





MONTHLY REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR OCTOBER, 1945.

Subwitted:

2.10.45 Engine checkover and repairs completed.

2.10.45 At 10.25 left Cruiser Wharf, G.1. and secured to Gil Wharf, Kurraba Pt. for fuel oil.

12.48 Slipped and proceeded to sea towards Nelbourne.

Moderate weather was experience to Gabo Island, when fresh head winds were encountered.

7.10.45 Hounded Wilson Promontory and shaped course for Port Lorsdale. 23.50 Passed through the Rip and proceeded.

8.10.45 COOl via South Channel towards Williamstown.

0557 Secured to Wilson Pier, Williamstown, having averaged

5.7 knots from Sydney.

Atomizers gave out and had to be changed with Rodondo Island

near to leeward, but was effected in time to avert disaster.

At Williamstown, repairs were made, and engines checked over by

Shin's E.R.A.'s.

12.10.45 0600 Slipped from Nalson Pier, and proceeded towards Port Adelaide, via West Channel.

Awaited slack water at the Rip. as a considerable sea was running, and passed out about 1200 Fresh to strong winds, with rough sea, were met to Cape Nelson, when the weather moderated for a few hours.

14.10.45 2040 Cape Martin Light abeam 5 miles off, weather becoming dirty.

wind blowing hard from the west.

At 21.50 course was altered to M.85°W to get off a lee shore.

Vessel rolling and pitching violently and shipping water fore and aft.

15.10.45 At 2200 wind backed to SWES vessel left away to her course, speed increasing to about five knots.

16.10.45 0800 passed through the Backstairs Passage. 1600 Rounded Fairway Buoy off Fort Adelaide, and proceeded up the Port River, securing to the Maval Wharf, Birkenhead at 17.50.

The average speed from Williamstown was 3 knots.

17.10.45 Vessel commenced de-storing.

21.10.45 Grew was discharged to H.M.A.S. "TORRENS", four ratings being detailed as ship keepers, a considerable amount of stores still remaining on board.

The vessel has been continuously in service since commissioning on the 4th October, 1940, and has sustained no damage, having been entirely free from accident.





MONTHLY REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR SEPTEMBER. 1945.

Submitted:

31.8.45 Lt. Cdr. C.V. Wood, R.A.N.R(S), resumed command of "FALIE". Vessel berthed alongside s.s. "TANCRED" at Cairns awaiting return of s.s. "CALEDONIAN EALVOR" from salvage operations.

7.9.45 Loading Naval Stores consigned to Sydney. 8.9.45 1400 - Slipped and proceeded outside the port to await "CALEDONIAN SALVOR" with "TANCRED" in tow. 1640 - Secured to "TANCRED", rigging towing gear.
1700 - Proceeded in tow of "CALEDONIAN SALVOR", astern

of "TANCRED".

Since vessel left Morotai, the Standard Compass had been most erratic, so as opportunity occurred en route, corrections were made reducing the Deviation to a minimum.

15.9.45 Entered Sydney Harbour at 0600, and at 0630 slipped from "TANCRED" and proceeded to berth at Garden Island. 0710 - Secured to Oil Lighter at Kuttabul Dolphins.

> Whilst at Garden Island, all Armament Stores, and stores not required further were landed.

Ship's equipment, which had been landed when vessel was first commissioned, viz., mainmast, booms and gaffs, were placed on board, to be refitted at Port Adelaide. Maintenance work, and engine check over were carried out in readiness for voyage to Port Adelaide.

Vessel is in fair order and condition, only necessary maintenance work being done, observing early return to owners.

Morale and health of crew is good.

Attached is a copy of report by the Acting C.E.R.A. in charge of the engines.

COMMANDING OFFICER.

Main engines for this period only in use for short intervals for manouvouring alongside wharf etc., as ship was in tow to Sydney. Conditions of main engines practically as in last report re:- main bearings, cracked exhaust liner ports, crankcase sealing rings etc. All atomizers sent ashore for overhaul at Garden Island.

No. 1 Cylinder head removed also gudgeon and bushes.
Oil grooves and holes also piston rings gummed up with carbon and badly worn. Cleaned carbon deposits fitted new rings and reassembled.
Cylinder head found to be cracked in four places.

Ship's navigation lighting system in bad condition, temporary leads, etc., put in by dockyard at Gatden Island.

Auxilary machinery running fairly satisfactorily although emergency lighting set inadequate to carry ships lighting and ventilation when main generating set is out of commission.

Auxilary air compressor needs overhaul.



