Sunday 1 October. 0700. Proceeded from ancherage in Cleveland Bay to No. 1 wharf, Townsville. Embarked free freight stores for Sydney.

Monday 2 October. 0800. Slipped from No. 1 wharf Townsville and proceeded to Sydney.

Friday 6 October. 0715. Secured alongside No. 8 wharf, Walsh Bay. 2115. Commenced coaling.

Saturday 7 October. 1300. Completed coaling.

Sunday 22 October. 1000. Slipped from No. 8 wharf, Walsh Bay, with cargo and 87 personnel for passage to Milne Bay and Madang.

Monday 30 October. 1050. Secured alongside Pontoon Wharf, Ladava, and commenced unloading cargo.







Subject LETTER OF PROCEEDINGS - H.M.A.S. "BUNGAREE"

Submitted for the information of the Naval Board, the following Letter of Proceedings for the month of September, 1944.

- 2. On the 1st. of the month the ship was alongside No.3 wharf, Walsh Bay, loading cargo for Milne Bay and Madang. The cargo was loaded in No.2 and No.3 holds by the Central Wharf Stevedoring Company. Loading completed P.M. 1 September, with approximately 2000 tons of cargo.
- 3. At 0900 on Saturday 2 September, "Bungaree" slipped from No. 3 wharf Walsh Bay on passage to Milne Bay. 87 personnel were carried for passage. The passage was uneventful, except for excessive rolling crossing the Coral Sea. This was due to the cargo being stowed low down in the ship, thus altering her heeling moment. An A.A. shoot with all weapons was carried out on passage.
- 4. At 1100 on Saturday 9 September, the ship anchored in B.10 berth, Milne Bay.
- 5. On Tuesday 12 September, ship shifted to Pontoon Wharf, and commenced unloading cargo. Atfirst, American coloured labour was used to unload, but this was found to be slow and unsatisfactory, so ship's personnel continued the unloading.
- On Thursday, berth was shifted to Lyal Wharf, which is partially collapsed, and could only take one truck at a time. Despite unpleasant weather conditions, and heavy rain, unloading was carried out continuously in watches.

 A large amount of the cargo consigned to, and landed in Milne Bay, was subsequently re-loaded for Madang. A large quantity of stores and vehicles for 2nd. Medical Receiving Station R.A.A.F. was loaded for Madang and 42 R.A.A.F. personnel embarked.
- 7. At 1100 Saturday 16 September, "Bungaree" slipped from Lyal Wharf and sailed for Madang.
- 8. At 0630 on Mondat 18 September, ship anchored in Madang Harbour.
- 9. At 1630 on Tuesday 19 September, ship proceeded alongside Madang Wharf and commenced unloading cargo with Army Docks Company labour. The co-operation and assistance rendered by all Services during unloading was most marked and greatly appreciated. On completion of unloading, free freight stores were embarked, and one ten ton crane for Milne Bay.
- 10. At 1000 on Monday 25 September, "Bungaree" slipped from wharf and sailed for Milne Bay, with 48 Naval and 48 Army personnel for passage.
- Ship "Richard Henry Dana" asking for assistance, as she was aground on Curtiss Reef. "Bungaree" closed and anchored close to Liberty Ship. Two grass lines and two manilla hawsers were passed, but owing to conflicting instructions in the Liberty Ship, she commenced heaving in our lines and I was forced to slip the ropes and......

and get clear, as the ship was in dangerous proximity to the reef. Salvage Tug "Tancred" and American transport "Stratford" had now arrived, so "Bungaree" proceeded to Milne Bay, asking "Tancred" to obtain our hawsers if possible, after salvage had been completed.

- 12. At 1340 on Wednesday 27 September, ship berthed at No. 4 wharf, Ahioma, and commenced loading free freight and armament stores. Loading was carried out by American Docks Company, who carried out the work quickly and efficiently, in marked centrast to our previous experience when coloured labour was used.
- 13. At 1200 on Thursday 28 September, "Bungaree" slipped from No. 4 wharf Ahioma, and sailed for Townsville, anchoring in Cleveland Bay at 2115 on Saturday 30 September.
- 14. The conduct of the Ship's Company has been very satisfactory, and the work of unloading at Milne Bay, under the most trying conditions, reflects credit on the personnel.

15. The health of the Ship's Company has been excellent.
