusion.

7. CONDITION OF SHIP:

Advantage has been taken of delay in Brisbane, in ideal paintis good. The condition above and below decks

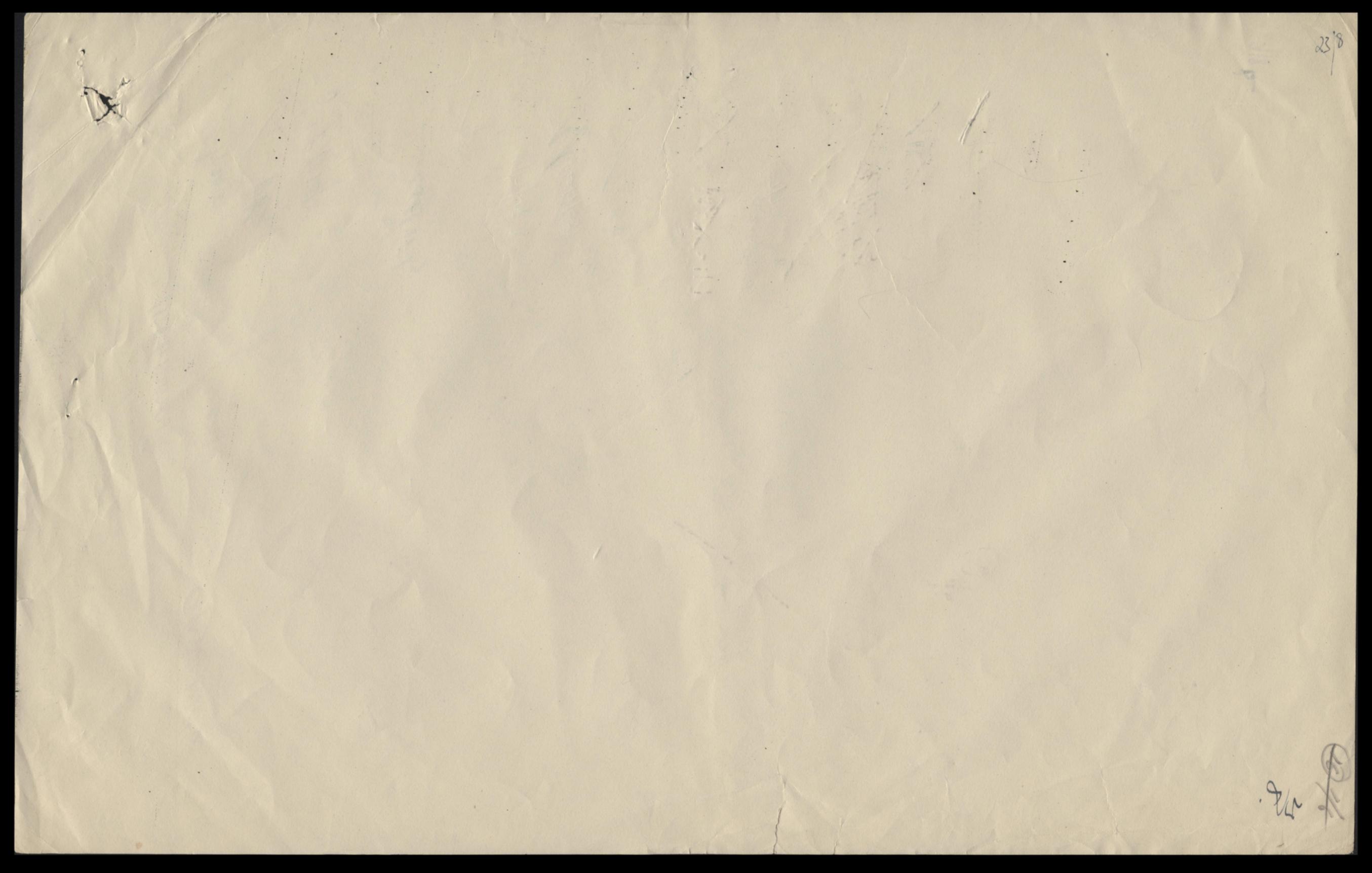

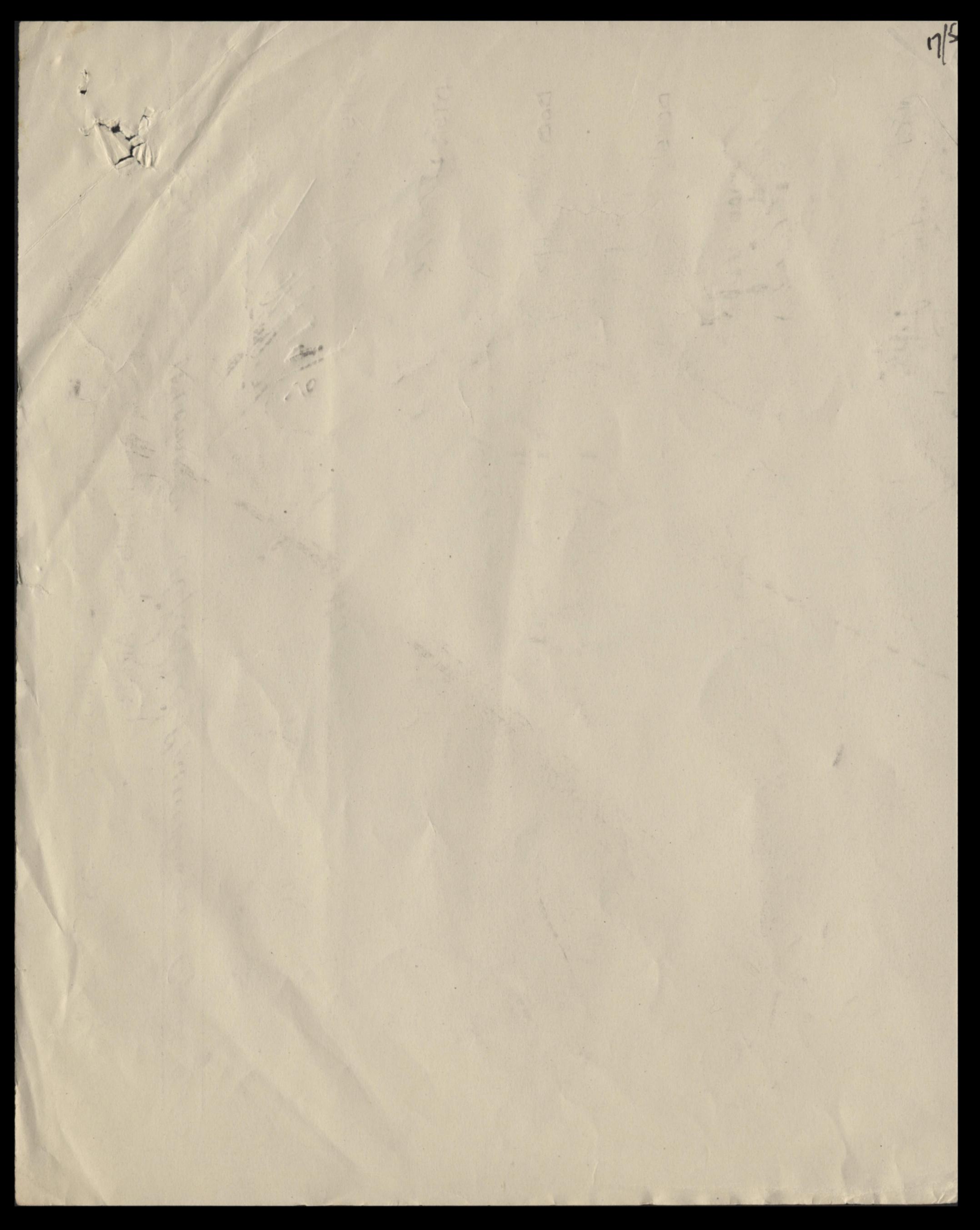

I have the honour to submit the following report of proceedings for the period covering 1st to 30th April, 1948.

2. BACK LOADING NAVAL AND EMPTY AMMUNITION PACKAGES FOR SYDNEY.

The month of May opened with "Woomera" alongside Naval Victualling Wharf, New Farm, continuing the back loading of Naval Stores and Ammunition packages ex "GEEBUNG". Loading was concluded at 1000K 6th April and "Woomera" slipped and proceeded at 1317K 6th April towards Sydney.

3. PASSAGE TO SYDNEY.

On leaving the sheltered waters of Moreton Bay, a considerable swell was encountered, which retarded speed to some extent until Cape Byron was abeam. The sea having subsided, a good passage was made and Sydney Heads entered at 1015K 9th April.

4. DISCHARGE OF CARGO AND BACK LOADING FOR MELBOURNE.

Discharge of cargo commenced at 0830K 12th April; wharf labourers being employed, under the supervision of The Central Stevedoring Co. Holds were cleared at 0905K 15th April and "Woomera" proceeded to Kurraba Fuelling Wharf to refuel. On completion of refuelling at 1210K 15th April, slipped and proceeded to No. 5 buoy of Garden Island, secured to same at 1225K 15th April and commenced loading ammunition for drowning en route to Brisbane at 1315K 15th April.

5. COMMENCEMENT OF PASSAGE TO BRISBANE AND FAILURE OF STARBOARD ENGINE.

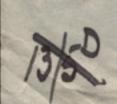
