

HMAS BETANO - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - JANUARY 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of January 1976.
- At 0001, 1st January 1976 HMAS BETANO was berthed starboard side to HMAS BALIKPAPAN, no. 7 berth, HMAS MORETON at 8 hours notice for main engines. At 0815 Wednesday 7th January, BETANO cast off and proceeded to Moreton Bay to complete the P.R.T. The Ship anchored at Tangalooma at 1212 and several beach surveys were carried out as part of the P.R.T. At 1840 Wednesday 7th January 1976, the Ship weighed and proceeded to Moreton Bay for an independent night steam. At 2100 that night the starboard gearbox was found to be overheating. In view of the recent defects affecting the starboard main engine and gearbox, another URDEF was raised (HMAS BETANO KOO/DAJO71005Z refers) and the Ship returned to MORETON, recurring at no. 7 berth starboard mide to HMAS BALIKPAPAN at 2359, Wednesday 7th January. The Ship reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines and normal leave was granted to the Ship's company.
- 3. BETANO carried out basin trials from 1455 until 1510, Thursday 8th January and proceeded to Moroton Bay for engine trials at 1340 Monday 12th January. These were successfully completed at 1623 that day and the Ship returned to MORETON at 1855. Twenty nine (29) Naval Reserve Cadets (from T.S. GAYUNDAH) were embarked for the duration of engine trials and were familiarised with life on an LCH. BETANO remained at no. 7 berth until 0700 Thursday 15th January.
- 4. BETANO sailed in company with HMAS BALIKPAPAN for Moreton Bay at 0700 Thursday 15th January to complete her P.R.T. At 0924 BALIKPAPAN was detached and BETANO proceeded to sea via the North East channel. At 1147 gun crews were closed up and a .50 calibre firing exercise was commenced. The surface target was sunk by .50 cal fire at 1238 and BETANO proceeded back to Tangalooma, anchoring there at 1516, Thursday 15th January. During the night several NBCD exercises were carried out.
- 5. At 0800 Friday 16th January colours were half masted for the late Tun Abdul Razak, Prime Minister of Malaysia. Several NBCD lectures were presented to the Ship's Company and at 0923 Friday 16th January, BETANO

weighed anchor and proceeded to Moreton Bay for OOW ship handling exercises. Shortly after arriving in Moreton Bay the weather rapidly deteriorated and BETANO returned to MORETON with BALIKPAPAN in company. The ship berthed starboard side to HMAS WEWAK at 1234 and BALIKPAPAN berthed outboard at 1305 Friday 16th January.

- BETANO remained at no. 6 berth until 0841. Thursday 22nd January 1976 when it cast off and proceeded to no. 2 berth Dalger's wharf to embark army stores for Townsville. Loading operations were completed at 1245 and the Ship returned to no. 7 berth starboard side to BALIKPAPAN at MORETON at 1255 Thursday 22nd January 1976.
- 7. At 1035 Friday 23rd January 1976 BETANO cast off and proceeded to sea bound for Port Alma. The passage to Port Alma was uneventful except for the presence of a moderate easterly swell caused by cyclone David. BETANO anchored over COD SHOAL at 1840 Saturday 24th January 1976 and remained there until 0300 Sunday 25th January when anchor was weighed.
- 8. At 0930 Sunday 25th January the ship berthed starboard side to Port Alma wharf and reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines. The berthing party was provided by 30 Naval Reserve Cadets from T.S. ROCKHAMPTON. BETANO was open for inspection by the Naval Reserve Cadets until 1700 Sunday 25th January.
- 9. At 0636 BETANO cast off and proceeded for passage up the Fitzroy River to Rockhampton. The local Harbour Marter, Mr. John Ungent and his launch Master, Mr. Rod Oberg, had been embarked and acted as pilots for the passage.
 25 NR cadets from T.S. ROCKHAMPTON were also embarked. The passage up the Fitzroy River was uneventful even though the river had been closed to navigation for some four years and was in flood owing to heavy rains which had fallen recently. Most navigational beacons had been recently restored by the Harbour and Marine department.
- 10. BETANO anchored in the Rockhampton City Beach at 1201 Monday 26th January, bows upstream. At 1000 Tuesday 27th January, I called on the Mayor of Rockhampton, Alderman Rex Pilbeam and at 1100 I called on the Superintendant of Police, Central Queensland district, Superintendant E. Clifford.
- 11. At 0630 Wednesday 28th January 1976 the Harbour master, Mr. John Nugent was embarked and at 0706 BETANO weighed and proceeded downstream for Port Alma. A comprehensive beach survey was carried out at Thompson's Point, Fitzroy river by utilizing the ship's boat and an army assault craft. The Ship berthed starboard side to Port Alma wharf at 1205 Wednesday 28th January 1976 and reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines.
- 12. At 0720 Thursday 29th January 1976 BETANO cast off and proceeded to Seahill Pt, Port Alma. 20 personnel from the 42nd Reval Queensland Regiment and 20 Naval Reserve Cadets were embarked at 0700 that morning for passage to Sabina Pt, Shoalwater Bay but in view of the inclement prevailing weather conditions the passage was aborted. At 0840 Thursday 29th January BETANO anchored at Seahill Pt and landed elements from 42 RQR, using the two army assault craft embarked for that purpose. The landing was successfully completed by 0900 and all army personnel were re-embarked by 0905. BETANO weighed anchor and returned to Port Alma, disembarking all army and NRC personnel there and at 1110 Thursday 29th January sailed for Mackay.

