





HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - JANUARY 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of January 1976.
- 2. At the beginning of the month DUCHESS was berthed at the Cruiser Wharf, Garden Island, Sydney completing a long leave and assisted maintenance period.
- After some delays occasioned by generator trials, the ship was shifted to No. 3 buoy at 1327 (-11) on Tuesday 6th January. The next day at 0900 (-11) the ship ammunitioned and this evolution completed at 1310 (-11), after which DUCHESS slipped the buoy and proceeded to sea at 1601 (-11).
- 4. It was intended to use a two day period at sea for shakedown, however at 2117 (-11) excessive NEOX consumption necessitated stopping to investigate the cause. The ship proceeded at 2135 (-11) for Jervis Bay and eventually anchored there at 0015 (-11) on Thursday 8th January.
- At 0615 (-11), the same day, DUCHESS weighed and proceeded to act as flank marking vessel for HMS AJAX Ikara firings. The firings completed at 1500 (-11) after which DUCHESS carried out gun functioning trials.
- Later, at 2012 (-11) DUCHESS joined AJAX for night steaming detaching at 0600 (-11) on Friday 9th January for independent steaming. From 0930 (-11) until 1012 (-11) the ship exercised at man overboards before entering Sydney and berthing at the Oil Wharf alongside HMAS HOBART at 1130 (-11).
- 7. On Sunday 11th January 21 Junior Trainee Officers (JTOs) joined for their first taste of life at sea.
- 8. On Tuesday 13th January at 0900 (-11) DUCHESS proceeded to sea for gun functioning trials and JTO coastal navigation training. The following day at 0744 (-11) the ship secured to No. 2 buoy Sydney to embark observers for a post refit full power trial.

- 9. The buoy was slipped at 0852 (-11) and the ship proceeded to sea and carried out a satisfactory full power trial from 1000 (-11) until 1345 (-11). After this the ship entered Sydney and berthed on HOBART at the Oil Wharf at 1544 (-11).
- 10. On Saturday 17th January all JTOs carried out practical fire fighting at Jervis Bay. This completed their NBCD course which was held late last year.
- 11. At 0900 (-11) on Monday 19th January DUCHESS proceeded to sea for a short gun functioning trial lasting from 1050 (-11) until 1158 (-11) after which the ship joined HMA Ships IBIS and SNIPE for passage to New Zealand.
- 12. Whilst in company exercises were carried out as listed in Annex B. In addition it became clear that SNIPE would require refuelling if the MCMV arrival time in Wellington was to be met. So on Tuesday 20th January SNIPE refuelled from DUCHESS between 1450 (-12) and 1608 (-12) using an ad-hoc jackstay rig. Afterwards at 1614 (-12) IBIS and SNIPE were detached to make own arrivals in Wellington whilst DUCHESS proceeded to Lyttelton.
- 13. On Wednesday 21st January at 0150 (-12) NEOX consumption necessitated stopping again for investigative purposes. The ship proceeded at 0410 (-12) and later stopped at 1004 (-12) for more trials which completed at 1254 (-12).
- Further trials were carried out on Thursday 22nd January between 1041 (-12) and 1152 (-12) and again the following day from 0708 (-13) until 0746 (-13). After the last trial the ship berthed in Lyttelton at 0904 (-13).
- on Friday 23rd January. Among those who attended were the Mayor of Christchurch Mr. H.G. Hay, the Mayor of Lyttelton Mr. J.B. Collett, the Australian Consul General Mr. K. McKernan and the Commander 3rd Infantry Brigade Group Brigadier L.W. Wright. Later DUCHESS hosted an official reception which commenced at 1830 (-13) and was attended by about 70 guests.
- 16. At 1100 (-13) on Monday 26th January DUCHESS cast off and proceeded for sea to carry out JTO pilotage training in the Marl-borough Sounds.
- 17. After sailing the weather worsened and by evening DUCHESS recorded wind velocities of over 40 knots. A weather pattern of strong North West or West winds established itself and coastal navigation at sea was substituted for pilotage training scheduled for Tuesday 27th January.
- 18. On Tuesday 27th January at 2352 (-13) the ship anchored in Wellington Harbour to enable proper pathology tests to be carried out on Midshipman W.G. Warner, RAN, who was suspected to have rubella.

- 19. Despite strong gusts of wind (up to 50 knots) the ship remained firm at anchor until weighing at 0856 (-13) on Wednesday 28th January. On departing Wellington coastal navigation training was carried out.
- 20. At 1100 (-13) the MCMVs departed Wellington and they circumnavigated Arapawa Island before joining up with DUCHESS at 1800 (-13). After the ships joined up and having experienced the exposed weather conditions prevailing on the West Coast, I ordered all ships to return into the Sound and anchor overnight in Ship Cove and Resolution Bay.
- 21. At an informal meeting of Commanding Officers onboard DUCHESS that night, the proposed visit of the MCMVs to Westport was cancelled and they were ordered to Nelson in lieu.
- 22. The next day DUCHESS weighed at 0626 (-13) and pilotage training was carried out until 1400 (-13). After this the ship proceeded to Nelson berthing there at 1859 (-13).
- On arrival in Nelson the Commanding Officer of HMAS IBIS Lieutenant Commander G.V. Sloper, RAN, called on me to report a damaged starboard propellor to IBIS (HMAS IBIS KGY/KKA 290825Z January 1976 refers).
- 24. On Friday 30th January I hosted a luncheon onboard at 1230 (-13) for five local dignitaries. My guests included the Leader of the Opposition in New Zealand the Right Honourable W.E. Rowling M.P. and the Mayor of Nelson Mr. R.A. McLennan, and later the ship gave an official reception for 80 guests which began at 1830 (-13).
- Commencing at 0815 (-13) on Saturday 31st January I presided over a Board of Inquiry into the damaging of the starboard propellor of HMAS IBIS, as directed by you, Sir.

Marine Engineering

- Acceptance of J2 turbo generator remained outstanding at the end of the refit. Although amplidyne trials were satisfactorily completed on 2nd January, governor responses at the $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ load levels were unsatisfactory. After ship's staff effected a small modification to the 1st stage nozzle, improved performance resulted. Although not fully acceptable, its reliability has proved better than at any time in the past 18 months.
- Both stern glands were fitted with new inner mechanical seals during the refit and after one day at sea, adjustment was carried out on 7th January in Jervis Bay. The port gland has continued to give problems throughout the period, as reported elsewhere. Whilst on passage to New Zealand trials were carried out to determine if there was excessive axial movement of the port shaft but results indicated that there was not. Subsequently the gland has given satisfactory service.

- 28. The steering telemotors system proved most unreliable for the first two weeks at sea and frequent changes to the after steering position were made. The problem was finally traced to the automatic by-pass valves and since they have been refitted no further problems have occurred.
- High feed and fresh water expenditures aggravated by a defective seal on the baffle support plate of 'A' evaporator gave rise to concern whilst on passage to New Zealand. Both feed and fresh water expenditures have been effectively reduced and the defective seal is scheduled to be replaced in the forthcoming AMP.
- 30. K3 diesel generator air cooler experienced a salt water leak which fortunately did not damage the generator. Location of the two defective tubes was awkward and time consuming but both the ME and WEE departments worked closely to effectively plug the tubes and have the machine operational in two days. N5 diesel generator experienced damage to the rocker gear of one bank due to a blocked oilway. Insufficient spare gear was held onboard so a temporary repair was made and has given good service.