Having loaded approximately 180 tons of ammunition, including approximately 35 tons being stowed on deck, "Woomera" slipped from No. 5 buoy at 0915K 21st April and proceeded towards dumping area off Macquarie Light, South Head to drown the more dangerous deck cargo. When dumping area was reached and just before drowning operation was commenced, the starboard engine had to be stopped due to a shaft driving the oil pump becoming sheaked. The drowning of deck cargo was completed and a return to harbour commenced on port engine. Progress was very slow, the wind being very strong from a Westerly direction and tending to back to South West, thus bringing the wind on the port bow, and as only the port engine could be used, steering at times was most difficult. Harbour was entered and secured to No. 3 buoy, 2020K 21st April.

6. REPAIRS TO STARBOARD ENGINE AND FURTHER LOADING OF AMMUNITION FOR DROWNING.

On return to harbour, repairs were taken in hand immediately by dockyard and ship's engineroom department. On a gang of wharf labourers being available, loading of ammunition commenced 27th April. Having fitted new parts and made all necessary repairs, trials were completed at 2300K 27th April.

7. PASSAGE TO BRISBANE

Slipped and proceeded from No. 5 buoy at 0802K, 28th April

and proceeded to dumping area off Macquarie light, area being reached and operation commenced at 1200K, 28th April. On conclusion of drowning operation at 1748K, 28th April, course was set towards Brisbane. Voyage was continued in good weather until Danger Point was abeam at 2330K, 30th April, when it deteriorated and strong Easterly winds and rough seas were encountered. When the period under review was concluded "Woomera" was approximately 3 miles to the North of Danger Point.

