

HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - JANUARY 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship PERTH under my command for the month of January 1976. All times are zone LIMA (-11)
- 2. Throughout the month it ship has been berthed alongside HMAS STALWART at the EMS berth Garden Island undergoing a self maintenance period.
- 3. PERTH was duty standby for emergency destroyer from the beginning of the month until the 7th January.
- Higher ranks training for sailors attempting Command tests Part I and II has been conducted each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.
- On 30th January HMAS MELBOURNE challenged for the Fleet Sailing trophy, the Rawson Cup, held by PERTH. Each ship entered four dinghies and, after a close competition, PERTH retained the trophy.

MARINE ENGINEERING

- During this self maintenance and long leave period, maintenance by ships staff, as limited by leave, plus dockyard URDEF and INDEF work has been progressed.
- 7. A successful steam system auxiliaries functioning trial was carried out on 29th January.
- 8. Commander R.J. NATTEY INO RAN relieved Commander P.G.V. DECHANINEUX RAN as Marine Engineer Officer on 16th January.

- 9. Two URDEF's were raised during January. The first (224/75) reported a defective RF isolator in the GFCS radar AN/SPG-53A. This defect would have affected the programmed NGS Beacon mode trial. A replacement was obtained from HMAS BRISBANE (COMAUSTFLT KOD/OWR/DSM 200515Z JAN 76 refers) and the defect is now rectified.
- The second URDEF (225/74) concerned broken wiring insulation a Tartar high voltage power supply is being rectified by the Fleet aintenance Unit and will be completed in time for the set to work, eriod commencing 2nd February.
- 11. The health, welfare and conduct of the ships company are satisfactory. Living conditions onboard are satisfactory and material state of the ship is considered good.

HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - FEBRUARY 1976

1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship PERTH under my command for the month of February, 1976. All times are zone LIMA (-11).

- 2. At the beginning of February, PERTH lay along-side HMAS STALWART undergoing a self maintenance period, this period completed on Friday, 13th February.
- 3. On Thursday, 12th February Channel Seven television station filmed the opening sequences of the programme "This is your Life" onboard PERTH. The programme featured the life of Mr. David Burchell, who, among other things recovered relics from the wreck of the first HMAS PERTH in the Sunda Strait.
- On Friday, 13th February I had the pleasure of being entertained by you Sir, at luncheon.
- 5. On Monday, 16th February PERTH ammunitioned and at 1315 slipped the buoy and proceeded for the start of a three week work-up.
- 6. PERTH's training battle problem was held on Tuesday, 17th February off Port Jackson. On completion Dr. Brian Travers, the Naval Scientific Advisor joined for one days DDG familiarisation.
- 7. The ship berthed in Garden Island at 0830 Thursday, 19th February for the fitting of muzzle velocity measuring equipment for use during automacity trials.
- 8. On Friday, 20th February Major General C. Gurner, the Joint Service Medical Advisor accompanied by Surgeon Rear Admiral J.H.B. Cotsell spent two hours onboard as part of a general Naval familiarisation tour.
- 9. A group of 112 scouts from Kuringaii North Districts toured the ship during the afternoon of Sunday, 22nd February.

- 10. At 1000 Monday, 23rd February PERTH sailed to carry out automacity firing trials for Australian manufactured 5"/54 powder cases. Initial reports indicate that the trial was successful.
- 11. As PERTH was programmed to return to Garden Island the same day, the opportunity was taken to embark a WRAN officer and five WRANS for sea familiarisation.
- 12. At 1700 Tuesday, 24th February, PERTH commenced an internal security exercise. After landing shore parties PERTH commenced patrolling the coast off Jervis Bay. That evening the ship conducted a bombardment and the next morning a surface firing, both in a tactical setting.
- 13. On Thursday, 26th February PERTH, after embarking observers, carried out trials on the use of an I band transponder during bombardment. The trial appeared successful with accurate fire being brought down on each run.
- 14. PERTH secured alongside Garden Island at 1330 Friday, 27th February at the completion of Week Two of a three week work-up.

WEAPONS ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

The last two weeks of the self maintenance period (1st to 15th February) were mainly concerned with setting to work on ship's power after the two month Christmas leave period.

- 16. Equipment availability during the latter half of the month was high with the exception of intermittent faults in the NCDS UYK-7 computer and Tartar MFCS 2. The former is still infrequently present and the latter has been rectified.
- 17. Four URDEF's have been raised during February, of which three have been rectified. This leaves a total of four still outstanding, two awaiting stores and two still undergoing repair.
- 18. A meeting was held onboard on 9th February to discuss the conduct of Ship/Combat Data System Centre Link II trials. The trials have progressed in harbour and at sea for the remainder of the month with encouraging preliminary results.

