



rrom Commanding Officer, H.M.A.S. SEAMIST. 5th February 1945. The Secretary, NAVAL BOARD. (Through N.O. I. C. Darwin. Copy to Secretary, Naval Board Submitted ;-

Lst January at A.S.R. Station, Melville Bay and at 0300 IK on the 4t January sailed for Darwin via the inshore route. On the 8th January at 1030 IK in approximate position Lat. 10 55 S, Long. 132 12 E., struck a submerged object. On checking bilges could discover no apparent damage. At the time, gale conditions existed and visibility limited to 50 ft. At 1355 IK received storm warning from Darwin.

At 1620 IK steamed into Port Essington and anchored in Berkely Bay where further inspection of ship was carried out but could discover no damage. At 0600 IK 9th Jan. steamed from Port Essington to Popham Bay and anchored overnight. 0600IK 10th Jan. cleared Popham Bay and on rounding Cape Don, corvette No. 361 passed on our starboard hand steaming towards Darwin. At 1830IK anchored in lee of Cape Hotham in 8 fathoms. 0600 IK 11th Jan. steamed to Darwin and when one mile S.E. of East Vernon Island the port motor stopped. Found oil leak and broken valve spring. Anchored off East Vernon Island and carried out repairs completing same and sailing for Darwin at 0710 IK, 12th Jan. Arrived at Darwin and closed C.T. Jetty to report at 1410 IK. At 1615 IK cleared C.T.Jetty and made fast to No.6 buoy.

Remained at buoy until 18th Jan., then at 0820 IK went on to 2. the Fairmile slipway. On slipping found the copper sheathing to be in a very bad condition and crumbling away in numerous places. All faulty parts were replaced and new Monel metal key fitted to Port propeller and nut locked with monel metal screws

3. Friday, 19th Jan., ship's company reported to P.M.O. for medical examination re change over from R.A.N.V.R. (N.A.P.) to R.A.N.V.R. All passed medically fit.

21st Jan. at 1050 IK off slips and returned to bouy. 31st Jan. at 1600 IK slipped mooring and proceeded on Boom Patrol. Relieved M.L. 1324 at 1700 IK and carried on patrol outside boom.

General health and conduct of ship's company satisfactory. 5. 6. All copper sheathing requires removal and slight repairs required to keel otherwise the condition of the ship's hull is satisfactory.