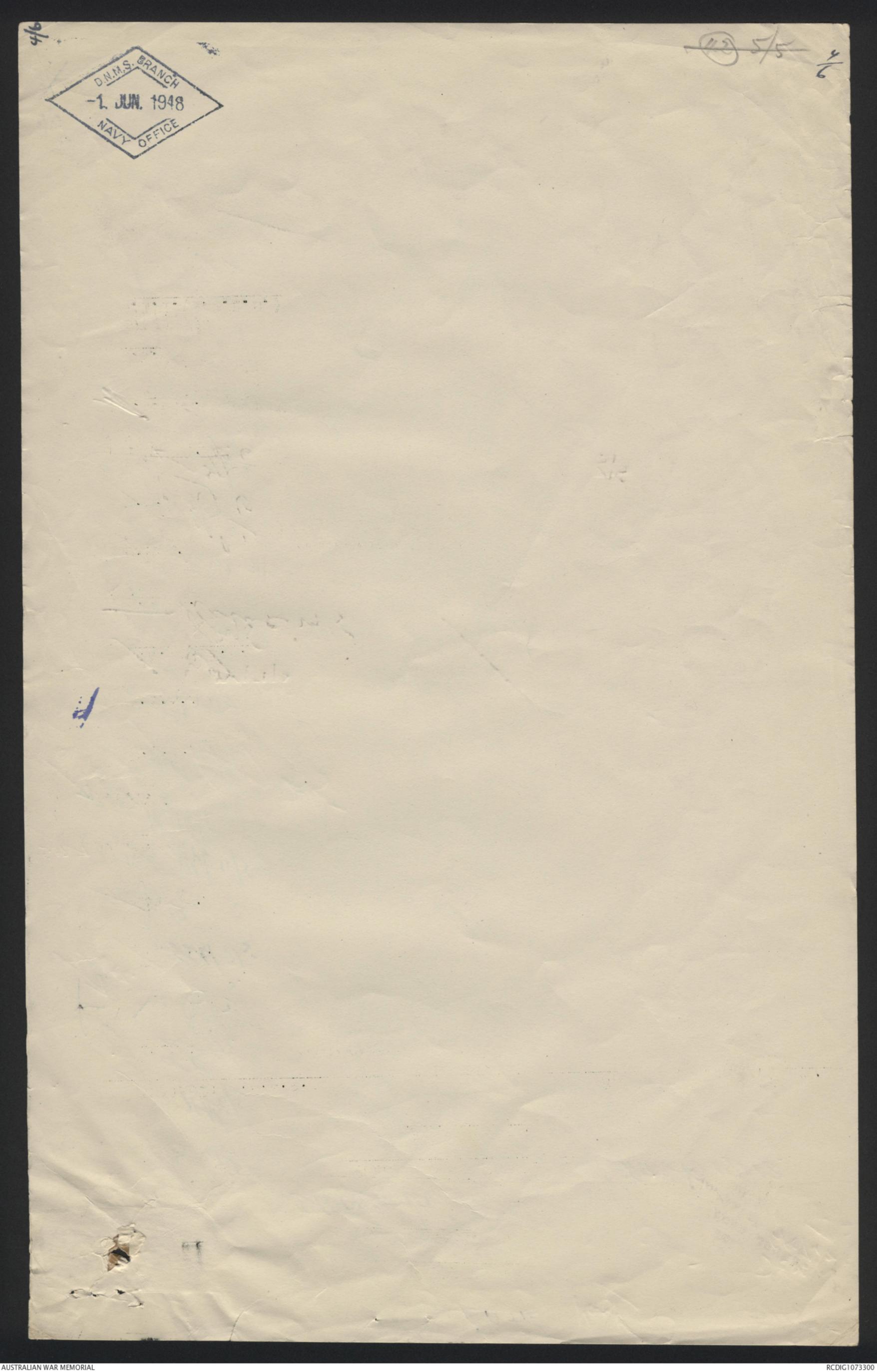

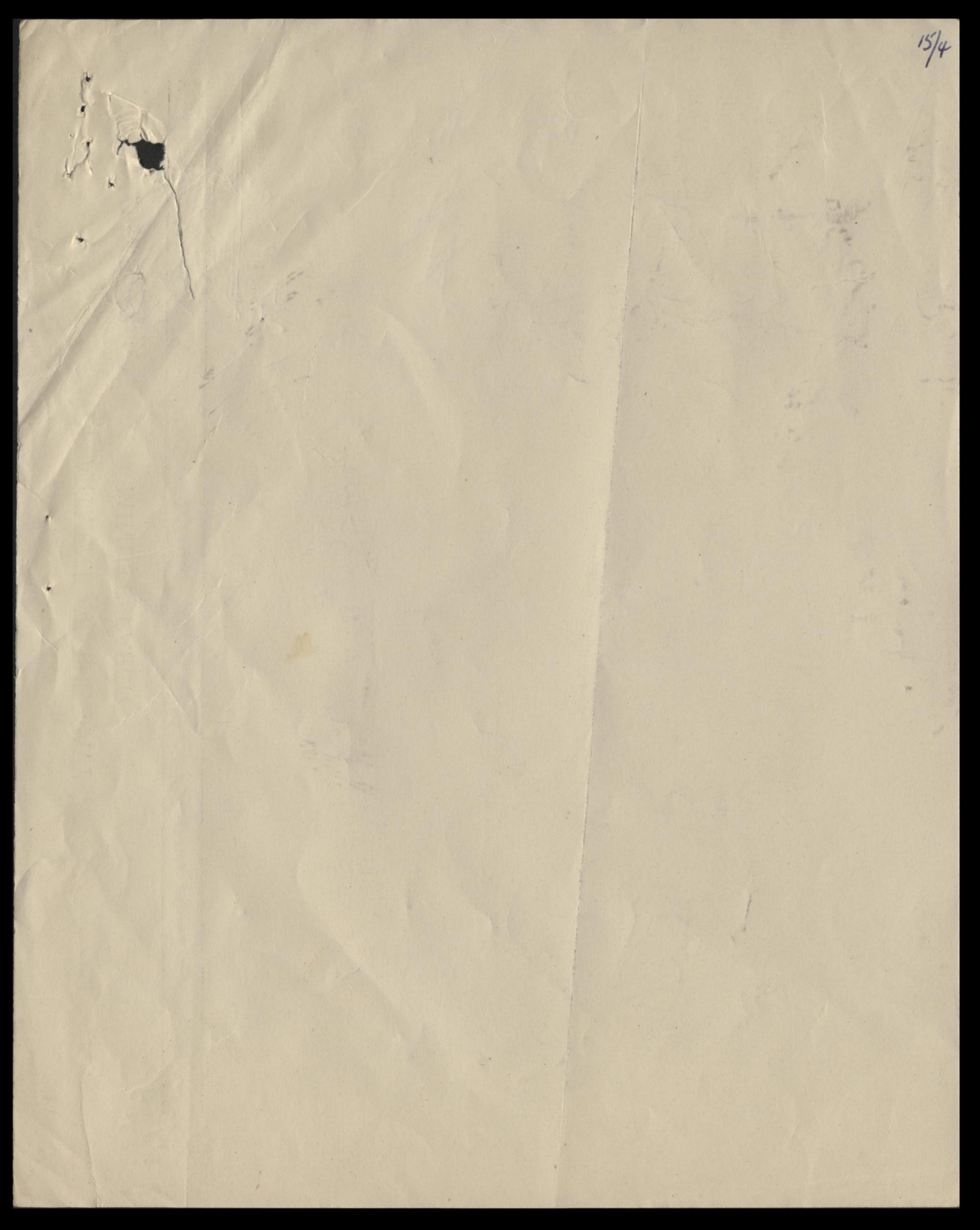

2. COMPLETION OF REFIT AND COMMENCEMENT OF LOADING AMMUNITION

Refitting period was concluded 1st March and "Woomera" proceeded from "PENGUIN" wharf in Hunter Bay, Port Jackson, to the Naval Fuelling Wharf at Kurraba Point and replenished with fuel. Slipped and proceeded to No. 3 buoy at 0900K 2nd March to "swing" compasses. On completion of compass adjustment secured to No. 4 buoy off Eastern side of Garden Island to load ammunition en route to Brisbane. Due to wharf labourers dispute loading did not commence until 5th March and was continued daily until completion on 10th March.