31.7.45. 0400K. Slipped from No. 2 berth Madang bound# for Finschafen, to contact R.T. "Tancred" for tow to mainland. Ultimate destination Sydney.

1.8.45. Ship making stern way due to bad weather, strong sets and occasional engine failures. Let go anchor West of Reiss Point at 1820K for shelter and minor engine repairs.

2.8.45. 0600K. Hove up and proceeded.

4.8.45. 1055K. Anchored Sio Mission (South Vitiaz Sts.) for shelter.
1455K. R.T. "Tancred" entered bay to take "Falie" in tow.
1825K. "Tancred" proceeded with "Falie" in tow.

5.8.45. 0645K. Entered Langemak Bay.

0755K. "Tancred" berthed between No.7 and No.8 Docks with "Falie" secured alongside. Fuelling, watering, provisioning and completing engine repairs.

6.8.45. 0845K. R.A.A.F. mails discharged. Ship still waiting for completion of engine repairs.

7.8.45. 0600K. "Tancred" slipped with "Falie in tow.

8.8.45. 0418K. Ham Reef light abeam to Stbd.

0430K. "Tancred's" engine room observed to be on fire and all lights had failed. Crew seen to be abandoning ship

O525K. Tow cast off. Proceeded clear of "Tancred" to her life boat.

"Falie's" motor skiff sent to investigate various rafts, life belts floating near burning tug. Embarked crew and took life-boat in tow. Second Engineer badly burned, despatched signal giving details and requesting medical assistance for Enjured man.

Steamed aroung at a safe distance waiting for fire to burn out.

O915K. Captain, Chief Officer and Chief Engineer reboarded in "Falie's"

Motor Skiff to investigate possibility of extinguishing fire and re-boarding.

1030K. Having extinguished fire Captain of "Tancred" granted permission for "Falie" to berth alongside and return crew.

1100K. "Tancred" observed to be drifting onto reefs. Prepared to take in tow.

1120K. Slipped, hoisted boat, and took "Tancred" in tow to anchorage South of Tufi Leads (off Kitaba Point.)

8.8.45. 1505K. Both ships anchored in 11 fthms. Catalina from Madang (with Doctor)
landed and soon proceeded with patient.

1935K. A.S.R. 02-9 R.A.A.F. (from Oro Bay) arrived with Doctor.

2030R. H.M.A.S."Maryborough" (ex Milne Bay) anchored.

9.8.45. 0800K. "Cambrian Salvor" (ex Langemak) arrived.

0900K. Hove up and proceeded under own power for Milne Bay. H.M.A.S. "Maryborough"escorting in case of engine failure.

10.8.45. 0800K. Passed through Raven Chan.

1315K. Let go anchor in Gili Gili Anchorage to await tow to mainland.

11,12,13,14,15, and 16 August - - Awaiting tow in Milne Bay .

18.8.45. Proceeded to Kwato Mission for recreational and fresh fruit trip.

17.8.45. Proceeded to Samarai.

18.8.45. Returned to Milne Bay and watered ship at Ahioma. Berthed alongside "Tancred" to deliver water, then returned to anchorage.

19, 20, 21, 22, and 23 August. Awaiting tow in Milne Bay. 24.8.45. Watered at Ahioma and returned to anchorage.

25 and 26 August. Waitng for tug.

27.8.45. Berthed alongside "Tancred" to secure tow.

28.8.45. Proceeded in tow of "Caledonian Salvor" (in tandem with "Tancred").

30.8.45. Slipped tow and anchored off Fairway Buoy Cairns.

31.8.45. Entered harbour and berthed alongside "Tancred" at Kuranda Jetty.

Liet. Cdr. C.V.Wood R.A.N.R.(S). xxxxxxxxx joined a.m. and resumed

General:-. As ship is bound for Sydney for refit, morale of ship's Company has risen considerably. Supplies of fresh provisions proved adequate.

Despite the expected tendency of the Ship's Company to relax after the announcement of the cessation of hostilities hands have continued to work well. During the morning of 8th August, it was pleasing to observe the behaviour of the Ship's Company, which left nothing to be designed.



- 2. Difficulty has been experienced in raising the Madang W/T Station on New Guinea Intercept. After considerable delay it was necessary to pass message T.O.O. 240045, concerning barge, to VHM Darwin and message T.O.O. 260020 amending E.T.A. Madang, to VIM Thursday Island.
- Victuals generally are good and the supply of fresh food at ports between Madang and Morotai all that could be expected.
- Discipline is good, the hands working well. Many of the ship's company are now due for disposal.
- Air mails have considerably improved but the receipt of surface mail including papers is much delayed.