13. At 1210 Thursday 29th January the weather had worsened considerably and BETANO returned to Port Alma, securing starboard side to Port Alma Wharf at 1444. The Ship reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines and remained at Port Alma Wharf until 2359 Saturday 31st January 1976 awaiting more favourable weather conditions.

14. Technical

One URDEF was raised during the month of January which has been rectified with base staff assistance. The electrical state of BETANO remains satisfactory.

15. General

The health and welfare of the ship's company is very good and their morale is excellent.

HMAS BETANO - REFORT OF FROCEEDINGS FEBRUARY 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of February 1976.
- 2. At 0001 Sunday, 1st February, 1976 HMAS BETANO was starboard side to Fort Alma wharf at 8 hours notice for main engines. By Monday, 2nd February, 1976 the inclement weather conditions responsible for the ship's prolonged stay at Port Alma, had abated considerably and at 1046 that day BETANO cast off and proceeded for Townsville.
- 3. At 2359 Monday, 2nd February, Operational Control was chopped to HMAS CAIRNS, but at 0715 Tuesday, 3rd February, Operational Control was reverted back to MOC.QLD owing to manpower problems at HMAS CAIRNS caused by severe flooding in that area. The passage to Townsville was uneventful except for frequent heavy tropical rain squalls which at times reduced visibility to 1/4 of a mile or less. The performance of the Decca 101 radar in those conditions was very pleasing indeed.
- 4. Owing to rapidly worsening weather conditions BTTANO entered Townsville harbour at 0305 Wednesday, 4th February, some six hours earlier than planned. The ship secured port side to No. 2 berth at 0341 and reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines. At 0830 cargo operations commenced and 17 Army connexes were disembarked. Six Army 5-ton trucks were embarked and loading operations were completed by 1430 that day.

- 5. BETANO cast off and proceeded for Mackay at 1147
 Thursday, 5th February, 1976. Shortly after departing
 Townsville harbour a 16-ft outboard craft at anchor was
 . sighted with no apparent personnel visible on board.
 Engines were stopped and the ship proceeded to close the
 craft for further investigation using the whistle to attract
 attention. After some five minutes, two divers were observed
 on the surface and making towards the craft. Both divers
 boarded the craft and made out that they were alright; after
 which BETANO proceeded on her proper course. Townsville
 Harbour Control was kept informed of the incident via VHF
 as the craft was anchored within Townsville Harbour limits.
 It is noteworthy that the craft was not manned during diving
 operations nor were the proper International Code flags for
 such an operation displayed.
 - 6. After clearing the Whitsunday Passage at 0351, Friday 6th February, 1976, the sea state was such that speed had to be reduced to 6 knots and the ship experienced severe rolling on her proper course. At 0759, BETANO came to anchor at Maryport anchorage to await more favourable weather conditions before proceeding on to Mackay. At 0903 Friday, 6 February, the weather had abated sufficiently and BETANO weighed and proceeded to Mackay, arriving at Mackay Outer Harbour at 1120. At 1135 BETANO secured port side to the North Wharf and reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines. This berth offered little shelter against the prevailing weather and at 1711 Saturday, 7th February, berth was shifted to Loves Jetty, Mackay Outer Harbour.
 - 7. Exercise "BLUE BELLS", a disaster exercise involving BETANO and units of the 42nd Royal Queensland Regiment was scheduled to take place on Sunday, 8th February, but had to be cancelled due to the inclement weather experienced that day. From 1800 until 2000 Monday, 8th February, 1976. An official cocktail party was held onboard HMAS BETANO for local dignitaries. Unfortunately weather conditions were such that only half of the official guests could attend.
- 8. At 0843 Tuesday, 10th February, 1976 BETANO shifted berth back to the North Wharf to embark fuel and at 0812 Wednesday, 11th February, 1976 the ship cast off and proceeded for Brisbane, the weather having abated sufficiently.
- 9. The passage to Brisbane remained uneventful until 1130 Thursday, 12th February, 1976 when a rising swell and falling barometer gave indication of a predicted complex low pressure area off Fraser Island. Course was altered for Bundaberg and the ship entered the Burnett River at 1415. At 1451 Thursday, 12th February, BETANO secured starboard side to the Sugar Wharf, Fort Bundaberg, and reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines.