Due to dispute by wharf labourers in Brisbane, "Woomera" did not proceed to Brisbane, but slipped at 0800K 11th March and proceeded to Dumping area off Sydney and commenced drowning ammunition at 1403K 11th March. Drowning operation was not concluded before night fall and to avoid the long journey back to harbour at the slow speed necessary to "run in" the engines after refit, it was decided to keep the sea all night and conclude drowning operation next day. Drowning was commenced at daylight 12th March and on conclusion returned to harbour, securing to No. 4 buoy at 1305K 12th March.

4. LOADING NAVAL STORES AND AMMUNITION FOR BRISBANE

O900K 15th March commenced loading Victualling and Naval Stores and carried on to load ammunition for drowning. Loading continued each day until completion when hatches were covered and ship secured for sea 18th March.

5. PASSAGE TO BRISBANE

Slipped and proceeded at 0910K 18th March and after clearing Sydney Heads course was laid to dumping Area which was reached and operation of drowning commenced at 1320K 18th March. The operation was concluded at 1700K 18th March and course was set towards Brisbane in good weather. Weather continued fair until P.M. 20th March when strong winds and rough seas from an Easterly direction were encountered. A great increase in the amount of fuel consumed by main engines was most evident during the early part of the voyage attributable to tight bearing etc., but as the voyage progressed and "Running in" period advanced fuel consumption dropped considerably. It is anticipated that on return journey to Sydney fuel consumption will be back to normal. Entered Moreton Bay and proceeded to Naval Victualling Wharf, New Farm, securing to same at 0515K 22nd March.

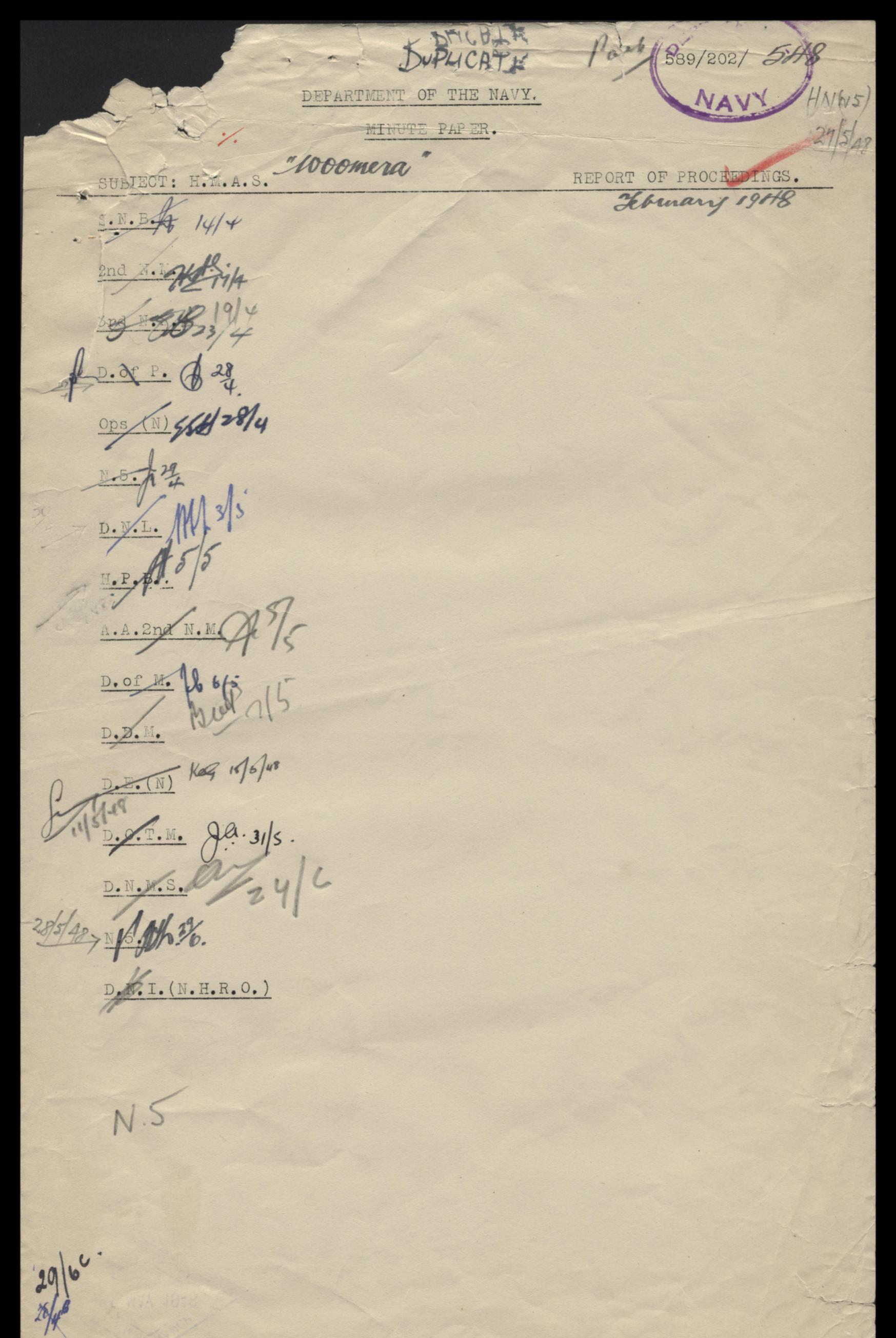

I have the honour to submit the following report of proceedin of H.M.A. Ship under my command for the period covering Ist to 31st December 1947.

(2) DISCHARGE OF AMMUNITION EX- GEEBUNG BRISBANE.

Discharging of ammunition into lighter was commenced at No 3 buoy off Garden Island by wharf labourers at I330K Ist December I947. The cargo comprised only approx 30 tons of explosives the remainder being empty packages. Discharging continued daily until completion at I630K 4th December I947.

(3) COMMENCEMENT OF REFIT AND LEAVE PERIOD.

Slipped and proceeded from No 3 buoy off Garden Island 0845K 5th December 1947 to wharf at Benguin in Hunter Bay Middle Harbour and commenced availability for refit and Christmas leave period. The dismantling of Main engines was commenced on securing alongside and parts for fitting and turning removed ashore to Penguin.