Weapons Engineering

- As noted above the month commenced with significant generator problems, there being only 2 diesel generators trialled and useable as reliable sources of supply. A concerted effort by Vickers Cockatoo Dockyard, Garden Island Dockyard (staff and personnel) in co-operation with ship's staff enabled the ship to proceed to sea on 7th January with all generators available.
- Radar 293 failed soon after leaving harbour with a defective aerial training motor (URDEF 47/76) and intermittent failures on Radar 903 supplies prevented the use of the MRS3 system for recording HMS AJAX Ikara firings.
- 33. All weapons mountings and systems were successfully functioned during the month although defects mainly attributable to old age caused delays to some serials.
- 34. Since departing Sydney, major defects have occurred less frequently but minor breakdowns and maintenance in all sections have kept the department fully employed.

General

- Drug lectures were given to most of the ship's company by the Naval Police on Thursday 15th and Friday 16th January.
- Training for ship's company taking command tests was not carried out during the month because of the leave period and subsequent shakedown for the first training cruise. A board is to be held next month.
- The welfare committee met on three occasions during the month.
- The health, welfare and conduct of the ship's company is considered good. The conditions onboard and the material condition of the ship is deemed satisfactory.



HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - FEBRUARY 1976

Sir,

- I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of February 1976.
- At the beginning of the month the ship was berthed in 2. Nelson, New Zealand on the final visit on the New Zealand Station for the first training cruise of the year.
- The Board of Inquiry, over which I presided, continued to hear evidence on Sunday 1st and Monday 2nd February, prior to sailing.
- 4. At 0830 (-13) on Monday 2nd February the Commanding Officer of HMAS IBIS, Lieutenant Commander G.V. Sloper RAN, reported to me that the starboard propellor on IBIS had been successfully replaced and the ship was ready to proceed for trials, in company with HMAS SNIPE.
- 5. Accordingly at 1010 (-13) IBIS and SNIPE left harbour for trials and these were completed satisfactorily by 1300 (-13).
- 6. Later at 1300 (-13), DUCHESS cast off and proceeded to sea to join both MCM Vessels for passage to Hobart.
- 7. Although the spare propellor arrived in Nelson at only 0030 (-13) on Monday 2nd February, it was due to the commendable efforts of HMAS SNIPE's diving unit in replacing the damaged propellor, that all units were able to sail for Hobart so expeditiously. The diving unit was lead by Lieutenant A.V. Rashleigh BEM, RAN.
- 8. Whilst in New Zealand, enough suitable hose was purchased to enable refuelling of MCM Vessels at sea using a modified jackstay rig. After departure from Nelson, SNIPE refuelled on Tuesday 3rd February and IBIS refuelled on Wednesday 4th February. Photographs of this evolution are enclosed.
- 9. At 2300 (-11) on Thursday 5th February IBIS and SNIPE were detached in the entrance to Storm Bay, to make their planned ETA the The favourable weather experienced whilst on passage next day. enabled the ships to make up the time lost in sailing late from Nelson.

- The next day at 0634 (-11) DUCHESS berthed at Self's Point jetty for fuel and later at 1110 (-11) shifted berth to No. 3 Main Wharf in Sullivan's Cove, Hobart.
- 11. The same day I attended a cocktail party given by His Excellency, the Governor of Tasmania, the Honourable Sir Stanley Burbury KBE, commencing at 1800 (-11).
- 12. On Saturday 7th February commencing at 1900 (-11), an official reception for over sixty guests was held onboard. Officers from IBIS, SNIPE and HMAS KIMBLA assisted in hosting this reception.
- On Monday 9th February I held a luncheon onboard, commencing at 1230 (-11). Those who attended were the Naval Officer-in-Charge Tasmania Commander J. StB. More RAN, Mr. C.A.S. Page, Captain C.A. Woods Harbour Master, Mr. B. Goodluck MHR and Lieutenant Colonel W. Bassan Deruty Commander 6th Military District. Later, at 1800 (-11) I attended a reception given by H.E. the Governor in honour of His Excellency the Governor-General of Australia, the Honourable Sir John Kerr KCMG, QC, who had arrived in Hobart for the regatta.
- 14. The following day at 0740 (-11) DUCHESS cast off and proceeded to the regatta flagship anchorage for the day. Later at 1442 (-11) I had the pleasure of welcoming His Excellency the Governor General and Lady Kerr accompanied by the Governor of Tasmania onboard so they could view the regatta from the forecastle. The vice regal party departed at 1530 (-11).
- The ship weighed at 1636 (-11) and returned alongside to the previous berth.
- 16. At 0830 (-11) on Wednesday 11th February, DUCHESS cast off and proceeded from Hobart to conduct training in basic navigation and pilotage techniques for Junior Trainee Officers. Training was spread over the next four days while the ship operated in the Derwent River and D'Entrecasteaux Channel areas. This training imposed a heavy load on bridge control and engineering special sea dutymen but good results were accomplished despite the limited manpower in those areas.
- 17. After the final training anchorage at 2025 (-11) on Saturday 14th February the ship proceeded for Port Phillip Bay by way of the west coast of Tasmania. DUCHESS entered the Rip at 0730 (-11) on Monday 16th February.
- 18. Whilst in the bay the opportunity was taken to get some photographs of the ship manoeuvring at high speed and this was done between 0957 (-11) and 1040 (-11) using equipment and personnel provided by HMAS LONSDALE. Later, at 1127 (-11) the ship berthed at Station Pier, Melbourne.
- 19. Whilst there I attended a luncheon given by the Naval Officer-in-Charge, Victoria, Commodore D.H.D. Smyth RAN, on Monday 16th February and the following day I held a luncheon onboard, commencing at 1230 (-11). Among those who attended were NOICVIC, the Lord Mayor Cr. R. Walker, Chief Police Commissioner Mi. R. Jackson, Chairman Harbour Board Trust Mr. A.S. Mayne and Mr. 1. Scott Maxwell Managing Director Vickers Australia Ltd.

RESTRICTED/20. At 0830 (-11)

- 20. At 0850 (-11) on Wednesday 18th February DUCHESS cast off and proceeded for Sydney. Some engineering trials and other exercises were executed before reaching Port Phillip Bay entrance at 1350 (-11).
- On Friday 20th February at 0815 (-11) DUCHESS berthed at the Oil Wharf in Sydncy for an assisted maintenance period which continued until the end of the month. On the same day the 21 Junior Trainee Officers completed their first sea training in the RAN and departed the ship after an end of cruise washup which finished at 1200 (-11). The majority of these JTOs thoroughly enjoyed their time onboard.
- On Wednesday 25th February at 1430 (-11), I called on you, Sir.