- 10. On receipt of favourable weather forecast, BETANO cast off and proceeded for Brisbane at 1800, Friday, 13th February. The passage to Brisbane was made at 6 knots due to high seas and a 20-30 knots South Easterly wind.
- 11. At 1845 Saturday, 14th February, 1976, the ship entered Moreton Bay via the North West channel and at 2303 secured starboard side to HMAS WEWAK at No. 7 berth, HMAS MORETON.
- 12. At 1000 Monday, 16th February, BETANO sailed for Bulimba to disembark Army cargo but due to unfavourable wind conditions the beaching at Bulimba was aborted and the ship returned to HMAS MORETON, berthing at No. 7 berth at 1123 that day. At 0728 Wednesday, 18th February, the ship again sailed for Bulimba and at 0815 beached there to unload six 5-ton trucks. At 0916 the ship retracted and returned to MORETON, securing there at No. 7 berth at 0939, starboard side to HMAS WEWAK.
- 13. At 0800 Monday, 23rd February, BETANO commenced her Assisted Maintenance and Leave Period. BETANO cast off and changed berths with HMAS WEWAK at 0855 Tuesday, 24th February. BETANO remained at No. 5 berth for the remainder of the month of February.

14. TECHNICAL

The electrical and engineering state of BETANO remains satisfactory.

15. GENERAL

The health and welfare of the ship's company is very good and their morale is excellent.



HMAS BETANO - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS MARCH 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of March, 1976.
- 2. At 0001, Monday 1st March, 1976, BETANO was starboard side to No. 5 berth at HMAS MORETON, undergoing an Assisted Maintenance and Leave Period. The A.M.P. progressed satisfactorily and at 1450, Thursday, 18th March, 1976, basin trials were carried out alongside HMAS MORETON.
- At 0800, Monday 22nd March, 1976, BETANO completed her AMP and again became operational. The ship remained at No. 5 berth HMAS MORETON until 0805 Monday, 29th March, 1976, when it cast off and proceeded to Sydney via Newcastle.
- 4. The passage to Newcastle was marred by a force 5 wind and high seas causing the ship to reduce to 6 knots for six hours. During the afternoon of Tuesday, 30th March both the ship's main and standby HF equipment became unserviceable and the ship's P.I.M. was finally cleared through a passing British Merchant ship, call sign GHDQ, using VHF at 2050K Tuesday, 30th March.

- 5. At 0318 Wednesday, 31st March 1976, BETANO anchored off Newcastle heads and reverted to 30 minutes notice for main engines. At 0536 the ship weighed and proceeded to Newcastle harbour, beaching at Horseshoe Beach at 0604. Three Army Larc V's were embarked and at 0627 BETANO retracted and proceeded to Sydney.
- 6. After a smooth passage BETANO berthed starboard side to at No. 2 berth, HMAS WATERHEN at 1400 Wednesday, 31st March, 1976.

Technical

The engineering state of BETANO remains satisfactory. The electrical state is good although two Urdefs were raised during the month. Both of these pertained to the ship's HF equipment. (HMAS BETANO KOD/DAJ 310410Z MARCH 76 and KOD/DAJ 310412Z MARCH 76 refer).

General

8. The health and welfare of the ship's company is very good and their morale remains excellent.

HMAS BETANO - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS APRIL 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of April 1976.
- 2. At 0001 Thursday, 1st April, 1976, HMAS BETANO was starboard side to No. 2 berth HMAS WATERHEN at 8 hours notice for main engines. At 0830 BETANO proceeded to Woolwich hard where the ship was beached to disembark cargo. The ship retracted and berthed at Woolwich Wharf for embarkation of cargo. With the embarkation of cargo completed BETANO proceeded to No. 2 berth HMAS WATERHEN securing then at 1650.
- 3. HMAS BALIKFATAN was berthed outboard at 0830 on Friday 2nd April and cast off at 1300. HMAS BETANO departed Sydney at 0830, Tuesday, 6th April for passage to Brisbane. During the passage the ship experienced weather conditions which aided the ship in her northerly passage. On Thursday, 8th April, at 1006 BETANO beached at Bulimba ramp to disembark cargo. With cargo operations completed BETANO retracted and commenced passage to Townsville at 1620 6th April.