(4) DOCKING FOR BOTTOM OVERHAUL IN FLOATING DOCK No 1003.

Ship was taken in tow by Naval tug Wattle at I205K IIth December. and entered floating dock No I003 at I340K IIth December I947 On the dock being raised work was commenced on cleaning. painting inspection of underwater fittings, inspection of anchor and cables etc. Docking was completed and Woomera was towed to west wall Captain Cook Dock to continue work undertaken by Dockyard at 0953K 22nd December I947.

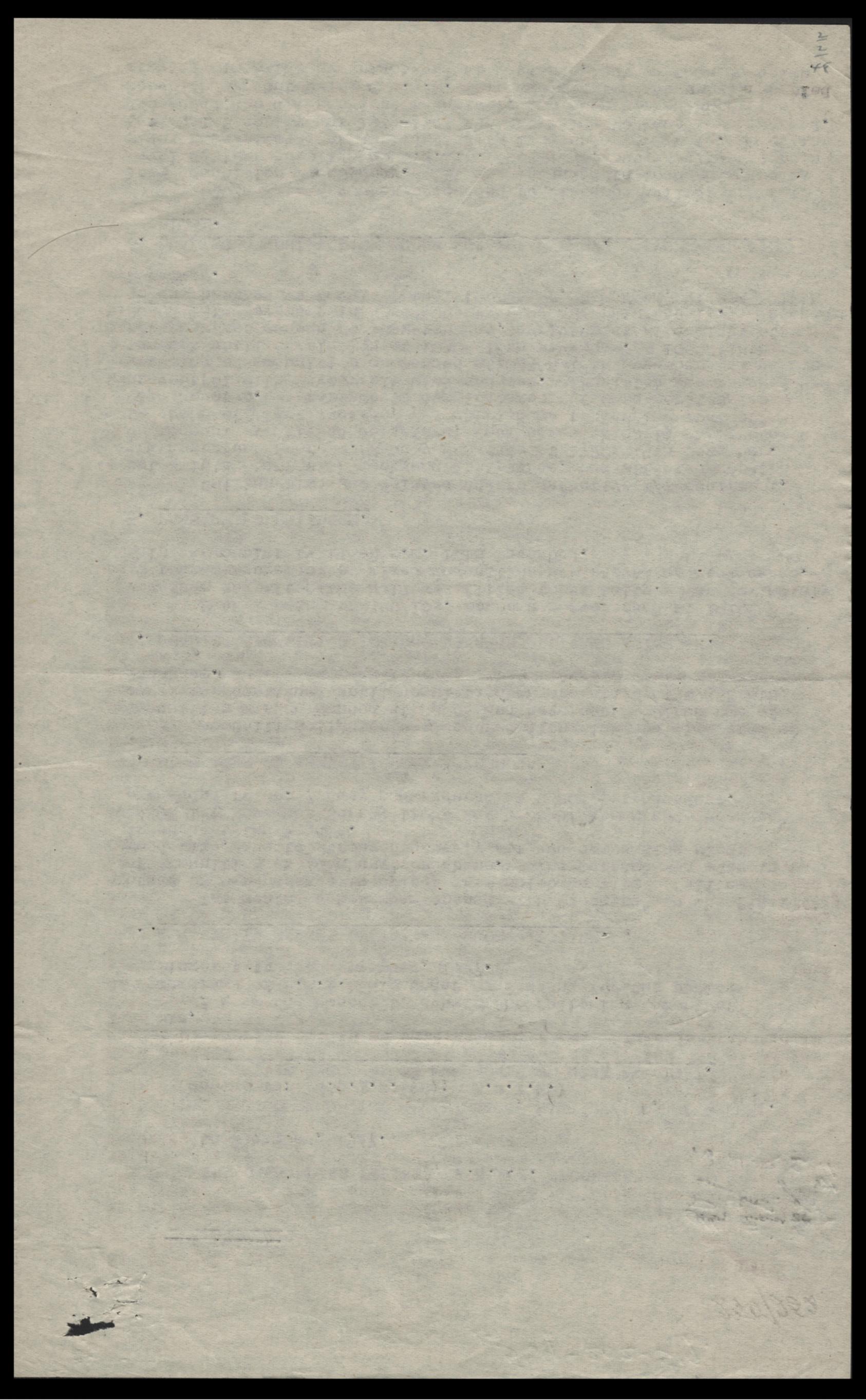

I have the honour to submit the fellowing Report of Proceedings of H.M.A. Ship under my command for the period covering 1st to 30th November, 1947. 2. ARRIVAL IN SYDNEY ON PASSAGE FROM BRISBANE. The month of November opened with "Woomera" on the final stage of her passage to Sydney from Brisbane with a full cargo of ammunition ex "Geebung" Brisbane. The passage was made in good time, due to strong Southerly set and commanding winds throughout the voyage. 0449K 1st Nevember Hernby light was brought abeam and "Weemera" proceeded to No. 7 Buoy and secured at 0520K 1st Nevember. 3. DISCHARGE OF AMMUNITION EX "GEEBUNG" Ammunitien lighter was secured alongside and discharge of ammunitien was commenced at 0900K 2nd Nevember. Discharge of carge was centinued until completion of eperation at 0935K 8th Nevember. 4. LOADING AMMUNITION FOR DROWNING EN ROUTE TO BRISBANE. Back leading of 300 lbs. bombs was commenced at 1015K 8th Nevember and after the held was filled to capacity. Approximately 30 tons measurement of mixed ammunition was stowed as deck carge. Ship was completely laden p.m. 14th November. 5. PASSAGE TO BRISBANE. Sailing time was delayed due to defective W/T equipment, but Ship's staff with dockyard assistance, had effected repairs and departure from No. 7 busy was made at 1720K 15th November. On account of delayed departure, dock cargo which it was proposed to drown off Port Jackson, was carried on to dumping area off Cape Moreton. Passage to dumping area off Cape Moreton was uneventful with favourable wind and sea. Position was reached and drowning of ammunition commenced at 0430K 18th November and carried through until completion at 1030K 18th November. 1050K 18th Nevember set course for Moreton Bay, arriving at File Light at 2040K 18th Movember in a very heavy wind and rain squall. Preceeded to and berthed at Naval Victualling Wharf, New Farm, at 2245K 18th Movember. 6. LOADING AMMUNITION EX "GEEBUNG" FOR SYDNEY. ANCHORAGE PILE LIGHT. 0903K 20th Nevember proceeded to Pinkenba Railway Wharf to load ammunition for Sydney. It was intended to load ship, using Naval Ratings supplied by H.M.A.S. "MORETON", but an alteration in plans necessitated an application to load under order No. 66 of the National Security Act 1939-1943 and Waterside Workers were engaged. "Woomera", on all previous occasions, has been worked under the above order, but being a R.A.N. Ship was granted the privilege of staying alongside evernight and at weekends, but on this occasion

an anchorage at Pile Light, between the hours of sunset and sunrise was indicated in the Orders received from the Department of Supply and Shipping, Dangerous Cargoes Section. Acting under instructions of N.O.I.C. Brisbane, "Woomera" remained alongside Pinkenba Wharf, Thursday night, but Dangerous Cargoes Section withdrew Order No. 66 and "Woomera" had to anchor at Pile Light during the whole weekend period.