MARINE ENGINEERING

19. Main and auxiliary machinery has operated satisfactorily over the period.

20. Considerable emphasis has been placed on training new members of the department. This task was made all the more urgent by the advent of a Training Battle Problem after only one day at sea and the onset of the Final Battle Problem and Inspection within one month.

GENERAL 21. The Welfare Committee met on three classions during February.

22. All nine ships divers qualified for February. Command Tests Parts I and II were held on Wednesday, 11th February.

HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - MARCH 1976

Sir,

- I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship PERTH under my command for the month of March, 1976. Times are Zone LIMA (-11) until 7th March, then Zone KILO (-10).
- 2. In the forenoon of Monday, 1st March I attended a meeting of Fleet Commanding Officers held under your auspices, Sir.
- 3. At 1340, 1st March PERTH cast off and with HMAS HOBART and HMAS STUART in company, proceeded from Sydney for the East Australian Exercise Areas.
- Because of strong winds, rough seas and poor visibility most of the exercises during the week involving aircraft were either cancelled or terminated early. At 1000, 3rd March PERTH anchored in Jervis Bay as the day's serials were cancelled.
- A Final Battle Problem was to have been conducted on Thursday 4th March but as the bad weather continued and aircraft were not available, this was postponed. Therefore, at 2200 3rd March, PERTH weighed and proceeded from Jervis Bay, berthing at Garden Island at 0830, 4th March.
- 6. A Joint Unit Course lecture period was held at the Australian Joint Anti Submarine School from 8th to 12th March. Five of my officers attended. This lecture period was to prepare for the JUC 96 exercise to be held in the Sydney/ Jervis Bay and Bass Strait areas.
- 7. Annual departmental inspections were conducted during the week 8th to 12th March by your Staff Officers, Sir.
- 8. On Friday, 12th March I attended the Australian Joint Anti Submarine School for the pre-exercise brief on the tactical phase of JUC 96.

- 9. At 0830, 15th March, as OTC Blue Forces, I held a pre-sailing exercise brief onboard PERTH which was attended by your Chief of Staff, Sir, and the Commanding Officers from HMAS STALWART and HMAS TORRENS.
- 10. At 0900 you embarked Sir and your flag was hoisted in HMAS PERTH where it remained until the 20th March.
- 11. At 0930 PERTH cast off with HMAS HOBART, TORRENS and STUART in company and the ships proceeded for the CASEX week of JUC 96.
- 12. On Thursday, 18th March at 1130 the Chief of the Defence Force Staff, General F.G. HASSETT, A.C., C.B., C.B.E., D.S.O., M.V.O., and the Chief of Air Staff, Air Marshall J.A. ROWLAND, D.F.C., A.F.C., B.E. embarked by helicopter for DDG familiarisation and to observe a submarine demonstration.
- 13. General Hassett and Air Marshall Rowland departed by helicopter at 1345 for HMAS OXIEY.
- 14. The CASEX week serials completed at 2300, 18th March and PERTH, HOBART, TORRENS, SWAN and STUART set course for Westernport, Victoria.
- 15. Fuelling of the five ships commenced at 0830, 20th March at Westernport but did not complete until 2015 due to delays in connecting up and the need for wire hawsers to be run ashore. Winds up to 40 knots off the fuelling berth all day made berthing difficult.
- 16. At 1500 that day, Sir, you embarked in HMAS TORRENS and your flag was struck in PERTH.
- 17. During departure from Westernport at 2158, whilst manoeuvering at slow speed to disembark the pilot, PERTH was set down on a starboard hand light buoy and parted its mooring cable. This has been reported seperately.
- 18. The tactical phase of JUC 96 commenced at 0800, 21st March. This phase was based on the protection of the Bass Strait oil fields and through shipping against surface and sub surface attack. PERTH gained good training value and several spirited surface actions at 33 knots were carried out against HMAS HOBART simulating a KASHIN (Soviet GLGM).
- 19. You, Sir, Embarked by helicopter at 1730 Monday 22nd March from HMAS TORRENS.
- 20. The tactical phase completed at 1200 on the 24th March. You, Sir, transferred to HMAS STATWART by indicapter and your flag was struck in PERTH at 1400. STALWART and FERTH the course for Hobart, Tasmania.
- 21. On Thursday, 25th March at 1040 PERTH berthed at Self's Point Jetty, River Derwent to fuel. On completion, PERTH shifted berth to Macquarie Wharf in Hobart, securing at 1610.
- 22. At 0900 on the 26th March you, Sir, arrived onboard to inspect PERTH's Ships Company at Divisions and afterwards to inspect the ship. Your inspection completed at 1200.

