May, 1st. to 4th On passage to BOWEN via Inner Route, anchoring each night from midnight to 0400. Two officers only on complement. Average speed, 6°65 knots. Coaled at BOWEN. Sailed at 1200k for May 5th BRISBANE. Arrived Moreton Bay. Average speed 7.1 kts. May, 9th. At 1543 went aground by Clara Rock Buoy in BRISBANE RIVER, At 1730, high water, with assistance of H.M. Tug 232, came clear of bank. (Report of Grounding submitted to N.O.I.C. BRISBANE). At 1945 berthed alongside Beryl 11 at Lighthouse Jetty. Shifted berth to Milling Wharf for re-May, 10th fitting. De-ammunitioned ship. May.llth Refitting berth cancelled. Shifted to C.S.R. Wharf, four miles down stream, May, 12th Main Party of Ship's Company proceeded on Home Leave. May, 14th. to 31st Taken in hand for refit and docking. Contractors :- A. Sargent & Co. Peter's Slip. Metal Products.

GENERAL REMARKS :- Conduct and Health of Ship's Company very satisfactory.



JULY, 1944 to 30th. APRIL, 1945. All reports prior to July, 1944 have been submitted to Naval Officer in Charge, PORT MELBOURNE, and no copies kept as per has instructions. The following, in brief outline, are proceedings of H.M.A.S. "DURRAWEEN", as from 1st. July, 1944, :-July, 1st. to 4th Oropesa Sweeping off Port Phillip Heads. July, 5th. toloth Oropesa Sweeping and Patrol in Wilson Prom. Area. During this period full calibre firing and dropping of depth charge exercised. Oil Lighter adrift from S.S. "RAMOW salvaged in heavy weather. July, 11th. to 12th..... Coaling and Storing at Williamstown. July, 13th. to 14th Towing targets for H.M.A.S. "QUIBERON" in Port Phillip Bay. July, 15th. to 17th Oropesa Sweeping off Port Phillip Heads. July, 18th. to Aug. 28th.. Ship undergoing Annual Refit, presumably for service in Northern Waters. Ship's Company granted 21 days leave. Aug. 30th Completed trials, sailed for Sydney under operational control of N.O.I.C. SYDNEY. Sept.2nd...... Arrived SYDNEY, average speed 8.4 knots.
Berthed on S.S. YUNNAN" at Poole & Steel's Yard at Belmain. Received overdue mailed instructions to join C.T.U. 70.5.2 under Lt.Cdr.R. Tripp, R.N. in H.M.A.T. "GOOLGWAI". Third trawler of Group H.M.A.T. "SAMUEL BENBOW". E.R.A. 111, D.HENDERSON, R.A.N.R., E.R.A. in charge Sept.3rd...... of Engine Room, sustained fatal injuries from accidental fall from City building. Sept.4th. to 19th..... Ship taken over by Messrs. Polle & Steel for fitting out as surveying sweeper. Echo Sounding Forced Air Ventilation, Refrigerators, etc.fitted, On Sept. 6th, funeral of late ER. A. Henderson attended by C.O. and Ship's Co, with Guard from Balmoral Depot. Ship docked twice at Chapman's Dock for fitting of E/S Gear and for withdrawal of Propellor Shaft. Boilers cleaned and given thorough inspection continuous trouble having been experienced with tubes. Report, No. 13040 of 20th. Sept was submitted to A.C.N.B. by N.O.I.C. SYDNEY. Sept. 19th. to 22nd.... Harbour Trials of E/S Gear. Embarking of Bottom Sweeping Gear at Pyrmont. Storing at Garden Isl. Deperming at Kyrraba Oil Wharf. Coaling at Woollcommolloc. Sept. 23rd...... Sub. Lieut. Jonas, R. A. N. R. of H. M. A.S. "CHALLENGER" joined for watchkeeping duties on trip north. Adjusted compasses and at 1610k sailed for TOWNSVILLE. Sept 29th Arrived TOWNSVILLE, average speed 8 knots. Coaled and watered. Sailed for Thursday Island, base for surveying Oct. 2nd

operations in Torres Straits.

At 0445k, Oct. 6th., whem off Adolphus Islands

received signalled instructions to proceed to

off Bird Island. Weather bad, speed reduced to

4 and 5 knots. At 1400k sighted "KAZEMBE" under

Anchored at 2230 in lee of Cape York, Arrived THURSDAY ISLAND. Oct. 7th Coaled from Naval Lighter "Mombah" in Normanby Oct. 8th. to 9th Sound. Watered at Horn Island, water supply at Thursday Island depleted. Bottom Sweeping and sounding with trawlers Oct. 19th. to 17th "GOOLGWAI" and "SAMUEL BENBOW" in PRINCE OF WALES CHANNEL. Landed 2 Seamen for Tide Pole Party at Horn Island. Watered at Muttee Head as supply at Horn Island Oct. 18th depleted. H.M.S."CHALLENGER" arrived in area and assumed Oct. 22nd operational control of survey as C.T.U.70.5.2. Oct. 18th to Dec. 7th ... Bottom Sweeping in Prince of Wales Channel. Coaling from dump at Thursday Island & watering at Muttee Head and Horne Island. On 7th. November, Lt. Cdr. Tripp joined "DURraween". SubLt. Jonas to "Samuel Benbow". During this period sweep wire was twice fouled around screw. On first occasion ship was towed by "SAMUEL BENBOW" to Naval Jetty, Thursday Isl, and wire cleared by Port Diver. On second occasion members of Ship's Company cleared the ten turns, using improvised diving gear consisting of Smoke Mask and Sigmund Pump. Sailed for CAIRNS for Boiler Clean. Dec. 8th..... Dec. 12th. Arrived CAIRNS. Dec. 13th. to 19th Boiler Cleaning, Each Watch allowed 48 hours Recreational Leave. The welcome at this port was very much appreciated by Officers and Men. No defects could be taken in hand by shore staff. Sailed for Thursday Island, Landed mail at Stanley Dec. 20th Island for R.A.A.F. en route. ARrived THURSDAY ISLAND. Dec. 24th Dec. 25th. to Jan 24th.. Drag sweeping im Prince of Wales Channel, using 1,000 ft wire with depth setting wires every 100 ft. On Jan. 4th. Lieut. N.C. Glenn, R.N. took over from Lieut. Comdr. Tripp. Jan. 25th, to Feb. 10th ... Drag Sweeping in Vigilant Channel. One rating to Sue Island for Tide Pole Party. Feb. 11th. to 20th Boiler Cleaning at THURSDAY ISL. Fresh water available at Naval Jetty as from 18th. Feb. Minor Defects made good by Base Staff and Ship's Staff. Feb. 21st. to Apr. 26th. Drag and Bottom Sweeping in Vigilant Channel Area. Bottom Sweeping off Larpent Bank. April 29th Sailed to Brisbane for Refit and Leave. GENERAL REMARKS :- Conduct and Health of Ship's Company under trying conditions in a trawler in the tropics have been surprisingly good.

Fresh food available at Thursday Island very

limited.

Coaling arrangemnts not very satisfactory, only one truck being available to the Navy.

A considerable amount of trouble has been experienced with E.R. Machinery & Boilers, due to a large extent to the drafting of junioux and inexperienced E.R.A.s as senior E.R.A.s in/the ship.