This is most unsatisfactory from a leave point of view, as Ship's Company had to remain on board from Friday until Monday forencen. Main engines, routine maintenance which can be carried out alongside cannot be carried out in an exposed anchorage. This contributed in some measure to the engine Stoppages referred to paragraph 7 of

this report.

As deck space for recreation purposes is limited in a ship of this size, shore leave is most essential for the men's welfare. It would seem apparent that before "Woomera" could lay alongside overnight whilst leading, as was the usual practice, waterside workers would have to be dispensed with and Naval Ratings used to load in Brisbane. As the cargo leaded consisted of mainly empty packages; approximately 30 tens only of explosives being loaded, the operation was completed at 1930K 24th November, after a deck cargo of ammunition and V.S.O. Stores was stowed for drowning in dumping area off Cape Moreton.

7. PASSAGE TO SYDNEY.

1940K 24th November departed Pinkenba Railway Wharf and proceeded towards Sydney. 0550K 25th November in dumping area and proceeded to drown deck carge under good weather conditions. Operation was completed at 0635K 25th November and passage towards Sydney continued. Buring the afternoon of 25th November the wind came away from the South and remained in a Southerly direction with a resultant fairly heavy head sea; this retarded speed considerably at times, coupled with the fact that considerable trouble was being experienced with exhaust valves sticking in the put main engine, necessitating frequent stoppages during the voyage, ship was eight hours astern of her E.T.A. at Sydney.

1524K 27th November Hornby Light was abeam and secured to No. 3 buey at 1550K 27th November.

8. DISCHARGE OF AMMUNITION IN SYDNEY.

Although waterside workers had been ordered for 28th November, no gangs were available when the period under review was concluded.

9. CONDITION OF SHIP.

In view of quick "turn rounds" in port, little time has been available to do other than essential maintenance jobs, consequently the outer appearance of ship has suffered to some extent, but as a refit is over-due it is anticipated that during availability ship's side etc. will be brought back to good appearance. Below decks remains good.

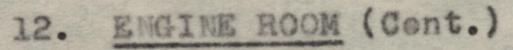

Loading of ammunition to be drowned in dumping area off Cape

Moreton being completed on the return of N.S. Wales and Queensland ratings from leave Woomera slipped from No 7 buoy in Port Jackson and proceeded towards brisbane at I440K 4th Septemner.

.3. PASSAGE TO BRISBANE.

The weather was fair and conditions generally very good during the passage and after drowning ammunition "Woomera" berthed along-side Naval Victualling Wharf, New Farm, Bristmaneat I444K 7th September.

.4. LOADING AMMUNITION FOR DROWNING.

Discharged Naval Victualling stores A.M. 8th September slipped and proceeded to Railway Wharf Pinkenba 6835K 9th September 1930K 9th September commenced loading ammunition for drowning 1339K 10th September loading was completed and "Woomera" slipped and proceeded at 1605K for dumping area. After anchoring during the dark hours a course was laid for dumping area off Cape Moreton at o600K 11th

September.On reaching open sea swell was too big for drowning operations came to anchor at Cape Moreton until weather moderated Weighed and proceeded at 2020K IIth September and on reaching dumping area, drowned ammunition and proceeded back to Naval Victualling Wharf, New Farm, making fast alongside at I400K I2th September.

.5. LOADING AMMUNITION EX GEEBUNG FOR SYDNEY.

OSIOK 15th September slipped and proceeded for Pinkenba Railway
Wharf made fast alongside same at 69IOK commenced loading
ammunition at IO2OK 15th September loading continued daily
until completion I445K 18th September. Ship secured for sea and
ready to proceed 66OOK 19th September but adverse weather report
and subsequent weather conditions delayed sailing until 050OK
27th September.

.6. PASSAGE TO SYDNEY

O500K slipped and proceeded towards Sydney on reaching open sea quite a big swell and moderately rough seas were encounted this retarded speed appreciably. When abeam of Danger Boint conditions had improved and the remainder of passage was under good conditions. A southerly set was very evident until Sugarloaf Point was abeam and at times was running 2.3knots. Hornby Light was brought abeam at I445K 29th September and "Woomera" secured to No 7 buoy at I517K.

.7. Discharge of cargo.

Derricks were rigged and after the discharge of deck cargo hatch was broken out and commenced discharging into lighter at 0930K 30th SEPTEMBER.

I have the honour to submit the following report of proceedings of H.M.A. ship under my command for the period covering 1st to 30th June 1947.

PASSAGE FROM BRISBANE TO MELBOURNE CARRYING AMMUNITION EX GEEBUNG BRISBANE

The month of June opened with "woomera" off Cape Liptrappe on the final part of the voyage to Melbourne. Weather conditions were favourable and Point Lonsdale was brought abeam at 0846K 1st June. Port Phillip was entered and proceeded via South Channel to Williamstown and berthed alongside Cross berth between Reid and "elson Piers at 1340K 1st June.

3. DISCHARGE OF AMMUNITION CARGO

AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL

Broke out the hold and commenced discharging ammunition at 1000K 2nd June. Discharging was continued each day until completed on 6th June. During the Discharging period, operations were held up on occasions, due to unfavourable weather conditions. I consider the zeal with which NASO's staff carrying out the discharge and loading of the hold, worthy of favourable comment.

4. BACK LOADING AND LOADING OF AMMUNITION FOR DROWNING

Pack loading of armament stores for Sydney and ammunition for drowning in deep water was commenced at 0900K 9th June. This operation was completed when a deck cargo of smoke floats was secured to be drowned en route to Sydney.