- 23. In the evening, HMAS STALWART and PERTH held a combined reception onboard STALWART hosted by you, Sir, for 80 guests.
- 24. On Saturday, 27th and Sunday, 28th the ship was opened to public inspection. A total of 1774 members of the public visited PERTH. Groups of Naval Reserves and Naval Reserve Cadets also visited over this period.
- At 0930 Monday 29th March, the Commanding Officer, HMAS STALWART and I accompanied you, Sir, on your call on His Excellency The Governor of Tasmania, Sir Stanley Burbury, K.B.E.
- 26. PERTH cast off at 1025, 29th March and in company with STALWART proceeded to the Bass Strait for Exercise SUBEX 76. PERTH participated in this exercise until 1100, 30th March when course was set for Port Adelaide.
- 27. The last day of March was spent enroute to Port Adelaide during which missile tracking, pre action calibration, windfind and machine gun firings were carried out.

MARINE ENGINEERING

28. The ship's main machinery has functioned satisfactorily during the month.

- 29. Following discussions with FMEO, the power limitation on the ship's main machinery was lifted. Subsequently, the ship worked up full power for tactical purposes during JUC 96. A two hour full power trial is planned for early April.
- 30. A Refit Planning conference was held at Garden Island on 9th March. The planning basis for the refit was agreed although the start date has now been delayed due to industrial turbulence at the dockyard.

31. Equipment availability during March was high, the only major problem being the Tartar missile launcher (GMIS MK13) which suffered two unrelated defects causing it to be unserviceable since early in the month.

32. Four URDEF's were raised during the month, of which two have been rectified. This leaves a total of five still outstanding, three awaiting stores from the U.S.A. and two still undergoing repair.

GENERAL

33. The Welfare Committee met on three occasions during March.

34. All ship's divers qualified during the month.

- Sydney for those fifty percent of the ships company are PERTH returned from the U.S.A.
- 36. Living conditions onboard are satisfactory and the material state of the ship is good.

HIAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - APRIL 1976

Sir,

I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's ustralian Ship PERTH under my command for the month of April, 1976.

At 0715 Thursday Ist April PERTH passed between the breakters of Outer Harbour and at 0815 secured to the Mobil Oil Wharf rt Adelaide river.

- The Naval Officer in Charge South Australia Commander W.K. Bird .A.N. called at 0945 and at IIOO berth was shifted to Number 2 aclaren Wharf, Port Adelaide.
- During the afternoon I5 officers from II Squadron RAAF were entertained to lunch and toured PERTH. Also that afternoon 6 technical officers from the Inspector of Naval Ordnance staff and 30 school children toured the ship.
- On Friday 2nd I attended, with two of my seaman officers, a wash-up of JUC96 held at the Australian Joint Anti Submarine School. II Squadron provided an ORION aircraft from RAAF EDINBURGH to HMAS AIBATROSS for this purpose.
- 6. On Friday evening, 2nd April, a reception was held onboard for some 80 guests.
- 7. The ship was open to public inspection on Sunday 4th April, 3IOO visitors came onboard. Additionally during the period at Port Adelaide I45 school children from four schools, 40 cubs and 30 police cadets toured the ship. Ships company visitors were estimated at 500.
- 8. At I500 Monday 5th April His Excellency the Governor of South Australia, Sir Mark Oliphant KEE FRS arrived onboard to inspect he NCDS and TARTAR equipment. His Excellency departed at I550.



- On Tuesday 6th April at IOOO PERTH cast off and proceeded out of Port Adelaide River. Course was set for Twofold Bay.
- 10. At 0858 Thursday 8th HMAS AWARE berthed alongside PERTH in Iwofold Bay and you, Sir, came onboard to observe PERTH's operational readiness evaluation. (ORE)
- II. The ORE was conducted throughout Thursday until 2245 when PERTH came to anchor in Jervis Bay for a brief wash up. Your staff disembarked by boat at 2315.
- 12. At 2325 PERTH weighed and proceeded with HMAS STUART in company. Course was set for Port Jackson.
- 13. HMAS HOBART joined at 0630 Friday 9th and the three ships entered harbour. PERTH secured to a buoy for a TARTAR missile disembarkation trial. At IO40 PERTH shifted berth to West Dock Wall for the weekend. You, Sir, disembarked by barge at the buoy.
- I4. On Monday I2th April PERTH cast off and proceeded in company with HMAS YARRA and STUART for the exercise areas. HMAS SWAN joined at III5.
- 15. PERTH berthed at Garden Island on Wednesday I4th at I330 to commence a self maintainence period.
- Thursday I5th to Tuesday 20th.
- 17. On Tuesday 27th I made my farewell call on you, Sir, when you entertained me at luncheon.