Ineutenant R.A.N.V.R.

REPORT ON ENGINE EFFICIENCY AND CONDITION FOR MONTH OF JULY 1945.

Main Engines. Engine efficiency fair but gradually deteriorating. All pistonsrings need renewing and liners checked for wear. As in previous reports loss of lubricating oil presumably through main bearings and crankcase sealing rings. No.244 liners cracked at exhaust port. Excessive noise in main timing gears requires investigation. Extra fuel oil filter needed as considerable trouble is being found with injectors owing to insufficient filtering.

Auxiliaries.

Steering gear requires complete overhaul, worn napier screw nuts, bushes and pintles in lower section of rudder.

- 2. Winch engine requires overhaul, main driving gear teeth crystallized and continually breaking.
- Main generator set 9KW running satisfactorily although generator needs inspection and cleaning.
- Emergency lighting set lakw insufficient to carry normal load of ship i.e. ventilation, lighting and refrigeration. Also loss of voltage after period of running.



During the period lat June to 15th June this ship remained at Wewak under the local operational orders of the Port Director.

24-6-45 0940 Arrived Wewak.

Army personnel and stores disembarked.

1600 Weighed and departed for Altape.

25-6-45 0700 Arrived Aitape Cove.

Naval Officer born for passage, Army personnel and stores disembarked.

1700K Weighed and departed for Hollandia.

26-6-45 0900I Arrived Hollandia and berthed at Navy Wharf for water.

1130 Secured N.S.D. wharf.

1330 Shifted to small ships anchorage and commenced engine adjustment.

28-6-45 0600 Weighed and departed for Mios Woendi.

30-6-45 0900 Arrived Mios Woendi.
0930 Anchored as directed and commenced engine adjustment.





M.A.S. "FALTE" - Report on Engine Efficiency & Condition for May, 1945 To Commanding Officer. From A/C.E.R.A.

Engine efficiency: Fair.

Main engines running fairly satisfactorily, condition of various parts as previously stated:

1. Excessive loss of lubricating oil through main bearings.

2. Cracked exhaust port No. 3 cylinder.

3. Fuel pump cams and rellers starting to wear which will soon necessitate replacing with the remaining spares. Set of cams and rollers on order from Garden Island.

4. Exhaust manifold water jackets corroding up badly.

- 5. Injectors need constant overhauling and adjusting. 6. Rudder pintles (bottom) worn approximately 3" in bushes.
- 7. Insufficient ventilation in engine room. When working down there at times the heat is almost unbearable. An exhaust fan or blower is urgently needed. The one fan in the engine room at present being a 110V household fan which is inadequate.
- 8. No. 2 and No. 3 Main engine gudgeons showing signs of wear.

Generators running satisfactorily.



- 1. Engine Efficiency Fair.
- 2. Wain Engines are running fairly satisfactorily. As in my previous reports, loss of oil through main bearings is excessive, also exhaust port web No. 3 Cylinder liner is cracked. Atomizers are starting to give trouble and constant maintenance is necessary.
 - No. 2 Main Engine fuel pump cam and rollers are wearing. There is one spare cam remaining and two sets of rollers and pins.
 - Excessive wear is taking place in rudder pintles, the bottom ones having about 3" wear when in dock last, as stated imprevious reports.
 - Lack of sufficient ventilation in the engine room is seferely felt, there being only one 110V household fan which is definitely inadequate, especially when working below or when hatches have to be closed.
 - Diesel generators are running quite well, although certain parts are wearing excessively and spares ordered from Naval Stores Officer, Garden Island, are not to hand yet.



EFFICIENCY OF MAIN ENGINES - FAIR:

Main Engines are running fairly satisfactorily although excessive wear is taking place with fuel cams and rollers, resulting in new cam having to be fitted to No. 4 pump, and new roller pin and needle rollers fitted to No. 3 fuel pump. This is the third cam to go in the last 12 months leaving only one spare remaining on board, and two complete sets of rollers and pins.

The exhaust port web in Bo. 3 cylinder liner is cracked, and there is loss of lubricating oil through main bearings as stated in previous report.


There is excessive wear in rudder pintles, especially in the bottom ones, as nothing was done in this matter by H.M.A.S. "LADAVA" base staff whilst in dock last August; E.R.A. Smith being Acting C.E.R.A. at that time.

Diesel Generators are running fairly well, but need constant adjustment and attention, owing to lack of spare parts which have been ordered from Garden Island.

When skylights have to be shut for blackout or rain the only fan available for use is a small household fan. Consequently to work on the main engines or generators is almost unbearable at times.