Marine Engineering

Problems encountered with the automatic by-pass valves of the steering telemotor transmitter, necessitated changing to after steering on two occasions. With the exception of minor problems, main and auxiliary machinery operated satisfactorily throughout the period.

Weapons Electrical Engineering

- A good start to the month occurred when scheduled firings on Wednesday 4th February were achieved with a minimum of delay.

- 26. At 1125 (-11) a fire occurred in a 200v/1100Hz contactor panel because of a short circuit. It was quickly extinguished and a full report has been forwarded separately.



HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - MARCH 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of March 1976.
- 2. At the beginning of the month DUCHESS was berthed at the Oil Wharf, in Sydney undergoing an assisted maintenance period.
- 3. On Tuesday 2nd March I had the pleasure of receiving the Flag Officer Commanding East Australia Area, Rear Admiral N.E. Macdonald onboard for luncheon at 1130 (-11).
 - Later in the week, Sir, I entertained your Chief of Staff, Commodore R.C. Swan, RAN to luncheon commencing at 1210 (-11) on Thursday 4th March.
 - 5. The second training cruise for 1976 commenced on Sunday 7th March when 19 Junior Trainee Officers (JTO's) joined the ship.
 - 6. On Wednesday 10th March at 1140 (-10) Commander Al-Mail, Kuwait Navy, (CNS designate) joined DUCHESS for sea experience.
- 7. At 1013 (-10) on Thursday 11th March the ship cast off and proceeded to sea to commence sea training for JTO's. Initially these officers were occupied with coastal fixing training in the Sydney Jervis Bay area.
- 8. The next day at 1106 (-10) the ship berthed at Chowder Bay to fuel. Once fuelling had been completed DUCHESS cast off and proceeded to sea to continue coastal navigation training before making a departure for New Zealand at 1035 (-10) on Saturday 13th March.

..../9. During the

- 9. During the passage to Auckland JTO astronomical navigation training was badly hindered by heavy cloud cover resulting from unfavourable weather.
- 10. At 0900 (-12) on Thursday 18th March, DUCHESS berthed in Auckland at HMNZS MILOMEL. Later that day, commencing at 1230 (-12), I held a luncheon onboard for the Commodore Auckland, Commodore R.H.L. HUMLEY RNZN, the Commanding Officer HMNZS TASMAN, Commander E. Burrows RNZN, the Australian Trade Commissioner, Mr. K. Le Rossignol, the Mayor of Auckland's representative, Councilor Tronson, and the Deputy Chairman of the Auckland Harbour Board, Captain J. Forbes.
- 11. The next day at 1215 (-12) I attended a luncheon together with Commander Al-Mail given by COMMUCK and later in the day at 1830 (-12) my officers and I held a reception onboard for over forty guests.
- 12. On Monday 22nd March the ship cast off and proceeded to sea for pilotage training in the Hauraki Jul. for JTO's. This training continued until 1730 (-12) on Wednesday 24th March when DUCHESS departed for Wellington.
- 13. The ship torthed in Wellington at 0724 (-12) on Friday 26th March. After fuelling berth was shifted from Aolea Quay to the Overseas Passenger Terminal at 1130 (-12). Later I hosted a luncheon onboard commencing at 1230 (-12). Those who attended were the Australian High Commissioner, His Excellency, Mr. C.T. Moodie, Deputy Chief of the New Zealand Naval Staff, Commodore D.J. Cheney RNZN, Chairman of the Marbour Board, Mr. H.A. James, the Mayor of Wellington, Councillor, M.C. Fowler and the Wellington QANTAS manager, Mr. J. Ulm.
 - 14. In the evening at 1830 (-12) my officers and I hosted a reception onboard at which over forty guests were entertained.
- 15. On Tuesday 30th March DUCHESS cast off and proceeded at 1031 (-12) for Marlborough Sounds pilotage training area. Pilotage training commenced at 1430 (-12) that afternoon and continued until the end of the month.

Marine Engineering

The fitting of a new baffle and repairs to the baffle support plate in 'A' evaporator have substantially improved the output and reliability of the unit, allowing one unit to be shut down for periods of up to eight hours per day whilst at sea.

17. Since the

- 17. Since the refitting of the telemotor transmitter during the AMP, no trouble has been experienced with the steering system.
- A lubricating oil failure to No. 4 forced draught fan,caused by a holed suction line, necessitated fitting four new turbine
 bearings and the honing of their respective journals. The repair was
 effected most competantly at see in very uncomfortable conditions for
 the articlers concerned.
- 19. A timely offer of assistance from FMU HMNZS PHILOMEL proved valuable to machine a warped diesel cylinder head which was found during investigation of the failure of a cylinder head gasket on N5 diesel generator which occured whilst in Auckland.
- 20. A more serious defect on N5 D/G was discovered after sailing from Wellington. Investigation of a violent vibration when starting up has shown that the holes of the balance ring/crankshaft connection at the flexible connection are elongated. (URDEF 55/76 refers)
- 21. On sailing from Auckland, a further escapance of excessive leakage of Neox from the Port stern gland indicated the the gland clamp had moved forward thus reducing the tension on the loading springs. The clamp was repositioned and marked and the gland has operated satisfactorily since.

Weapons Electrical Engineering

- 22. The AMP enabled FMU/ships staff to repair J2 Turbo Generator amplidyne (URDEF 51/76) as an industrial dispute prevented GID from removing the defective armature from the ship. The repaired machine operated satisfactorily until the 25th March when sparking was again observed on the amplidyne commutator and the T/G was shut down. URDEF 52/76 (Duchess message 250820ZMAR) was raised to have repairs effected by GID on next return to Sydney.
- 23. Defective A and B AP2005 Gyros were overhauled by GID during the period whilst FMU repaired various radar and weapon equipments.
- A successful PAC firing was conducted with 'B' 4.5 Mounting on 11th March. Twelve rounds were fired at 14 RPM and a further 12 rounds at 16 RPM. Despite the age of this mounting, recovery records were quite acceptable. On completion of 4.5 firings a SUCR firing with GI 40/60 mounting took place. A defective amplifier in 'A' 4.5 Mtg and defective safety firing war on G2 40/60 Mtg. prevented both weapons from firing.
- 25. On arrival at Wellington the FR4 HF/DF acrial atop the foremast was suffering from a minor structural collapse. In the absence of suitable wharf craneage, the Chief of Wellington Fire acrices kindly provided an Extension Ladder unit which was sufficiently loss enough to enable Ship's Staff to reconstruct the aerial.
- 26. Generator capacity at the end of the month is down to 60% with J2 T/G shut down and N5 D/G mechanically unserviceable.

- 27. A promotion board for 14 sailors was held during the month at which 9 candidates were successful.
- 28. The welfare committee met on two oc asions during the month.
- 29. The ship's Company were addressed on security during the month. Apart from being given a comprehensive lecture programme, two security films have been shown to all personnel.
- 30. The health, welfare and conduct of the ship's company is considered satisfactory. The conditions onboard and the laterial state of the ship have shown improvement during the period.



HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - APRIL 1976.

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of April 1976.
- 2. At the beginning of the month DUCHESS continued operating in the Marlborough Sounds carrying out Junior Trainee Officers pilotage training. This training finished at 1830 (-12) on Monday 5th April when DUCHESS proceeded to Nelson from the Sounds via the Tory Channel.
- At 0820 (-12) on Tuesday 6th April the ship berthed in Nelson to start a mid week visit to that city. Later at 1230 (-12) I held a luncheon onboard for the Army Area Commander, Major W. Morgan RNZA, the Naval Liaison Officer, Lieutenant Commander R.A. Kitts RNZNR, Councillor C.V. Neale, representing the Mayor of Nelson and the Chairman of the Harbour Board Mr. G.P. Dickson.
- In the evening at 1830 (-12), my officers and I held a reception onboard for forty guests. Shortly after this function finished, at 2205 (-12) an unfortunate incident occurred when the forward spring berthing line was found to be slashed almost through (my LSD 062300Z April 1976 refers). Much more intensive security measures were implemented as a result and no further problem was encountered.
- On Saturday 10th April at 1225 (-12) DUCHESS cast off and proceeded for Brisbane. Whilst on passage only a minimum number of observations were taken to satisfy astro navigation training requirements due to cloud cover.
- At 1130 (-10) on Wednesday 14th April the ship berthed at New Farm in Brisbane for an Easter visit. Later at 1245 (-10) I called on His Excellency, the Governor of Queensland, Air Marshall Sir Colin Hannah, KCMG, KBE, CB, CBE and remained for luncheon. Afterwards I called on the Premier of Queensland, the Right Honourable Mr. J. Bjelke-Peterson MLA at 1400 (-10).
- 7. In the evening an official reception for forty guests was held onboard commencing at 1830(-10).
- 8. The next day, commencing at 1230 (-10), I held a luncheon onboard and those who attended were His Excellency, the Governor of Queensland, the Minister for Defence, the Honourable Mr. D.J. Killen MP and three other guests.

..../9. The Easter

- 9. The Easter holiday road toll did not leave DUCHESS untouched and two members of the Ship's Company were injured in accidents over the period.
- 10. On Tuesday 20th April DUCHESS cast off and proceeded to sea at 0905 (-10). Whilst piloting down the Brisbane river the serviceable turbo generator tripped twice with a resultant decline in available power. By the time the ship cleared Caloundra Heads only one diesel generator remained fully serviceable and consequently planned exercises were cancelled to enable work to start on the ship's generators early (my DAU/OWU/FNA 201115Z April 1976 refers).
- 11. At 0630 (-10) on Thursday 22nd April the ship entered Sydney and anchored in Watson's Bay for customs clearance. After fuelling at Chowder Bay, DUCHESS berthed at Garden Island at 1050 (-10).
- The next day Commander H. Al-Mail Kuwait Navy (CNS designate) and nineteen JTOs posted out to other ships to continue training. This marked the end of the second training cruise for 1976.
- 13. For the remainder of the month DUCHESS remained in Sydney carrying out a self maintenance period.

Marine Engineering

- On sailing from Brisbane, M4 turbo generator oversped and tripped on two occasions. A slightly bent first stage nozzle valve being the cause it became necessary to hand control the governor when shedding large electrical loads. Repairs have been satisfactorily completed during the SMP.
- 15. Fleet Maintenance Unit and Ship's Staff commenced work on N5 diesel generator on arrival Sydney and the crankshaft and balance wheel were removed from the machinery space within four days. It is anticipated that the major overhaul will be completed within the two week maintenance period.

Weapons Electrical Engineering

- 16. With J2 T/G shut down (URDEF 52/76) and N5 D/G unservice-able (URDEF 53/76) all available generation machinery was required to conduct pilotage training in the Marlborough Sounds at the beginning of the month.
- 17. On Sunday 11th April a successful PAC firing was conducted using both A and B mountings. Ship's Staff had constructed a radar enhanced floating target in order to carry out a more realistic firing. However, the target proved unsuitable in prevailing conditions.
- 18. Ship's generation requirements were adequately met with the two remaining diesel generators for the duration of the Brisbane visit. However, the unreliability of the remaining turbo generator on leaving Brisbane caused considerable concern.

19. After an early arrival in Sydney on 22nd April the Dockyard commenced work on repairs to J2 T/G amplidyne and Ship's Staff/Fleet Maintenance Unit undertook repairs to M4 T/G, K3 and N5 D/Gs. Planned maintenance routines in all sections of the WEE department were also undertaken by Ship's Staff during the SMP. At the end of the month prospects for maximum availability of generation machinery and WE equipment for the next training cruise looked bright.

General

- 20. Training for a promotion board to be held next month commenced during April.
- 21. The Welfare Committee met on two occasions during the month. The fitting of colour television to all main messes in the ship at the end of the month has met with universal approval.
- 22. The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company is considered satisfactory. The conditions onboard are adequate and the material state of the ship is satisfactory.



Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command for the month of May, 1976.
- 2. For the first nine days of the month DUCHESS was berthed in Garden Island, Sydney, continuing self maintenance period which began last month.
- The third training cruise for 1976 commenced on Sunday 2nd May when 22 junior Trainee Officers (JTOs) joined the ship.
- 4. At 0956(-10) on Monday 10th May, the ship cast off and proceeded to Suva, Fiji. Whilst on passage, the weather was sufficiently favourable to allow astro navigation training requirements to be met for half the JTO class.
- On Saturday 15th May at 0923(-12), DUCHESS berthed on the north end of King's Wharf, Suva. Later at 1505(-12) berth was shifted to the north face of King's Wharf but only after fuelling had been completed. At 1830(-12) an official reception for forty guests was held onboard.
- Because of the shortage of berthing space in Suva DUCHESS anchored in the lagoon in Suva at 0656(-12) on Monday 17th May. At 1230(-12) I had the pleasure of welcoming onboard for luncheon, His Excellency, the Govenor General of Fiji, Rahu Sir George Cakobau G.C.M.G., O.B.E. Other guests who attended the luncheon were the Acting Australian High Commissioner in Fiji, Ms Maris King; the Permanent Secretary for Home Affairs, Lieutenant Colonel M.V. Buadromo O.B.E.; the Mayor of Suva, Councillor L. Usher O.B.E. and the Commander, Royal Fijian Military Forces, Colonel P.E. Manueli O.B.E.
- 7. Immediately after luncheon, the ship weighed and berthed again on the north end of King's Wharf at 1425(-12). My luncheon guests departed immediately after berthing.
- 8. On Wednesday 19th May at 0930(-12) DUCHESS cast off and proceeded to Port Vila, New Hebrides.
- 9. After a short uneventful passage the ship berthed in Port Vila at 0926(-11) on Friday 21st May. At 1230(-11) I held a luncheon onboard which French Resident Commissioner, M.M. Gauger, the British Chief Secretary, Mr J.A. Burgess and three other guests attended.