Marine Engineering

- 18. The ship's main and auxiliary machinery has operated satiscactorily during the month. A successful two hour pre-refit full
 ower trial was carried out on I4th April.
- Three URDEF's have been originated during the month and all three have been remedied by ship's staff.
- 20. Examination of the main boilers subsequent to the full power trial has revealed no apparent defects. As a consequence, the URDEF relating to removal of welds securing top rear wall headers to the oiler structure has been downgraded to INDEF status.

.. Weapons and Electrical Engineering

- 2I. Equipment availability during April was high, with the TARTAR missile launcher defects being temporarily rectified prior to the ORE.
- 22. Three UNDEF's were raised during the month of which two have been rectified. This leaves a total of six outstanding, three awaiting stores and three still undergoing repair.

General

- 23. The Welfare Committee met on four occasions during the month.
- 24. All ship's divers qualified during the month.
- 25. The health, welfare and conduct of the ships company are satisfactory. Living conditions onboard are satisfactory and the material condition of the ship is very good.



HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - 1ST TO 14TH MAY, 1976.

Sir,

I have the demonsurto report the proceedings of Her Majestys Australian Ship PERTH under my command for the period 1st to 14th May, 1976. All times are sone KILO(-10).

- 2. At the beginning of the month PERTH was berthed at Garden Island having completed a nine day self maintenance period the previous day.
- 3. PERTH cast off and proceeded to No 3 buoy at 0830 on Monday 3rd May and on completion of embarking V.T. fuze Trial ammunition at 1000 slipped and with HMAS PARRAMATTA in company proceeded for exercises in the East Australian area. Embarked was an Air Intercept Controllers course from HMAS WATSON and an Advanced QMG course from HMAS CERBERUS.
- 4. A commercial film unit, to produce a recruiting film, embarked in Jervis on Tuesday 4th and after a busy two days filming ship board activities and various firing exercises disembarked on the evening of Wednesday 5th.
- RAN Sidewinder firings against a Jindivik towed tonic target were successfully carried out on Wednesday 5th May.
- 6. On Thursday 6th May a most useful Air Defence Exercise with NAS NOWRA providing ten strike aircraft was carried out and the occasion was used to generate a more realistic damage control exercise.
- 7. The ship berthed on HMAS PARRAMATTA at West Dock Wall at 1130 on Friday 7th May, where she remained for the weekend.
- 8. PERTH cast off and proceeded with HMA Ships STUART and DUCHESS in company at 1000 Monday 10th May for the exercise areas.
- 9. 5" VT fuze trials against Delmar targets proceeded during the week but due to system alignment problems and the small sample, results were inconclusive.
- 10. On Wednesday 12th May between 1000 and 1200 an extremely well co-ordinated air strike was carried out by 12 F111's from 6 Squadron RAAF.
- 11. An interesting mini war utilising rules of engagement in an escalating confrontation situation and involving HMA Ships PERTH, VAMPIRE, STUART and SWAN together with aircraft from NAS NOWRA was conducted on the night of Wednesday 12/Thursday 13th.

- 12. PERTH berthed at SE Cruiser Wharf, Garden Island at 1400 on Thursday 13th to commence a long leave and availability period.
- 13. On this day on completion of handing over command to my successor, CAPTAIN E.E. JOHNSTON AM, OBE, ADC, RAN, and in your absence, Sir, I made a farewell call on your Chief of Staff, COMMODORE R.C. SWAN CBE, RAN.

Marine Engineering

- 14. Main and auxiliary machinery has operated satisfactorily.
- Preparation of the ship's second supplementary defect list has been deferred pending a decision on a definite start date for the refit.

Weapons and Electrical Engineering

16. Equipment availability during the period was high. No URDEF's were raised and three outstanding URDEF's were rectified. Of the total of three URDEF's still current, two are awaiting spares from USA and one is still undergoing repair.