- The passage to Townsville was uneventful and the weather was predominantly fine with prevailing force 4 southerly winds. BETANO berthed port side to No. 2 wharf Townsville at 0935 Sunday, 11th April. Cargo operations commenced at 0815 and were completed at 1540 Monday, 12th Arril. BETANO cast off No. 2 Wharf and proceeded on passage from Townsville to Cairns at 1038 on Tuesday, 13th April. At 1800 the ship anchored at Kennedy Shoal for 32 hours to attain ETA at Cairns. During this interval the ship's company were rermitted to hold a fishing competition. At 2129 the ship proceeded to Cairns anchoring north of the entrance beacons from 0530 to 0713 Wednesday, 14th April. BETANO berthed starboard side to No. 2 Wharf Cairns at 0800 Wednesday, 14th April. On completion of cargo and fuelling operations HMAS BETANO cast off from No. 2 wharf and berthed starboard side to HMAS FLINDERS at 1145 14th April and reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines.
- At 0958 Monday, 19th April, HMAS BETANO cast off from HMAS FLINDERS for passage to Brisbane. The inclement weather conditions were responsible for the seeking of safe anchorages. The wind was predominantly south-east gusting to force 7 and the swell from the same direction peaking at 10 feet. The ship was anchored in the North East Bay of Great Palm Island at 0216 Tuesday, 20th April. At 0638 anchor was weighed and the passage was commenced after favourable weather reports. BETANO was anchored at 0259 Wednesday, 21st April at Kennedy Sound in the lee of Shaw Island reverting to 8 hours notice for main engines. Whilst sheltering, short leave was granted to the ship's company.
- on Sunday, 25th April at 1100 the passage to Brisbane was resumed. At 1200 heavy seas were encountered and shelter was sought in the lee of Carlisle Island at Maryport Anchorage.

 BETANO was beached at Brampton Island for hull inspection and painting, the ship returned to Maryport Anchorage at 0830 Tuesday, 27th April.
- 7. Due to Cyclone Watorea warnings being issued (COMAUSLANCRON ONE SIG FEO 272330Z AFR 76) BETANO sought shelter in Cid Harbour, anchoring at 1344 Wednesday, 28th April. At 2223 BETANO proceeded to the aid of CORAL STAR after operational control was assumed by NOC.QLD and signal (NOC QLD SIG KAO 280854Z APR 76) was received authorising BETANO to respond. BETANO continued passage to Brisbane upon receipt of signal (NOC QLD SIG KAO 282114Z AFR 76) stating that the foundered vessel no longer required assistance.
- 8. Due to rising sea and swell BETANO anchored in West Bay of Middle Island at 1332 Thursday, 29th April reverting to one hour's notice for main engines. Anchor was weighed at 1602 29th April, the weather having eased considerably. Weather conditions increased to force 6 after rounding Breaksea Spit at 2100 Friday, 30th April. At 2359 Friday, 30th April, BETANO was 278°, 8 miles from Breaksea Spit Light on passage to Brisbane.

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Shir under my command during the month of May 1976.
- 2. At 0001K Saturday 01 May, 1976, BETANO was at 24 35 S 153 21 E proceeding for shelter in the lee of Fraser Island en route Cid Harbour to Brisbane. At 0600K BETANO altered course to anchor in the lee of Lady Elliott Island at 0805K remaining at immediate notice for main engines. BETANO weighed anchor at 1340K Saturday 01 May after the weather had abated and the passage was continued. However, the weather again deteriorated and by 0300K Sunday, 2nd May the wind was force 6 with high seas. The ship continually rolled 40° either side of the vertical.
- 3. At 1504K Sunday, 2nd May, BFTANO entered Moreton Bay via North West Channel. The ship secured starboard side to HMAS BRUNEI, No. 6 berth HMAS MORETON at 2040K Sunday, 2nd May. She remained at No. 6 berth until Friday 7th May during which time main engines and radar urdefs were rectified. At 0847K Friday, 7th May, 1976 BETANO cast off to allow BRUNNI to proceed resecuring to No. 5 berth HMAS MORETON at 0915K. At 1255K BETANO cast off and proceeded to Bulimba Hard to commence loading cargo for Townsville. The ship retracted at 1710K and secured at No. 5 berth HMAS MORETON reverting to 8-hours notice for main engines.