5. PASSAGE TO SYDNEY

Ship was secured and ready for sea P.M. 10th June and departure was expected A.M. 11th June. Due to Gale warnings sailing was postponed until 14th June, when weather conditions gave every indication of remaining fair for some days. Slipped and Proceeded from Cross berth at Williamstown 1100K 14th une. Port Phillip heads were cleared at 1445K and weather outside was good. Southern Point light, Wilsons Promontory was abeam at 0250K 15th June. A fresh to strong North West wind was experienced after the passage across the Victorian Bight was commenced. Gabo Island light was brought abeam 0054K 16th June weather conditions being good. A very heavy West North West squall was experienced for about an hour from 1630K 16th "une. Point Perpendicular light was abeam at 2316K 16th June weather conditions being good. The weather deteriorated when abeam of Port Kembla and the wind at times reached gale force from North West. The sea at 18 miles off shore was rough and drowning operations impossible, so proceeded to harbour and berthed at Kurraba Point fuelling wharf at 1055K 17th June.

6. DROWNING OF AMMUNITION, DISCHARGE OF STORES AND LOADING FOR BRISBANE

Weather conditions were unsuitable for drowning of deck cargo until 19th June, when Woomera proceeded from Kurraba Point Fuel wharf to dumping area. Drowning operations commenced at 1300K 19th June and completed at 1400K 19th June, returned to C.O.R. Fuelling wharf. Fuelling was completed and returned to Kurraba Point Fuelling wharf to load ballast and stores for Brisbane. Loading was completed and Woomera sailed for Brisbane 1000K 24th June.

7. PASSAGE TO BRISBANE AND DROWNING OF BALLAST EN ROUTE

Off shore winds and slight seas were encountered until in the vicinity of Danger Point at 0700K 26th June when the wind freshened from the South and as a course was laid to the dumping area conditions were becoming bad for drowning operations. When area was reached at 1600K 26th June drowning operation was commenced in very poor conditions. Drowning operation completed at 1800K 26th June and proceeded to harbour, arriving at Naval Victualling Wharf, New Farm, Brisbane at 1430K 27th June.

B. DISCHARGE OF VICTUALLING STORES AND BACK LOADING STORES FOR MELBOURNE.

The discharge of Naval Victualling stores being completed and ship refuelled, Woomera slipped and proceeded for Pinkenba Railway Wharf at 0730K 30th June, on arrival alongside at 0830K 30th June hatches were uncovered and at 1025K 40M.M. Bofor ammunition was commenced loading. When the period under review came to a close approximately 20 tons of 40 M.M. Bofor ammunition ex Geebung for NASO Maribyrnong had been loaded.

I have the honour to submit the following report of proceedings for the month of March 1947 of H.M.A. Ship under my command for the period 1-3-47 to 31-3-47.

Drowning of 1000 lb Aerial Bombs.

The month of March openedwith "Woomera" loading 1000 lb Aerial Bombs for drowning. The loading of approximately 250 tons of bombs was concluded 4th March by wharf labourers, taking four days in all.

Slipped and proceeded to dumping area 0948K 4th March, arrived at position and commenced dumping at 1345K The ship's speed was noticeably slow owing to marine growth on her bottom. Returned to Watson's Bay at 1900K. At 0500K 6th March slipped and proceeded to dumping area and commenced dumping at 0811K, continuing until completion of operation at 1340K. Returned to Kurraba Point for fuel, arriving at 1740K.

- Re-fuelling, and Wharf-labourers Dispute.

 Re-fuelling ship was completed at 1045K 7th March and ship was berthed at No 9 Walsh Bay, but due to Waterside Workers' dispute no labour for loading was available.
- As orders had been received from A.C.N.B. that when ship was next loaded she was to be sailed to Brisbane, and in view of the fact that the dispute would hold up the ship's programme indefinitely, application was made for docking. "Woomera" was taken in hand for defect in port clutch of windlass, and docked in Fitzroy Dock, Cockatoo Island on 17th March. Ship was undocked P.M. 18th March and berthed on Destroyer Wharf, Cockatoo Island, until repairs to windlass were effected on 20th March. Vessel then proceeded toNo 9 Walsh Bay. During the passage from Cockatoo Is. to Walsh Bay considerable difference was noticed in ship's speed attributable to clean bottom.
- Ship proceeded to No 6 buoy off Clarke Is. at 1030K 21st March. Compasses were adjusted, and ship was berthed at No 9 Walsh Bay to await labour to load ammunition.
- Shortage of labour.

 The waterside dispute was settled and men returned to work on 25th March. Labour was sought for "Woomera", but due to congestion of food and other essential cargoes which had accumulated in the port, the priority for this ship is very low, and at the conclusion of the period under review labour had not been obtained.
- Condition of ship.

 Condition of ship has improved since a small quantity of paint was supplied from Naval Stores.

 Deck and general appearances are very good.

1. Loading and Drowning of Ammunition and Depth Charges - At Sydney. The month of October opened with "Woomera" loading Ammunition and Depth Charges for drowning at sea at Central Wharf, Walsh Bay. Loading was completed P.M. 1st. October and at 0700k 2nd. October, ship slipped and proceeded to dumping area as defined by F.O.I.C.(S). Drowning of Ammunition proceeded throughout that day under very unfavorable conditions, and "Woomera" returned to harbour and anchored between East and West Channel lights at 1825ksame day. At O610k 3rd. October weighed and proceeded to dumping area and remainder of cargo was drowned by 1350k that day. "Woomera" passed through Sydney Heads at 1550k and secured alongside Central