General

- 17. The welfare committee has met and the Ship's Company have been addressed on matters of security during the period.
- 18. The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company remain satisfactory. Living conditions onboard are satisfactory and the material condition of the ship is very good.

HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS 15TH MAY TO 31ST MAY, 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship PERTH under my command for the period 15th to 31st May, 1976. All times are Zone KILO (-10).
- 2. HMAS PERTH was undergoing self maintenance, long leave and availability period on 15th May, while berthed at the Cruiser Wharf, Garden Island.
- The ship was at this berth when a fire broke out in the Wardroom galley at 1030, Sunday 16th May (HMAS PERTH Signal KKG 160330Z MAY76 refers).
- At 1000, 18th May, I called upon you, Sir, at your Fleet Headquarters.
- The ship remained at the Cruiser Wharf until 1340, 24th May when she was cold moved to the EMS Mooring. The move was completed at 1410 when FERTH secured to the starboard side of HMAS STALWART (Captain J.A. Robertson, RAN), bows east. The ship lay at this berth on 31st May, 1976.

MARINE ENGINEERING

Auxiliary machinery has operated satisfactorily during this period, while main machinery has been shut down.

7. The ship has been on shore services for the latter half of the month and this has allowed an external clean of all four boilers. Ship's staff are now progressing with tank cleaning.

WEAPONS ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

8. Equipment availability for this period was high. One URDEF (242/74) was raised to cover repair to damaged cabling, caused by the Wardroom galley fire. Seven URDEF's remain outstanding, two of which are awaiting spares from overseas.

GENERAL

9. The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company has been satisfactory. Living conditions onboard are satisfactory. Because of the unservicability of the Wardroom Galley, officers are being victualled from the Main Galley. The material condition of the ship is satisfactory.

HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS JUNE 1976 - AMENDMENT

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship PERTH under my command for the month of June, 1976. All times are Zone KILO (-10).
- 2. On 1st June, the ship was undergoing a self maintenance and leave period, while berthed alongside HMAS STALWART, at the EMS mooring, Garden Island.
- 3. PERTH was cold moved from this berth to the south end of the Cruiser Wharf on 7th June. The ship was again moved by tugs on 16th June when she was taken to Number 2 Buoy.
- De-ammunitioning commenced at 0900 on Thursday, 17th June and progressed throughout that day and Firday forenoon. The evolution was completed when the final lighter cast off at 1430 Friday, 18th June 1976.
- FERTH remained at the buoy over the weekend and was again cold moved at 1315 on Monday, 21st June 1976. At 1330, the ship secured on STALWART's port side at the EMS mooring.
- 6. At 0845, Monday 28th June, the ship was cold moved to West Dock Wall where she was scheduled to remain until commencement of the docking period.

WEAPONS ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

- 10. Equipment availability has remained high during this period. No new URDEFS have been raised and seven remain outstanding from the end of May.
- 11. Work has progressed well on the ship's staff refit work list.

GENERAL

- 12. The health, welfare and conduct of the ships company have remained satisfactory. The material condition of the ship is also satisfactory.
- 13. Work is progressing on the fire damage sustained by the Wardroom Galley. While this galley is unserviceable, Officers are being victualled from the General Mess.

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship PERTH under my command for the month of July, 1976. All times are Zone KILO (-10).
- 2. The month of July has been spent in refit. At 1335 on the 1st July the ship was moved by tugs from the West Dock Wall to the South End of the Cruiser Wharf, bows south.
- 3. On Sunday 11th July I proceeded on fourteen days leave and Commander I.D. ROBERTS RAN assumed temporary command.
- 4. The General Manager, GARDEN ISLAND DOCKYARD, Commodore W.J. ROURKE visited PERTH on the forenoon of Tuesday, 20th July to familiarise himself with those areas of the ship that had been updated in the United States of America.
- 5. I returned from leave on Monday 26th July and reassumed command.

- During the month PERTH has continued undergoing a shortened refit at Garden Island Dockyard. The same sense of purpose as mentioned in previous reports remains evident among the Dockyard workers and is most heartening from the ship's point of view.
- From Monday 25th October, I attended Command Team Training, with my Officers and Operations sailors, at the Combat Data System Centre at Canberra. This training took four days, and proved most beneficial in brushing away the cobwebs.

WEAPONS ELECTRICAL

Combat system and equipment set-to-work progressed satisfactcrily during October as did the NCDS operational program functional check-out (OPFCO).