- 4. At 0801K Saturday, 8th May BETANO cast off No. 5 berth HMAS MORPTON and proceeded to sea for passage to Townsville. At 1740K Sunday, 9th May, in the vicinity of Great Keppel Island, the ship effected a rendezvous with HMAS BRUNEI. BETANO assumed OTC and guide and BRUNTI stationed 1000 yards astern. At 1754K BDTANO experienced a steering gear failure and BRUNTI assumed guide. At 2220K automatic steering was restored. At 1100K Monday, 10th May, operational control was chopped to HMAS CAIRNS. At 1353K a highline transfer was carried out with BRUNTI to pass spare parts for the defective radar in HMAS BITANO. Transfer was completed at 1407K.
 - 5. BETANO and BRUNEI beached at Pallarenda Beach at 0905K Tuesday, 11 May and due to the unfavourable conditions at the beach, BETANO retracted and secured alongside No. 2 wharf Townsville at 1047K reverting to 8-hours notice for main engines. BRUNEI remained on the beach to unload ammunition, sailing for Townsville on completion. Cargo operations were completed by 1500K Tuesday, 11th May.
 - At 2000K Wednesday, 12th May, BTTANO cast off and proceeded to Darwin with FRUNEI in company. During the passage the weather was fine with the predominant S.E. wind aiding passage. Underway replenishment approaches and 00W manoeuvres were carried out with ERUNTI throughout the passage. Operational control was chopped to NOCNY at 1600K Saturday, 15 May. At 1630 clocks were retarded half an hour to Zone IK.
 - At 1311 IK Tuesday, 18th May, BTTANO berthed at No. 1 berth Stokes Hill wharf reverting to 8 hours notice for sea. At 1325 IK BRUNEI secured port side to BETANO. At 1200 IK Wednesday, 19th May, BRUNEI cast off and proceeded to Larakea Hard returning at 2030 IK. At 1337 IK Thursday, 20th May, BRUNEI held clear while BETANO cast off and proceeded to beach at Larakea Hard. The ship dried out during cargo operations and retracted at 1830. She berthed alongside BRUNEI at 1917 Thursday, 20th May, and reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines.

BETANO weighed anchor at 0605 Tuesday, 25th May and commenced passage to Princess Charlotte Bay. BRUNEI effected a rendezvous with BETANO in the vicinity of Cape Don at 1738 Tuesday, 25th May. BETANO assumed the duty of OTC and stationed BRUNEI 1000 astern.

At 0300 Wednesday, 26th May, the sea state increased to Force 6 proportions and shelter was sought in the loc of Cape Croker, BETANO and ERUNEI anchored in the lee of Cape Croker at 0712 Wednesday, 26th May. BETANO reverted to 8 hours notice for main engines. At 0812 Thursday, 27th May, BETANO weighed anchor and proceeded to Princess Charlotte Bay in company with BRUNEI. At 0834 BETANO experienced a steering breakdown, which was rectified by 0837. BETANO and BRUNEI proceeded to Malay Bay independently after experiencing Force 6 weather at 0933 Thursday, 27th May. HMAS BITANO - REIORT OF PROCEDINGS JULY 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of July 1976.
- 2. At 0900K Tuesday, 20th July I assumed command, whilst the ship was on passage from Scawfell Island to the Percy Islands group.
- 3. At 0001 Thursday, 1 July, 1976 BETANO was alongside the Boom Wharf, Darwin Harbour at eight hours notice for sea. At 1415 that day BTTANO cast off to prepare for the intended beaching at Larrakeyah hard but due to unfavourable tidal currents at the time, this was cancelled and the ship berthed alongside Stokes Hill wharf at 1615.
- 4. At 1258 Friday, 2nd July, when conditions were more favourable the ship cast off and proceeded to Larrakeyah, beaching at 1320 and on completion of cargo operations, retracted and proceeded on passage to Townsville. At 2030 that evening BETANO rendervoused with HMAS BRUNFI (1EUT N.H.V. COBB, RAN) in the Vernon Islands area and proceeded in company to an anchorage at Cope Don where BRUNFI landed the Lighthouse maintenance party.

- 5. At 0655 Saturday, 3rd July BTTANO weighed and proceeded in company with HMAS BRUNTI on passage across the Gulf of Carpentaria experiencing heavy South Fasterly weather en route.
- 6. At 1259 Tuesday, 6th July, a defect in the starboard engine blower drive resulted in BETANO detaching HMAS BRUNEI and proceeding to Thursday Island, berthing at 1635 to await the arrival of spares from Brisbane (URDIF 73/76 refers). BETANO cast off and proceeded from Thursday Island wharf at 0700 Friday an anchor in the harbour to carry out repairs to the starboard main engine. The repairs and trials were successfully completed Saturday evening and at 0703 Sunday, 11th July the ship weighed and sailed for Townsville. During the next two days on passage through the Barrier Reef, BETANO exchanged identities with HMAS FART AMATTA and HMAS BARBITTE arriving at Townsville 0617 Morday, 14th July securing port side to No. 7 wharf.
- 7. To facilitate cargo operations the ship moved to No. 2 wharf and on completion at 1552 Thursday 15th sailed for Port Clinton. Due to the inclement weather encountered on passage BIT/NO anchored in Cid Harbour at 0715 Friday, 16th and at 1405 proceeded alongside South Molle Island wharf securing at 1745.
- 8. At 1530 Saturday, 17th July, I joined BETANO at South Molle Island for the rassage to Brisbane via South Arm Creek, Fort Clinton.
- 9. At 0955 Monday, 19th July, BITANO cast off and proceeded but again due to unfavourable weather was forced to seek shelter in the lee of Scawfell Island anchoring at 1730. At 0637 Tuesday, the ship weighed and proceeded to West Bay in the Percy Islands group to enable the arrival at Port Clinton to be made during daylight hours.
- 10. BETANO weighed at 0457 and in moderating weather, proceeded to the hard in South Arm Creek, arriving at 1353 and on completion of loading cargo at 1440, sailed for Brisbane. On arrival at Bulimba hard at 1334 on 23rd July, BTTANO disembarked the heavy earthmoving equipment and secured alongside HMAS BRUNEI at HMAS MORETON wharf at 1440.
- 11. The Assisted Maintenance Teriod commenced on Monday, 26th July, and although a week late in commercing, has resolved a considerable number of outstanding minor defects and assisted planned maintenance programs. On Tuesday, 27th July, BETANO was cold moved alongside HMAS MORETON wharf to assist the maintenance program and HMAS ERUNEI secured alongside at 1220.
- 12. At 2359 Saturday, 31st July, BETANO was starboard side to HMAS MORITON wharf at eight hours notice for sea.