- 10. In the evening at 1830(-11) my Officers and I hosted an official reception onboard for forty guests.
- 11. On Sunday 23rd May a team of ship's personnel headed by my Executive Officer, Lieutenant Commander R.R. Sutton RAN demolished a coral niggerhead lying in the approaches to the Vila Yacht Club moorings.
- 12. After a pleasant visit to Port Vila (details of which are being reported separately) the ship cast off and proceeded for Mackay at 0930(-11) on Monday 24th May.
- 13. While on passage the remainder of the JTOs completed their astro navigation training. In addition on Wednesday 26th May a full NGS firing took place at 1000(-11) at a simulated target.
- 14. DUCHESS berthed at No. 3 berth, Mackay at 1000(-10) on Friday 28th May, and remained there for the remainder of the month.
- 15. At 1230(-10) on the same day I hosted a luncheon onboard attended by the Mayor of Mackay, Alderman A. Abbott, the Chairman of Pioneer Shire Council, Mr J. Young and three other guests. Later, at 1830(-10) an official reception was held onboard for forty guests.

Engineering

Repair work on J2 and M4 turbo-generators and K3 and N5 diesel generators was completed by the end of the two week SMP. All four generators was successfully trialed prior to sailing on cruise 3/76. No serious mechanical problems have been experienced with any of the generators during the period.

Weapons Electrical

- There were few Weapons Electrical equipment defects throughout the period however, during ready for sea checks prior to departure from Suva, a fire broke out in the local supply panel of J2 Turbo Generator (DUCHESS KKG/KOD/DAU 190950ZMAY76 refers). The fire was initially caused by the arcing of a steering motor switch within the panel which subsequently caused a short circuit and fire across busbars. After removal of unserviceable sections and a thorough check of the panel, the Generator was successfully placed on load the following day.
- 18. 40/60 Bofors firings were conducted with both MK9 mountings on Tuesday 25th May and a 4.5" NGS firing was carried out on Wednesday 26th May.
- 19. On 27th May it was necessary to shut down 'A' main engine turbo driven lubricating oil pump for a twelve hour period, owing to a fractured ball race on the tachometer drive spindle. With only the motor driven pump in service for that period, very stringent safety instructions were put into force.

HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - JUNE 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of June, 1976.
- At 0833(-10) on Tuesday 1st June, 1976 the ship cast off and proceeded from Mackay to the Whitsunday area for five days of initial pilotage training for the 22 Junior Trainee Officers borne.
- During this period the weather conditions were favourable and all JTOs were given the opportunity to practice the basic principles of pilotage.
- 4. On Friday 4th June, at 0900(-10) DUCHESS berthed port side to No 6 Wharf Townsville. Refuelling commenced at 1000(-10) and continued until 1215(-10) the same day.
- At 1000(-10) I called on the Commander, Three Task Force, Brigadier General A.W.F. Rofe; the Officer Commanding, RAAF Townsville, Group Captain M. Lyons; the President of the Townsville Pacific Festival, Mr J. McCabe; and the Mayor of Townsville, Alderman P.R.T, Tucker.
- At 1230(-10) I hosted a luncheon on board which was attended by Brigadier General Rofe, Group Captain Lyons, Alderman Tucker, and the Townsville Naval Agent, Mr K. McCaffery.
- 7. DUCHESS was opened for public inspection on Saturday 5th June, 840 visitors took this opportunity to view the ship.
- 8. At 1830(-10) the same evening, an official reception was held on board for fifty guests, including twelve of the contestants in the Miss Townsville Pacific Festival Quest.
- 9. DUCHESS was again opened for public inspection on Sunday, 6th June, 1431 visitors viewed the ship.





- 10. At 0900(-10) on Monday, 7th June, D. CHESS cast off and proceeded to the Whitsunday area to continue Pilotage Training for the JTOs. This training continued until the afternoon of Wednesday 9th June, when it was interrupted by the receipt of a distress message from MV FLORIDA, and orders to proceed with dispatch to the area and render assistance. The vessel was reported to have run aground on Myrmidon Reef, north west of Townsville.
- 11. DUCHESS proceeded at 27 knots, arriving in the area at 2300(-10), and remained until 0001(-10). During this time the ship established and maintained radio communications links between Townsville, MV FLORIDA, and HMAS BAYONET.
- 12. DUCHESS refuelled at Townsville on Thursday 10th June sailing on completion to the Whitsunday area to complete pilotage training. The programmed fuelling visit to Mackay on Monday 14th June being cancelled.
- 13. Pilotage training recommenced early on the morning of Friday 11th June, and continued through periods of uninspiring weather until Tuesday 15th.
- During this period the ship anchored in Cid Harbour each night on completion of the days training. A very successful Mini Olympics was held on board on Saturday 12th, and was followed by a Command Performance Ships Concert on Sunday 13th June.
- After passing through rough weather in the last two days of the passage from the Whitsunday area, DUCHESS entered Port Jackson at 0630(-10) on Friday 18th June and proceeded to No. 3 buoy at 0746(-10) to commence Customs Clearance.
- 16. At 0830(-10) DUCHESS slipped from the buoy and berthed port side to South End Cruiser Wharf. On completion of customs clearance, 22 JTOs posted out to leave, marking the end of the third training cruise for the year.
- DUCHESS cold-moved to No. 5 buoy at 1400(-10) on Monday 21st June. De-ammunitioning was completed the following day.
- 18. The ship berthed, again port side to SECW at 1450(-10) on Tuesday 22nd June, and remained alongside until Monday 28th June. De-fuelling was completed whilst alongside at SECW.
- 19. DUCHESS was cold moved to the EMS mooring at 0930 Monday 28th to complete tank cleaning which continued until the end of the month.

Engineering

- 20. Whilst required to proceed at high speed to give assistance to MV FLORIDA, opportunity was taken to carry out full power work up on Wednesday 9th June. Owing to high exhaust steam pressure and its resultant effect on main engine vacuum the trial was not considered satisfactory. Speed through the water was measured as 28 knots. Subsequently the cause of the high exhaust pressure was determined and a further trial planned for Thursday 17th, but this trial was postponed due to bad weather.
- 21. Failure of a ball race on B evaporator combined pump necessitated the unit to be shut down for 16 hours to effect repairs. It was not necessary to impose water restrictions.
- Owing to excessive wear of the Port stern gland wear faces, considered to be caused by excessive axial movement of the shaft, a trial was carried out and the movement was measured. Within the speed range of 200RPM ahead to 80RPM astern, an axial movement in excess of 0.30 inches was recorded, whereas a maximum of 0.050 inches permissable. The Port thrust block is to be inspected during the forthcoming refit.
- 23. With the refit starting on 5th July, generator trials and de-fuelling have been completed. Tank and bilge cleaning has progressed slowly and it will be necessary to work in shifts to complete the work by 4th July.

Weapons Electrical

- There were no significant Weapons Electrical defects during the month of June and most of the period was utilised in the preparation of the Second Supplementary defect list and conduct of pre-refit trials.
- Receipt of GMGID DUT 250438Z JUN76, listing Radio, Communications and Weapons defects unable to be undertaken during the refit caused some concern. It is hoped that the majority of this work will be undertaken by FMU.