MARINE ENGINEERING

Refitting work has proceeded satisfactorily during the month M.M. AUSTRALIAN FLEET ship meeting the planned light-off date of 18th October with the ship meeting the planned light-off date of 18th October.

- 6. Post refit turbo-generator trials commenced on 20th October and were successfully completed on 29th October, 1976.
- 7. Despite expected minor problems during trials and setting-to-work, co-operation and understanding between ship's staff and Dockyard personnel has remained at a high level.

HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - NOVEMBER 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMAS PERTH under my command for the month of November, 1976. All times are Zone Lima(-11).
- 2. At the beginning of November PERTH was entering the last week of her shortened refit. Although the normal trials and tribulations of this week were compounded by obligations' inherent in being host ship to USS DECATUR, WADDELL and HOEL, the refit was completed on Friday 5th November with PERTH coming to eight hours notice for sea.
- An inclining experiment was carried out in the Outer Captain Cook Dock on Saturday 6th November.
- 4. The scheduled departure for sea on Monday 8th was delayed due to various industrial disputes and after several periods of going to immediate notice, then reverting to one hour's notice, lower deck was cleared and I addressed the ship's company on the problems which beset us.
- Lines were run over to the East Dock Wall and after winching the ship into the centre of the dock all lines were cast off and the ship proceeded at 1445. There was no noticeable effect as the ship moved ahead on both engines and the evolution was a most satisfactory way of commencing the sea-going period of a new cornission.

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- 6. PERTH commenced a six week Ship Qualification Trials period at 1540 Monday 8th with a URD-4 Serial. The twenty four hour shakedown proved most beneficial, especially for those serving in a DDG for the first time, although a short choppy sea proved the undoing of some.
- 7. At 1530 Tuesday 9th PERTH berth alongside HMAS HOBART at West Dock Wall for a gun system collimation.
- 8. At 0830 on Wednesday 10th, having embarked the D3 Ikara alignment aerial, the ship moved under her own power to No 3 buoy.
- 9. At 0950 on the same day the Chief of Naval Staff, Vice Admiral H.D. STEVENSON, A.C., C.B.E., delivered a farewell address to the ship's company and after joining me for coffee departed at 1030. The departure was marked by a man and cheer ship.
- 10. PERTH berthed on HMAS VAMPIRE at the Cruiser Wharf at 1530 preparatory to carrying out Ikara range alignment.
- 11. The planned ammunitioning scheduled for Thursday 11th and Friday 12th was postponed indefinitely due to further industrial problems.
- 12. On Thursday 11th and Friday 12th I attended the Naval Symposium at HMAS WATSON.
- 13. At 1000 Monday 15th PERTH sailed in company with HMAS BRISBANE. Once clear of Port Jackson sufficient amountaion to carry out gun functioning trials and muzzle velocity measurements was transferred from HMAS BRISBANE by light jackstay. This evolution, although slow and marred by cold winds and rain, allowed the ship's programme to proceed as planned.
- 14. PERTH berthed on HMAS HOBART at the West Dock Wall, Garden Island, at 1515 Thursday 18th for missile radar collimation and re-embarkation of the D3 scrial.
- 15. On Monday 22nd the ship cast off and proceeded to No 3 buoy for Ikara alignment, on completion berthing alongside the Oil Wharf.
- 16. At 0800 Tuesday 23rd PERTH moved hot to No 3 buoy and commenced embarking ammunition at 0915.
- 17. At 1400, after successfully embarking 12 missiles, the 13th disengaged during the load-on-launcher sequence and in falling to the deck badly damaged the nose and fins(my message WCT/KBT 230304ZNOV76 refers). After the missile had been declared safe to move ammunitioning of 5" projectiles and cartridges recommenced while the missile embarkation equipment was examined.
- Ammunitioning recommenced on Wednesday 24th and after successful movement of a TSAM I ordered the embarkation of Tartar missiles to recommence. However at 1140 during the first attempt, the missile again disengaged causing similar damage to the previous day's incident(my message WCK/KBT 240048 ZNOV76 refers). Tartar embarkation was ceased and although all 5" and small arms ammunition was embarked, Ikara embarkation was halted at the peace time outfit level to allow derricks and associated gear to be diservariate terre the departure of the lighter.