13. TECHNICAL

RADAR - The DECCA Super 101 radar remains unserviceable and is being worked on by Base Staff (URDEF 71/76 refers).

Starboard Main Engine - Tolerarces on the main engine blower were excessive and both are being replaced. (URDIF 73/76 refers)

Magnetic Compass - The casing was fractured by vibration is being replaced (INDEF 64/76 refers).

Outboard Motor - was surveyed by Base Staff and is being replaced.



HMAS BETANO - REFORT OF PROCEDINGS AUGUST 1976

Sir,

- I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of July 1976.
- At 0001 Sunday 1st August BETANO was alongside at HMAS MORETON undergoing an Assisted Maintenance period which continued until 1030 Thursday 12th August when the ship sailed for Bulimba Hard, Brisbane River to embark a cargo of empty amnunition boxes for Sydney. On completion of loading the ship returned alongside at MORETON, berthing outboard of HMAS WEWAK at 1403.
- At 0623 Friday 13th August the ship sailed to Dalgety's wharf to load two containers and then proceeded in company with HMAS BRUNEI and HMAS LABUAN to a rendezvous with HMAS TARAKAN south of Peel Island Noreton Bay to await the arrival of the Fleet Commander. At 1225 RADM G.V. GLADSTONE, RAM. A.O., D.S.C. and Bar, arrived and after inspecting the ship was piped ashore for transit to HMAS BRUNEI. After weighing at 1405 the ship proceeded to Sydney via the Rainbow Channel South Passage, Moreton Bay.
- 4. At 1610 that afternoon AN/GRC 106 LF radio became unserviceable (my URDEF 74/76 refers) and BTTANO returned to Brisbane where the radio was exchanged with a serviceable unit from HMAS BRUNEI and on completion sailed for Sydney at 0155 Saturday, 14th August.

- 5. After two days of very rough weather the ship arrived in Sydney securing alongside the Fatrol boat wharf HMAS WATERHEN at 2020 Monday, 16th August.
- 6. At 0637 Tuesday 17th BTTANO proceeded to Woolwich to disembark cargo and load heavy equipment for the amphibious landing demonstration rehearsal at Balmoral Beach Hunters Bay. The rehearsal commenced at 1020 and on its completion BTTANO returned to HMAS WATERHEN, securing alongside at 1322. At 0914 Wednesday, the ship again sailed to Hunters Bay for the second day of the rehearsals involving 8 LARC, MK V 1 LCM 8 1 LCM 6 and heavy cargo moving equipment. BTTANO sailed to Hunters Bay at 0856 Thursday for the demonstration to the members of the Joint Services Staff Course and personnel from the Portsea Officers Training College and on completion proceeded alongside Chowder Bay Wharf.
- 6. At 1330 BFTANO was detached and proceeded to Woolwich embarking heavy earthmoving equipment and on completion at 1447 sailed via HMAS WATERHEN for Brisbane. During the fine weather experienced on passage a small arms shoot, internal NBCD drills and preparations for the Annual inspection in September were carried out. After passage through the Rous Channel, South Passage Moreton Bay and disembarking cargo at Bulimba, BFTANO secured alongside HMAS WEWAK at 1710 Saturday 21st August.
- 7. At 0930 Friday 27th August the ship sailed to Hamiltons Reach, Brisbane River to carry out a magnetic compass swing and practice beachings for LEUT I.J. PURNELL-WEBB, returning alongside HMAS BRUNEI at 1220.
- 8. BETANO sailed at 0736 Tuesday, 31st August, to participate in the initial practices for loading/unloading of helicopters into LCH's and to train personnel in directing and safety procedures. At 0905 that day ETTANO rendezvoused with HMAS TARAKAN to disembark personnel and stores before proceeding to Cleveland Bay where the trials commenced at 1025. On completion of trials that afternoon the ship proceeded to Redcliffe Jetty, arriving at 1719 and remaining alongside that evening at 8 hours notice for sea.