General

- 26. I conducted Upper Deck Rounds of the Ship whilst on passage from the Whitsunday area to Sydney, on Thursday, 17th June.
- A group of 20 Naval Reserve Cadets from T.S. PARRAMATTA were embarked for training from Friday 18th to Sunday 20th June, whilst the ship was alongside at SECW, Garden Island.



Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of July 1976. Times throughout are zone (-10).
- 2. At the beginning of the month DUCHESS was berthed along-side HMAS STALWART at the EMS mooring for tank cleaning which continued until Monday 5th July. As well the mid winter leave period continued throughout the month.
- On Monday 5th July at 0850 the ship was moved cold to the Destroyer Wharf at Cockatoo Island to start the annual refit.
- At 1032 on Wednesday 14th July the ship was moved into Fitzroy Dock where docking down commenced at 1123.
- 5. For the remainder of the month the ship has remained in Fitzroy Dock continuing the refit.

Refit

- The majority of the work listed in the Main and Supplementary Defect Lists has been undertaken by Vickers Cockatoo Dockyard. However approximately 25% of the Communication work could not be undertaken by Garden Island Dockyard due to lack of capacity but this work is now being carried out by the Fleet Maintenance Unit.
- 7. Industrial problems involving the electrical trades have caused delays in most electrical work. At this stage it appears doubtful whether all electrical work will be completed on time despite assurances from VCD to the contrary.
- Progress of the mechanical work appears satisfactory whereas the hull work is presently behind schedule. It is planned to increase the manning of hull work in order to achieve the scheduled completion date.



9. With such a large amount of lagging to be carried out and the associated disruptive problems that arise with such work, lagging is now being undertaken out of normal working hours.

- 10. The welfare committee met on one occasion during the month.
- 11. The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company is considered satisfactory. The conditions onboard have deteriorated whilst refitting but are considered adequate. The material state of the ship is being investigated as part of the refit.

HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - AUGUST 1976

Sir,

- I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of August 1976. Times throughout are Zone (-10).
- DUCHESS continued refitting at Cockatoo Island throughout the month. The ship was docked in Fitzroy Dock until Tuesday 31st August when the ship shifted to the Destroyer Wharf at 1330.
- On Thursday 5th August I commenced presiding over a Board of Inquiry convened by you, Sir. The Board has been hearing evidence for the remainder of the month.
- On Wednesday 18th August, a fire occurred in 'A' Engine Room whilst dockyard workers were carrying out flame cutting. The fire was extinguished by the fire sentry and two Naval personnel. In an attempt to smother the flames with his gloved hands, one dockyard worker received burns to his left hand and was hospitalised (my LSD/KKG 180945Z August 1976 refers).

Refit

- Overtime bans enforced by the electrical trades have been temporarily lifted and it is now possible that electrical work will meet the refit completion dates.
- 6. Undocking was postponed from Friday 27th August, until Tuesday 31st August, due to:-
 - The national 24 hour industrial stoppage of the unions involved in the shipbuilding industry; and
 - The defect discovered on the port and starboard stern gland backplate seals (my DAU 270735Z August 1976 refers).
- Progress of the mechanical work is generally good. Delaying factors, which are being overcome, are the diesel generators and the stern glands. Delay has been caused in 'A' Boiler due to problems in rebuilding the supply panel of J2 turbo generator. The generator trials programme has been delayed one day by lack of cooling water to H1 diesel generator due to the delay in undocking.



Work on the hull is improving. Due to the poor state of the deck structure, a considerable amount of structural welding has been done in A2 and B1 magazines and in the forward and after fresh water tanks. Repairs have been made to cracks discovered in 6 frames adjacent to the pedestal supporting the main steering machinery in the tiller flat. Hull preservation in bilge areas has been undertaken by ship's staff.

9. Although there has been a dispute between the contractor and CODOCK unions work is progressing on repairing the cracks in 01, 02 and 03 aluminium decks. Deck preparation is nearly complete and cladding of the decks is expected to commence on 2nd September 1976.

General

- 10. The Welfare Committee met on one occasion during the month.
- 11. The health, welfare and conduct of the ship's company is considered satisfactory. The conditions onboard are considered adequate and the material state of the ship is improving as refitting progresses.

HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - SEPTEMBER 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS under my command, for the month of September, 1976. Times throughout are Zone (-10).
- 2. The refit continued until Monday 27th September. Although planned to end on Friday 17th September the extension in refit period was necessary, as reported in my letter C20/5/10 of 16th September 1976 and my DWK/KNA 230600Z SEP76.
- At \$830 on Monday 27th September the ship was moved from Cockatoo Island to No 3 buoy to ammunition ship. This was completed by 1430 when the ship moved to the Fitting Out Wharf, Garden Island.
- 4. The remainder of the month was spent finishing off the set to work of equipments repaired during the refit.
- Setting to work of generator and their subsequent trials proved to be a frustrating and time consuming operation. Problems with diesel fuel pumps and governors together with amplidyne excitation difficulties resulted in only J2 turbe-generator being accepted with one week of the refit remaining. Happily, fortunes changed and the remaining four generators were accepted in the following seven days.
- During a routine water pressure test of 'B' boiler, a crack was detected in the weld of the blow down spigot of the intermediate water drain. Dockyard effected repairs and the subsequent crack detection and 900 psi water pressure tests indicated the repair to be satisfactory.
- 7. The setting to work of the steering telemotor system took nearly two weeks to obtain a satisfactory standard of response. It was not until the last four days when ship's staff discovered that the dockyard had used incorrect packing in the transmitter that satisfactory progress was made. Ship's Staff repacked the transmitter and set it to work within 48 hours.
- 8. The trial deck covering trade name 'Scotch Clad' for the 01,02, and 03 aluminium decks was laid in seven days although preliminary preparation for shot blasting etc. had taken two weeks. It appears unlikely that such a thin covering will be successful when compared with the size and extent of cracking that has been experienced during the last eighteen months.



- 9. At the end of the period all main and auxiliary machinery had been trialled, with the exception of the steering.
- 10. WEE defect list items undertaken by VCD,GID, FMU and Ship's Staff are progressing and the list of uncompleted/outstanding items is not expected to be large.

General

- 11. The welfare committee met on one occasion during the month.
- 12. The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company is considered satisfactory. The material state of the ship and the conditions onboard are considered to be adequate and it is expected that a high standard will be achieved prior to Cruise 4/76.



HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - OCTOBER 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of October 1976. Times throughout are Zone (-10).
- 2. The ship remained alongside at Garden Island until Tuesday 5th October. At 1100 DUCHESS sailed for the Eastern Australian Exercise Area commencing sea trials and sea acceptance trials.
- At 0915 Wednesday 6th October, I welcomed you onboard, Sir, for an informal one day visit to the ship.
- 4. The ship anchored in Jervis Bay at 0948 and later at 1336 weighed to carry out a compass adjustment.
- On completion of the adjustment, DUCHESS proceeded to sea and at 1610 you departed by helicopter for Sydney. Afterwards, DUCHESS proceeded northwards to rendezvous with HMAS VAMPIRE at 2245 for radar calibrations. Later at 2359 DUCHESS was detached and the next day entered Sydney at 0810 to carry out a degaussing calibration.
- 6. After seven runs accross the range, DUCHESS secured alongside at Garden Island at 1213.
- 7. At 0915 Monday 11th October, DUCHESS sailed for shakedown in company with VAMPIRE. 00W manoguves were carried out upon clearing Sydney Heads and later after being detached a gunnery firing practice and machinery casualty drills were carried out. At 2100 DUCHESS joined VAMPIRE for a night steam in company.
- 8. DUCHESS was detached after 00W manoeuvres were completed between 0800 and 0900 Tuesday 12th October. Internal drills were exercised until 1700 when VAMPIRE joined DUCHESS to conduct radar calibrations and a surface plotting exercise prior to night steaming in company.
- 9. The following day after more OOW manoeuvres a TOWEX commenced at 0830. VAMPIRE successfully towed DUCHESS and on completion, both ships independently conducted internal exercises during the day joining up at 1700 for OOW manoeuvres, RAS approaches, and jackstay transfers. On completion a SCREENEX was conducted before DUCHESS detached at 2000 and anchored in Jervis Bay at 2055.
- 10. On Thursday 14th October at 0830 the ship's company witnessed a winching and liferaft demonstration. Officers from HMAS CRESWELL visited the ship for a tour and liaison. At 1405 the ship weighed and proceeded for a post refit full power trial.

- 11. After might steaming independantly, DUCHESS secured alongside at Garden Island at 0827 Friday 15th October for a self maintenance period and to make final preparations for annual inspection.
- 12. Staff Officers from your Headquarters and HMAS VAMPIRE carried out departmental inspections which culminated with the formal inspection of the ship and her company by COMAUSDESRON 2, on Friday 22nd October.
- Training Cruise 4/76 commenced on Sunday 24th October with the arrival onboard of thirty-two Supplementary List Midshipmen from HMAS CERBERUS. After 3 days alongside training DUCHESS sailed at 1000 on Thursday 28th October for Suva.

Engineering

- 14. A number of defects and post refit items remained outstanding at the beginning of the month and these were resolved by ships staff by Tuesday 5th October. The steering telemotor system had been incorrectly packed at the transmitter glands which was discovered when ships staff accepted responsibility for setting to work. This matter has been reported elsewhere.
- Sea trials commenced on 5th October and apart from excessive leakage from the starboard stern gland, all main and auxiliary machinery performed well. Ship's staff stripped and refitted the starboard stern gland successfully. At this time FFO was detected in the starboard gland NEOX system (INDEF 1/77 refers).
- During the shakedown sea week a series of machinery breakdown drills were conducted. No. 9 FFO tank was cleaned and ventilated at sea to allow access for INDEF 1/77 to be completed. No significant machinery problems were encountered during the post refit full power trial reported above.
- As reported in my message KNA/OHE280910Z OCT:76 'A' Boiler blacked out shortly after clearing Sydney Heads on Thursday 28th October. The cause was established as contaminated fuel and no further problems were encountered whilst on passage.

Electrical

- Sonar 162 was the only significant defect carried forward from the refit. One of the three transducers is unservicable and no replacements are available at present.
- 19. A small electrical fire occured in G1 40/60mm MK9 Mounting at 0930, Friday 1st October as a result of washing down in the vicinity of an open terminal box. My 25/2/1 of 1NOV76 refers. The damaged terminal strips were replaced and the mounting was servicable later that day.
- 20. Sea trials week included post refit checks and functional trials to prove the equipment.
- 'B' mounting safety firing arcs were found to be 'over safe' after repair by ship's staff. Further work enabled the mounting to complete gun functioning trials together with 'A' mounting during the shakedown sea period.
- 22. Three URDEFS were raised during the month:
 - a. 1/77 'B' Mounting safety firing arcs undertaken and completed by ship's staff

..../b. 2/77

- b. 2/77 IFF repaired by dockyard, ship's staff and FMP but functional trials were not completed
- c. 3/77 UA3 defects were investigated by GMGID staff but require 3-4 weeks availability to effect repairs (GMGID 280422Z OCT 76 refers).

General

- 23. The welfare committe met on two occasions during the month.
- 24. The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company is very satisfactory. The material state of the ship and the conditions onboard are at a high standard as a result of the successful refit and subsequent inspection.







HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - NOVEMBER 1976

Sir,

- 1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS, under my command, for the month of November, 1976.
- 2. At the beginning of the month the ship was on passage to Suva, Fiji, on the first leg of training cruise 4/76.
- DUCHESS berthed alongside King's Wharf, Suva at 1000(-12) on Tuesday 2nd November. At 1230 (-12) I had the pleasure of welcoming onboard for luncheon His Excellency the Governor General of Fiji, Ratu Sir George Kadavulevu Cakobau G.C.M.G., O.B.E. Other guests included the Australian High Commissioner, His Excellency Mr G.N. Upton; the Deputy Prime Minister of Fiji, Ratu Sir Penaia Kanatabatu Ganilau K.B.E, G.M.C, C.V.O, D.S.O,E.D.; the Mayor of Suva, Mr L.G. Usher C.B.E.; the Commander Royal Fijian Military Forces, Colonel P.F. Manueli O.B.E.; and the Commander Fijian Naval Squadron, Commander S. Brown M.B.E., V.R.D.
- 4. That evening at 1830 (-12), my officers and I hosted an official reception for 40 guests onboard.
- During the forenoon of Wednesday 3rd November, 53 personnel from the crews of the three Fijian minesweepers were shown around in preparation for a day at sea the next day.
- 6. On Thursday 4th November, DUCHESS proceeded to sea at 0900 (-12) with 53 Fijian Naval Squadron Personnel embarked for a sea familiarisation day. A number of 00W/Engineering drills, Gunnery drills and Damage Control drills were performed to demonstrate RAN procedures. The ship berthed alongside her previous berth at 1620 (-12).
- 7. At 0900 (-12) on Saturday 6th November, DUCHESS cast off and proceeded for two days coastal navigation training to the South and East of Viti Levu.
- 8. The ship berthed at the northern end or King's Wharf at 0900 (-12) Monday 8th November to fuel. On completion at 1330 (-12), DUCHESS sailed for Cairns in company with HMFS KIKAU and KIRO.
- 9. After clearing Suva a series of exercises were carried out with the Fijian Naval Squadron and these are listed in Annex B.
- 10. The next day at 1200 HMF Ship's KIKAU and KIRO were detached to return to Fijian waters and DUCHESS continued her passage for Cairns. The time in company proved to be of mutual benefit to all participants, especially as DUCHESS operates in company so rarely.
- 11. Whilst on passage during the afternoon of Saturday 13th November, an inter-mess pistol and rifle shooting competition was enthusiastically supported by ship's company.