- 19. At 1600 a Estimated Exercise Areas to continue the SQT programme.
 - 20. On Friday 26th it became necessary to cancel the first major serial of the Trials period when the we ther conditions precluded the departure from Jervis Bay of the Torpedo Recovery Vessel and Williams Target.
 - 21. At 1332 on the same day, in rough seas, the OMC Operator in Mount 52 reported man in the water astern. Course was reversed and a search commenced while personnel mustered at Action Stations and then by the Open List(ny message RTT 260305ZNOV76 refers). After confirming that all hands had been sighted the search was continued with several false alarms being occasioned by the sighting of large birds. The search was discontinued after an hour and forty minutes. PERTH entered Jervis Bay, coming to single anchor at 1605 to continue trials on radar and electronic equipment.
 - On Saturday 27th sports teams were landed at HMAS CRESWELL and my officers attended a pistol shoot at the R.A.N.C.
 - 23. I inspected the ship's company at Divisions on Sunday 28th and addressed them on matters concerning the SQT programme before inspecting the upper deck.
 - 24. PERTH weighed and proceeded from Jervis Bay to continue gunnery SQT at 0800 Monday 29th.
 - At 1105 Tuesday 30th the ship received a message that a Seaking helicopter had ditched eleven miles away. PERTH proceeded at 26 knots and once at the scene of action, with the Seaking afloat, air engineers from HMAS ALBATROSS joined by helo to give recovery advice. At that time PERTH became surface scene of action Commander.
 - 26. HMAS VENDETTA, CURLEW, SNIPE, AWARE, OTWAY and TRV801 joined at various times during the recovery operation.
 - 27. At 1935, whilst being towed by HMAS SNIPE, the Seaking sunk(my message KEB/KGZ 301205ZNOV76 refers). The intention had been to tow the Seaking to Port Kembla for lifting out of the water.
 - 28. During this attempt to recover the helicopter I consider that the standard of seamanship displayed by the Commanding Officers of HMAS CURLEW, SNIPE and AWARE and the coxswain of TRV801 to have been of a very high order. In addition the divers of HMAS PERTH, SNIPE and AWARE worked well in the trying conditions of a six feet sea.
 - 29. At the end of November PERTH was involved in gunnery, radar and electronic warfare SQT.
 - 29. Marine Engineering. Post refit operation and trials of marine engineering machinery and equipment have been satisfactory. Although the industrial situation prevented the use of tugs for harbour movements over most of the month, with a consequential effect on maintenance and trials, the repeated necessity for "hot moves" has had a beneficial training spin-off. Additionally, considerable effort has been directed towards safety and training drills during the month due to the high turnover within the department during refit.



Weapons and Electrical Engineering

- 31. Even though the refit ended on 5th November, the GID set-to-work(STW) was not complete in some areas. The postponement of a dockyard sea trial until after refit completion prolonged this process, and some systems and equipments are still not fully operational. The most serious of these is the inability of the digital Tartar missile system to fully pass its Daily System Operability Test(DSOT). The system is serviceable for tracking and dummy engagement serials, but unserviceable for firing.
- 32. Combat System Ship Qualification Trials(SQT) continued through the month, with the initial emphasis on the Gun and missile systems and NCDS.
- 33. 18 URDEF's and 7 INDEF's were raised during the month, of which 8 URDEF's have been rectified. Of the 10 URDEF's still outstanding, 6 are still undergoing repair by dockyard and/or ships staff and 4 are awaiting stores. 4 of the outstanding URDEF's affect the digital Tartar Missile System, and the early December scheduled ITR firing is currently in jeopardy.
- 34. NCDS Operational Program Functional Checkout(OPFCO) was conducted concurrently with the latter stage of STW and the first part of SQT, and a new operational program 1GXP was accepted by the ship on 17th November.

General

- 35. The health, morale and conduct of the Ship's Company remains staisfactory. The period of sea running, despite the frustrations synonymous with a Ship's Qualification Trial, has raised morale.
- 36. The welfare committee has met on two occasions.
- 37. Ship's divers have all qualified during November.

HMAS PERTH - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - DECEMBER 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of HMAS PERTH under my command for the month of December 1976. All times are Zone Lima(-11).
- At the beginning of December PERTH was involved in a ships qualification trial(SQT) period.
- At 1100 Wednesday 1st PERTH was joined by HMAS OTWAY who conducted an underwater periscope photography trial. PERTH held a steady course at four knots whilst OTWAY with a depth separation of ten feet, photographed the ship's bottom, rudders and propellors. The resulting photographs were of excellent quality.
- 4. On Thursday 2nd at 0840 PERTH was off RAAF Williamtown airfield for a helicopter transfer of an RAAF air intercept controller and visitors from the Australian Joint Warfare Establishment. For the next two days PERTH worked with F111C and MIRAGE aircraft carrying out air defence and intercept exercises.
- Unfortunately, due to the need for dockyard technical assistance and the requirement for me to attend a Board of Inquiry in Sydney, a planned visit to Newcastle was cancelled.
- 6. The ship berthed at Garden Island Dockyard at 1530 Friday 3rd.
- 7. On Sunday 5th I attended a Board of Inquiry at HMAS PENGUIN into the ditching and subsequent loss of a Seaking helicopter on 30th November. My Executive and Navigating Officers were also called to give evidence.