HMAS BETANO REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS SEPTEMBER 1976

Sir

I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of September 1976.

1. At 0001 1st September 1976 BETANO was alongside REDCLIFFE JETTY-MORETON BAY on the completion of the first day of helicopter/ICH loading/unloading trials and training with an RAN IRIQUOIS helicopter.

- 2. At 0802, 1st September BETANO proceeded from Redcliffe jetty to the anchorage in Cleveland Bay for the second day of helo training under the guidance of LCDR B J BOETCHER RAN. This was considered invaluable as continuation training for engineering staff and general update of firefighting and damage control drills in a situation not previously considered onboard. On completion of these drills at 1155 BETANO weighed and proceeded to HMAS MORETON, securing alongside No 6 Berth outboard of HMAS BRUNEI at 1528.
- 3. The annual inspection of books and procedures commenced at 1000 Thursday 2nd September and continued throughout the day with all departments being inspected.

 At 1000 Friday 3rd September the ships company was inspected at Divisions by CMDR R A J T ARUNDEL RAN, who on completion formally inspected the ship.
- 4. At 0700 Monday 6th September, BETANO sailed to the CLEVELAND BAY anchorage to commence Defence force trials directive No 377 with the RAAF and ARMY, which consisted of loading/unloading of equipment and stores by both CHINOOK and IRIQUOIS helicopters.

- 5. On completion of the first days trial, BETANO proceeded to alongside Redcliffe Jetty where post inspection maintenance and repairs to the bow door lifting gear was carried out.

 BETANO sailed at 0836 Tuesday 7th September to the anchorage and during the next three days, embarked/disembarked vehicles, weapons and fuel containers as required by the trials directive.

 On completion of the trials at 1308, Thursday 9th, BETANO weighed and proceeded to alongside HMAS MORETON at 1605.
 - 6. At 0936, Monday 13th September BETANO sailed for Sydney in company with HMA Ships TARAKAN, LABUAN and WEWAK arriving at 1601, Wednesday 15th September.
 - 7. On Thursday 16th September LEUT J A FALLON RAN assumed the duties of EXECUTIVE OFFICER from SBLT D NOLAN RAN.
 - 8. BETANO sailed to Woolwich hard at 0803 Friday 17 September to embark a cargo of vehicles and earthmoving equipment, returning alongside HMAS WATERHEN at 1130 on completion of loading.
 - 9. On Saturday morning at 0906, BETANO sailed from Sydney in company with HMA Ships BALIKPAPAN, TARAKAN, LABUAN and WEWAK for the movement of equipment for exercise Kangaroo Two.

 The passage north was calm and uneventful and BETANO secured alongside HMAS WEWAK at anchor in Port Alma Roads at 1517 Tuesday 21st September. At 0616 BETANO slipped and proceeded to alongside Port Alma wharf where cargo disembarkation by crane commenced at 0821. The cargo was unloaded by 0954 and at 1245 BETANO sailed in company with HMAS WEWAK for Brisbane.

 BETANO anchored in Moreton bay at 2140 Eburgday and at 0455 WWAK for

BETANO anchored in Moreton bay at 2140 Thursday and at 2155 HMAS WEWAK secured alongside. At 0735 Friday 24 September the ship weighed and proceeded to HMAS MORETON arriving at 0900 - remaining alongside until Thursday 30th September,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command during the month of November 1976.
- 2. At 0001 Monday 1st November, BETANO was alongside at HMAS Moreton undergoing an Intermediate Docking period at 48 hours notice for sea.
- 3. On Tuesday 2nd, Betano was refuelled as a fuel shortage in the Brisbane area was expected and 12600 gallons was embarked.
- 4. The second phase of fumigation was carried out during Friday 12th and although insect pests have never been a problem onboard it was a year since the last fumigation
- 5. Betano resumed an "in routine" status on Friday 19th November and on the successful completion of basin trials the Intermediate Docking and maintenance period was finished.
- 6. On Monday 22nd the ship commenced the first day of workup with a series of lectures and practical training alongside at HMAS Moreton. During the day equipment not worked on during the docking was tested and preparations were made for sailing the next day.
- Betano sailed at 1000 Tuesday 23rd for workup in Moreton Bay and during the day Action, Emergency and Leaving ship stations were exercised along with Fire, Medical and Damage control parties. Lectures and demonstrations on First Aid, Emergency Radio equipment and pyrotechnics were given en-route to Tangalooma beach Moreton Island where practice beachings were carried out.

- 8. On completion of the days activities Betano anchored off the entrance beacons at 1820 using a three point moor method.
- 9. The following morning the ship sailed for HMAS Moreton where on arrival RADM G R P C Branston CBE RN was embarked for passage to Bulimba for a demonstration of LCH beaching technique.