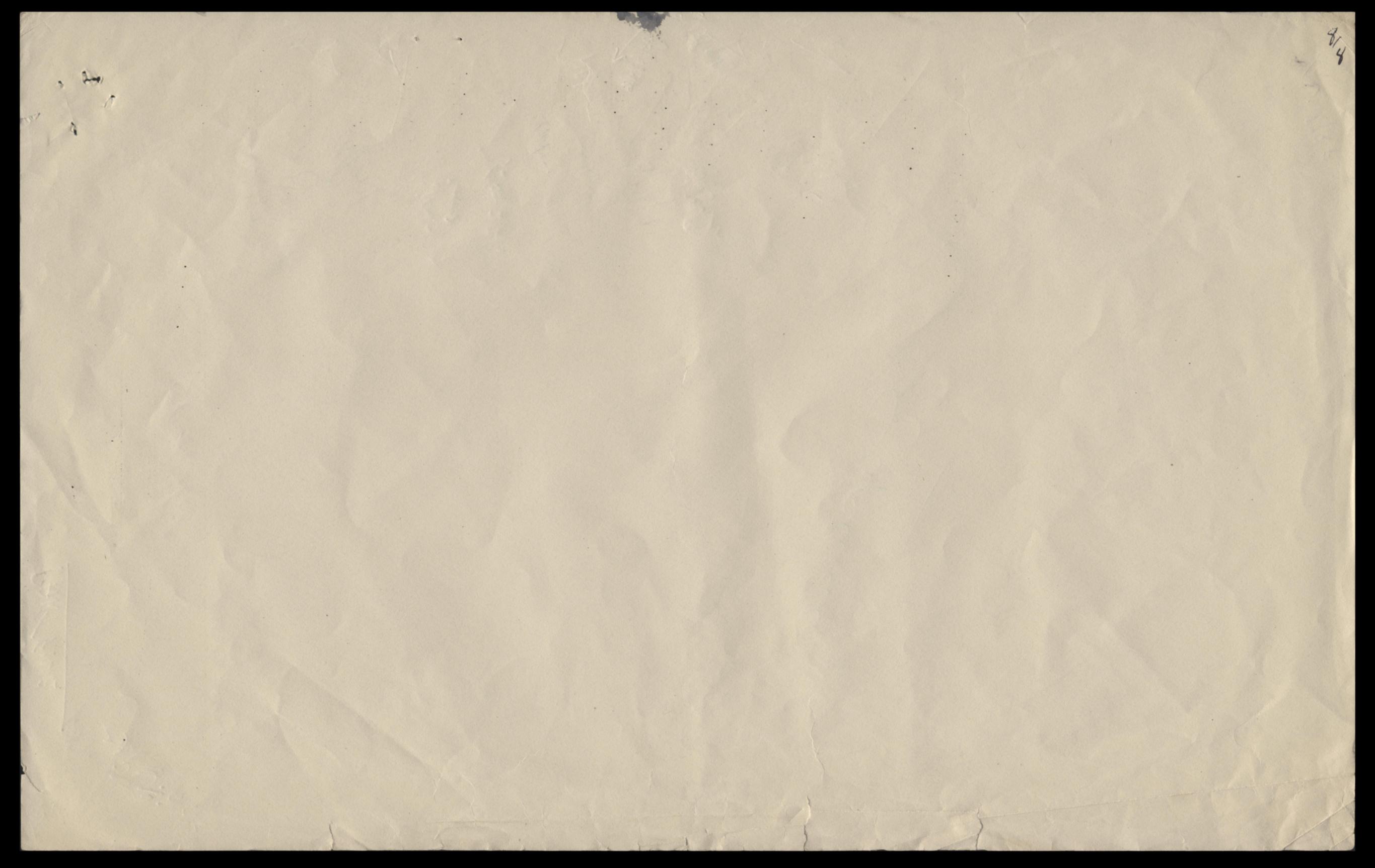

1. DUMPING.

7. DUMPING AREA TO WILLIAMSTOWN.

After cleansing ship of anti-verm and unrigging derricks and gear, ship weighed and proceeded at 1435k/18th. April, arriving at Port Phillip Heads at 0630k/19th. April and proceeded to Williamstown via the West Channel. Ship berthed at 1130k/19th. April alongside H.M.A.S. "Rockhampton" at inner West berth Nelson Pier. At 1513k/19th. April ship was shifted to cross berth between Nelson and Reid Street piers.

PROCEEDINGS OF H.M.A.S. "WOOMERA" FOR THE MONTH OF APRID CONTINUED WILLIAMSTOWN. 8. "Woomera" remained at Williamstown from 1130k/19th. April until 1050k/2nd. May. LOADING. The loading of 340 barrels of anti-verm and 50 tons o 2 pounder shot was commenced at 0830k/24th. April and completed at 1135k/30th. April. CONDITION OF THE SHIP. 10. Condition of the ship is satisfactory except for items listed in A & A and Defect lists already submitted and due for rectification in the proposed refit. The adding of an A.B. L.T.O. to the ship's scheme of complement has overcome the difficulty experienced with the electric winches and mass of electrical equipment installed. Running gear has undergone quite a lot of stress and strain owing to the type of work carried out and conditions prevailing. Some of it has already been renewed but the remainder will last for some time yet. Ship is in urgent need of painting according to Naval Specifications, but until dumping og all antiverm is completed, this is not deemed practicable, owing to the corrosive nature of the chemical. Ship's bottom which is very foul, will be scraped and cleaned during refit. HEALTH OF THE SHIP'S COMPANY. Health of the Ship's Company remains good, and no ill effects from handling of anti-verm were noted. WELFARE. 12. In harbour Ship's Company avail themselves of the usual amenities of the port. The Mission to Seaman, Williamstown has catered for the welfare of the Ship's Company and also supplied some sporting gear. The Head Branch Of the Mission to Seaman, Melbourne and the Australian Comforts Fund have supplied the Ship with two radio sets and sportin gear. MAIN ENGINES AND AUXILARY MACHINERY. 13. During the month the main engines have performed satisfactorily and the only work done on these been through fair wear and tear, these defects are listed as follows. On Monday 8th. April circulating water pump on the starboard main engine was overhauled and on Thursday 11th. April the circulating water pump on the port main engine was overhauled, both were taken in hand whilst alongside the wharf at Williamstown, Whilst starting the starboard main engine prior to leaving Murray Passage, Kent Group on Tuesday 16th April the exhaust valve stem in no. 4 cylinder was found to be stuck down, due to carbon deposits on the valve stem, this was replaced by the ship's staff in three quarters of an haour. Whilst in Williamstown on Tuesday 23rd. April the circulating water pump relief valve springs on the port and starboard main engines were found to be broken, thesee were taken out and new springs ordered through Base Engineer Officer on Fraday 26th April. The Southern Cross has shown satisfactory performance during this month, but on Monday 1st. May the starter motor was found to be defective and is to be repaired by Base Engineer Officer's Staff. As was shown in the previous months report the circulating water pump on the Ruston and Hornsby Generator was defective and in Base Engineer Officers hands, This was taken in hand on Fridat 5th. April and installed on Saturday 13th April by Williamstown Depot workshop. Whilst repacking the pump on 18th. April the suction pipe of the pump was found to be broken at the flange and this was repaired by the ship's Staff.