- Repairs to the Tartar launcher were completed during Monday 6th and a slug missile was jettisoned successfully at 1810 that day to the great relief of all concerned.
- 9. PERTH cast off to continue SQT at 0800 Tuesday 7th. Due to poor weather conditions that day many important SQT trials had to be postponed.
- 10. Between 1900 and 2359 the same day HMAS PERTH, VAMPIRE and OTWAY exercised with P3B Orion aircraft testing submarine/aircraft co-operation procedures.
- 11. Thursday 9th was programmed for two Tartar missile firings. Adverse weather precluded firing until late that day, the limitation being the launch requirements of the target towing Jindivik. The wind abated late in the afternoon and at 1530 PERTH fired a missile which hit the towed tonic target.
- 12. The second missile was fired at 1116 Friday 10th in excellent weather conditions. This missile was also successful passing between eleven and twenty feet from the tonic target.
- 13. PERTH berthed at Garden Island Dockyard at 1535 the same day.
- 14. On Monday 13th PERTH cast off and proceeded to a buoy for Ikara aerial alignment and to fuel. At 1330 the ship reberthed at Garden Island to unload the Ikara test aerial and on completion sailed to continue SQT.
- 15. It had been planned to fire Ikara on Wednesday 15th with Thursday 16th as a spare day. Unfortunately the sea was too rough on both days to permit safe recovery of the torpedo. The firing was post oned until the work-up period in 1977.
- 16. PERTH was ranged successfully on the shallow water degaussing range in Sydney Harbour on Friday 17th and berthed on completion at 1330.
- 17. Friday 17th was the last day of the JQT period and the beginning of a leave and assisted maintenance period. A work-up commences on Monday 10th January 1977.
- 18. On Monday 20th PERTH successfully defended the Fleet Sailing Trophy, the Rawson Cup, against a challenge by HMAS HOBART. PERTH has now held this trophy for one year.
- 19. The SQT was completed with generally satisfactory results. The following trials were not completed and are re-programmed early 1977: Ikara Firing, exdak checks, AA firing in radar mode, some CASEX serials and a torpedo firing.
- 20. PERTH is the only RAN ship fitted with a Satellite broadcast receiving system. On 1st December a trial of reception quality of this system in the East Australian Area commenced. The trial involved a side by side comparison of the received quality of live signal traffic transmitted by HF from Canberra and the same traffic relayed from Honolulu to Guam by HF and from Guam to the PERTH on one channel of the USN

leet Satellite broadcast. The quality of the Satellite path traffic was excellent and side by side comparison showed that the satellite path reception quality was far superior to the direct path HF reception. The trial was temporarily suspended for the Christmas and New Year period.

21. Marine Engineering.

The Operation and running of marine engineering machinery and equipment during the month has been satisfactory.

- 22. Defects on 2A boiler main stop valve necessitating a complete shut down of the after space for rectification have frustrated attempts at four boiler operation. This defect was repaired shortly after commencement of the AMP.
- 23. Training of engineering personnel in casualty drills has continued and the relatively stable steaming conditions have allowed considerable advances to be made in the cleaning and preservation of machinery spaces.

24. Weapons Electrical Engineering.

The Combat System SQT completed on 17th with generally satisfactory results, as reported by RANTAU KNQ192138Z DEC76. It was particularly pleasing to achieve two successful Tartar ITR firings, since this missile type had not been fired since modernisation completion in USA last year.

Seven URDEF's and fourteen INDEF's were raised during the month. Of the eleven URDEF's still outstanding ten are still undergoing repair by dockyard/CDSC/ship's staff and one is awaiting receipt of stores.

26. General.

The health, morale and conduct of the Ship's Company remains satisfactory.

- 27. The walfare committee has met twice and the Ship's Company has been addressed on Security matters on numerous occasions.
- 28. Due to the ship's programme, although all divers dived during December, no ship's divers completed 90 minutes.