- 12. After an uneventful passage through the Grafton Passage, DUCHESS berthed at No. 8 Wharf at Cairns at 0910 (-10) on Sunday 14th November and commenced fuelling.
- 13. Later the ship sailed at 1400 (-10) to commence pilotage training in the Inner Barrier Reef areas.
- 14. On Thursday 18th November at 0945 (-10) DUCHESS berthed alongside No 8 Wharf Carins and commenced fuelling. After completing fuelling, at 1100 (-10), the ship shifted to No 2 Wharf.
- I had the pleasure of entertaining for lunch the Mayor of Cairns, Alderman D. De Jarlais; the Harbourmaster, Captain P. Ballantyne; the Chairman Cairns Harbour Board, Mr M. Borzi and the Commanding Officer, HMAS CAIRNS, Commander M.J.S. Keay.
- 16. Friday 19th November at 1830 (-10), an official cocktail party for 54 guests was held onboard.
- 17. From 1400 (-10) until 1700 on Sunday 21st November, the ship was open for public inspection, however support was a little disappointing as only 323 visitors toured the ship.
- 18. At 0930 (-10), on Monday 22nd November, DUCHESS proceeded to sea to commence the second phase of pilotage training. This was based around the Whitsunday Island area and during the period the weather conditions were most favourable.
- 19. After five days of training the ship berthed at the Breast Wharf in Mackay at 1000 (-10) on Saturday 27th November to fuel. Later at 1130 (-10), berth was shifted to the North Pier.
- 20. DUCHESS returned to the Whitsunday Passage Area on Sunday 28th November, to carry out phase three of the pilotage training programme until the end of the month.

Engineering

- During the passage from Sydney to Suva and from Suva to Cairns, several steady steaming trials were conducted. Results to date show consumption figures below those currently being used for programming purposes. When a wider range of speeds have been assessed a report will be forwarded.
- 22. All machinery has been operating satisfactorily and no significant problems have been encountered.

Electrical

- The month of November has been a paradox in that a number of significant defects have occured yet downtime of equipments has been relatively low.
 The defects which occured are listed in Annex E.
- Although makeshift repairs have been the rule rather than the exception, a high degree of reliability has been maintained.

WEE DEPARTMENT DEFECTS - NOVEMBER

- 1. Defects on the following equipments were encountered:
 - a. 'A' gyro 220V motor generator which was replaced with spares available on board.
 - b. J2 Turbo generator wiring repaired by temporary cable run and Indef 2/77 raised for FMU to permanently wire during forthcoming AMP.
 - c. ANURT 23V Transmitter was down from 10th to 22nd November with obscure defect. URDEF 4/77 and INDEF 5/77 refer. A TM179 is being raised on this equipment defect.
 - d. One 975JUC display suffered a sheared gear in the Ship's Head Marker drive. With no spares held, the gear was built up and re-cut satisfactorily.
 - e. The starter for magazinehoists V.S.G. pump became U/S with a loose wire which was successfully repaired.
 - f. M4 Turbo generator was shut down in an emergency when water from a leaking pipe entered the local Control Panel. Drying out operations took 6 hours and no damage occurred to the machine.
 - g. 975 motor generator was partially unserviceable losing the 110V DC supply to theaerial motor. A temporary 110V DC run was made pending supply of a serviceable generator URDEF 5/77 refers.
 - h. A supply fan for the Operations Room burnt out, INDEF 6/77, and was repaired by replacement with a less important bathroom supply fan.
 - i. FH4 HF/DF aerial has once again lost a structural strut. Repair will either be effected by utilising a willing fire brigade in Townsville similar to the Wellington evolution of last March or during AMP
 - j. The cafeteria dishwasher motor burnt out after an ingress of water. Repair was effected by using the rinse motor as a wash motor and achieving rinse by a hand held hose.
 - k. J2 Turbo generator failed when upper deck hosing down operations allowed water to be drawn into A Boiler fan intake. The machine was placed successfully on load after a suitable drying out period.
 - 1. The final defect of the month occurred in the Ice '0' Tube machine which failed when the compressor motor overheated. A replacement motor was fitted from onboard spares.



Sir,

1. I have the honour to report the proceedings of Her Majesty's Australian Ship DUCHESS under my command, for the month of December 1976.

HMAS DUCHESS - REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS - DECEMBER 1976

- 2. During December DUCHESS completed the fourth training cruise for 1976 off the Queensland coast. The ship then returned to Sydney and carried out an assisted maintenance and leave period.
- For the first days of the month the ship carried out Midshipmen's pilotage training in the Whitsunday passage area. On Friday, 3rd DUCHESS entered Townsville harbour for a weekend visit, and secured at No 6 wharf at 0915(-10). I had the pleasure of entertaining for lunch, the Commander 3rd Task Force, Brigadier A.W.F. Rofe; the Commander 11th Task Force, Colonel I. Maclean; Officer Commanding RAAF Townsville, Group Captain M. Lyons; the Chairman Townsville Harbour Board, Mr A.G. Field and the Townsville Naval Agent, Mr K.J. McCaffay. That evening at 1830 (-10) my officers and I hosted an official reception for 50 guests onboard. On the afternoon of Sunday 5th the ship was open to the public and 463 visitors were received onboard.
- 4. At 0900(-10) on Monday 6th, DUCHESS proceeded from Townsville for the return to Sydney. A smooth uneventful passage was experienced and on Thursday 9th, the ship arrived in the East Australian Exercise areas and conducted the Gunnery serials listed at Annex B.
- On Friday 10th, the ship anchored in Watson's Bay at 0550(-11) to carry out Customs clearance. DUCHESS weighed anchor and berthed at the NE Cruiser Wharf, Garden Island at 1010(-11). After final customs clearance the ship began an assisted maintenance and Christmas leave period and the 32 Supplementary List Midshipmen of Cruise 4 departed the ship. The ship remained alongside Garden Island for the rest of the month.

Electrical

- During the period, major problems were experienced with the 23V HF transmitter. Although a new transmitter section was fitted by ship's staff, the defect persisted and thereby limited the ship's HF Communication's capability until the ship's return to Sydney.
- 7. On completion of Midshipmen's pilotage training in the Whitsunday Passage area, Alpha gyro toppled when the motor generator supplying voltage to the gyro rotor failed. A new motor generator was fitted by ship's staff from spares held onboard.

8. An intensive tuning programme of the MRS3 system and 4.5 mountings was progressed during the month and culminated in an AA firing at a balloon target on Thursday 9th December. The results were very encouraging with 'B' mounting achieving two TTB's from ten rounds fired.

Engineering

- 9. A fair amount of maintenance has been undertaken during the month. On arrival in Sydney, both boilers were externally water-washed and uptakes inspected for wear and tear.
- 10. Selected valves in the feed system have been taken in hand by FMP and all feed tanks have been inspected.
- 11. Both main engines have had a lube oil change during which a hole was discovered in the top of B Engine drain tank. This was rectified by Dockyard as URDEF 7/77.

General

The welfare committee did not meet this month. The health, welfare and conduct of the Ship's Company is very satisfactory and morale is high with the Christmas leave period. The material state of the ship is good and the conditions onboard are satisfactory.