On completion of the beaching at 1130 Betano proceeded to HMAS Moreton remaining alongside overnight.

11. At 0700 Thursday 23 Betano sailed to carry out practice gunfirings and a pilotage exercise for all bridge watchkeepers.

At 0935 that day an oil pressure alarm on the port main engine sounded and on investigation it was found that the lubrication oil was diluted by fuel oil from several loose injector lines. The defect was rectified by ship staff and Betano proceeded to sea via the Rous channel to Area R696 for the 0.5 calibre gun firing.

- 13. At 1115 that morning the Starboard main engine alarm sounded and the engine shut down. On investigation it was discovered that the defect was beyond ships staff capabilities and Betano returned alongside HMAS Moreton for repairs. The defect was caused by a crankshaft big end bearing bolt not being correctly tensioned which came loose and caused major internal damage to the engine resulting in the engine being changed.
- 14. At 2359 30th November 1976 Betano was alongside HMAS Moreton for the replacement of the Starboard main engine at 8 hours notice for sea

Technical

15. All known defects have been rectified and all modifications were completed during the Intermediate docking.

General

16. The health and welfare of the ships company is good and their morale remains excellent. The majority of outstanding leave was taken during the docking period.



HMAS BETANO - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS DECEMBER 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMA Ship under my command for the month of December 1976.
- 2. At 0001 Wednesday 1st December Betano was alongside at HMAS MORETON undergoing the replacement of the Starboard Main Engine (My URDEF 76'76 refers) and an extended self maintenance period.
- 3. On the completion of the engine change and basin-trials at 1135 Tuesday 3rd, Betano proceeded up river for engine trials, returning alongside HMAS Moreton at 1214.
- 4. At 0845 Monday 6th, Betano cast off and proceeded to Bulimba hard where a cargo of "A" type containers and two trailers was embarked. On completion of loading at 1255 the ship retracted and sailed for Sydney via the Rous channel.
- 5. The passage south was calm and the opportunity was taken to carry out a small arms familiarization and firing.
- Wednesday and cargo unloading/loading commenced at 1030. The unloading of the 19 containers was completed at 1140 but the loading of 51 containers for Melbourne took 5½ hours as they were being shuttled from Moorebank to Woolwich. Betano retracted and sailed for Melbourne at 1725 that day

- 7. At 1416 Friday 10 December, the Starboard main engine shut down and upon investigation it was found that the turbo blower drive shaft had stripped the spline at one end. The shaft was reversed as a temporary repair and URDEF 78/76 raised for repairs in Melbourne.
- 8. Betano berthed alongside No 12 North Wharf at 0720 Saturday 11th December, and at 0800 proceeded to Webb dock shore where unloading commenced at 0950. The equipment provided for the task of unloading/loading proved to be inadequate and cargo operations were stopped at 1820 with approximately half the task completed. The CASE rough terrain forklift used has a max safe lift of 6000LB and many of the containers consigned for passage to Sydney weighed in excess of 4000KG. On Sunday 12th the forklift was unserviceable and as no replacement vehicle or spares were available an alternative method for cargo operations had to be found.
- 9. During the afternoon Monday 13th the Patrick Stevedoring Company was hired and work was to commence at 0730 Tuesday 14th December. At 0700 Tuesday Betano moved to No 23 Victoria Dock securing alongside at 0713 and after telephone approval, the loading commenced at 0935. The loading was completed at 1540 and Betano sailed for Sydney at 1635 with the load of containers and pallets.
- 10. A heavy beam swell was encountered on the SE Victorian coast and the Decca Radar went unserviceable that afternoon (URDEF 79/76 refers).
- 11. The ship beached on Woolwich hard Sydney at 0225 Friday 17th and unloading commenced at 0750. The unloading/loading was completed at 1200 and Betano proceeded to HMAS Waterhen to refuel and then alongside HMAS Brunei at the minesweeper wharf at 1300.
- 12. At 0900 Saturday 18th December, Betano sailed in company with HMAS BRUMEI for Brisbane and carried out 00W manoeuvres and small arms firing enroute. The Walker CHERUB III taffrail ship-log was streamed on the passage north and was found to be extremely accurate 0.9 mile/24 hours run.
- 13. Betano secured alongside HMAS Moreton outboard of HMAS BRUNEI remaining alongside until the 31 December at 8 hours notice for sea.

A hot gas by-pass was fitted when the main refridgeration system went unserviceable (URDEF 77/76)
Blower drive shaft was replaced (URDEF 78/76)
The Decca Radar defect was temporarily rectified in HMAS Waterhen and was rectified by base staff at HMAS Moreton (URDEF 79/76)

15. General

The health and welfare of the ships company is good although the uncertainty of the 1977 ships programme has caused some problems in leave and planning for several families.
